HOUSE BILL NO. 923

- AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 3-3-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DESIGNATE THE SONG "QUEEN OF THE SOUTH" AS AN OFFICIAL STATE SONG IN ADDITION TO THE PRESENT OFFICIAL STATE SONG "GO,
- 4 MISSISSIPPI"; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that many states of the
- 6 United States have two (2) or more official state songs,
- 7 including: Tennessee, which has six (6) official state songs;
- 8 West Virginia, which has three (3) official state songs; and
- 9 Arkansas, Florida, Louisiana and South Carolina, which each have
- 10 two (2) official state songs; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Mississippi presently has an official state song,
- 12 "Go, Mississippi", written by Houston Davis, which was adopted by
- 13 the Legislature in House Concurrent Resolution No. 67, 1962
- 14 Regular Session; and
- WHEREAS, while "Go, Mississippi" is used sometimes for
- 16 special occasions and specific events, the lyrics and melody of
- 17 the song do not lend themselves easily for Mississippians to sing
- 18 at informal gatherings and by Mississippians individually as they
- 19 go about their daily lives; and

20	WHEREAS, the Legislature desires to provide Mississippians
21	with two (2) official state songs so that Mississippians will have
22	official state songs appropriate for all occasions, events and
23	daily activities; and
24	WHEREAS, the Legislature further desires to recognize as a
25	second official song of the State of Mississippi, the words and
26	music of "Queen of the South", written by Rich Cox, which are:
27	Verse I
28	It's the first night of summer deep in the heart of
29	Mississippi,
30	And the fireflies are burning holes in the dark, ain't they
31	pretty,
32	A mockingbird's whistling another bird's tune,
33	While the smell of magnolias hangs heavy in June;
34	And the sun, like a crown, has set on the Queen of the South.

36	Families have gathered to laugh, talk and sing on this humid

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 63 **SECTION 1.** The following shall be codified as Section
- 64 3-3-63, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 65 3-3-63. The lyrics and music to the song "Queen of the
- 66 South", written by Rich Cox, are hereby designated as the second
- 67 official song of the State of Mississippi.
- 68 **SECTION 2.** The Division of Tourism of the Mississippi
- 69 Development Authority and all other agencies of the state

- 70 interested in promoting the welfare of the State of Mississippi
- 71 are encouraged to make use of the state song "Queen of the South"
- 72 in promoting and advancing the State of Mississippi and its
- 73 citizens. The State of Mississippi and state agencies are granted
- 74 copyright permission by the song's author to use this song in
- 75 pursuing and accomplishing these endeavors.
- 76 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 77 and after July 1, 2019.
