HOUSE BILL NO. 1050

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-16-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO REINSTATE THE SPECIAL MISSISSIPPI OCCUPATIONAL DIPLOMA FOR 3 STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES, WHICH SHALL BE AWARDED TO ELIGIBLE STUDENTS HAVING MET THE PRESCRIBED REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION 5 BEGINNING IN THE 2019-2020 ACADEMIC YEAR; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 6 37-16-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, FOR THE PURPOSE OF POSSIBLE 7 AMENDMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-16-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:
- 11 37-16-11. (1) A student who has been properly classified,
- 12 in accordance with rules established by the State Board of
- 13 Education as an "educable person with an intellectual disability,"
- 14 "trainable person with an intellectual disability," "deaf,"
- 15 "specific learning disabled," "physically handicapped whose
- 16 ability to communicate orally or in writing is seriously impaired"
- 17 or "emotionally handicapped" shall not be required to meet all
- 18 requirements of Section 37-16-7, and shall, upon meeting all
- 19 applicable requirements prescribed by the district school board,
- 20 be awarded a special diploma in a form prescribed by the state

- 21 board; however, such special graduation requirements prescribed by
- 22 the district school board shall include minimum graduation
- 23 requirements as prescribed by the state board. Any such student
- 24 who meets all special requirements of the district school board
- 25 for his exceptionality, but is unable to meet the appropriate
- 26 special state minimum requirements, shall be awarded a special
- 27 certificate of completion in a form prescribed by the state board.
- 28 Nothing provided in this section, however, shall be construed to
- 29 limit or restrict the right of an exceptional student solely to a
- 30 special diploma. Any such student shall, upon proper request, be
- 31 afforded the opportunity to fully meet all requirements of Section
- 32 37-16-7 through the standard procedures established therein and
- 33 thereby qualify for a standard diploma upon graduation.
- 34 (2) The State Board of Education shall develop and issue
- 35 criteria for a Mississippi Occupational Diploma for students
- 36 having a disability as defined by the federal Individuals with
- 37 Disabilities Education Act. Beginning with the 2002-2003 school
- 38 year, any such student, upon proper request, shall be afforded the
- 39 opportunity to fully meet such requirements and qualify for an
- 40 occupational diploma upon graduation.
- 41 (3) The special Mississippi Occupational Diploma for
- 42 students with disabilities shall * * * be reinstated and be made
- 43 available to any student * * * having met all other graduation
- 44 requirements beginning in the 2019-2020 academic year and each
- 45 year thereafter.

- SECTION 2. Section 37-16-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 47 brought forward as follows:
- 48 37-16-7. (1) Each district school board shall establish
- 49 standards for graduation from its schools which shall include as a
- 50 minimum:
- 51 (a) Mastery of minimum academic skills as measured by
- 52 assessments developed and administered by the State Board of
- 53 Education.
- (b) Completion of a minimum number of academic credits,
- and all other applicable requirements prescribed by the district
- 56 school board.
- 57 (c) By school, information on high school graduation
- 58 rates. High schools with graduation rates lower than eighty
- 59 percent (80%) must submit a detailed plan to the Mississippi
- 60 Department of Education to restructure the high school experience
- 61 to improve graduation rates.
- 62 (2) A student who meets all requirements prescribed in
- 63 subsection (1) of this section shall be awarded a standard diploma
- 64 in a form prescribed by the State Board of Education.
- 65 (3) The State Board of Education may establish student
- 66 proficiency standards for promotion to grade levels leading to
- 67 graduation.
- 68 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 69 and after July 1, 2019.
