HOUSE BILL NO. 1135

- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-1-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE THAT BEGINNING WITH THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR, THE STATE 3 BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT OBJECTIVES THAT FOCUS ON AMERICAN CIVICS FOR INCORPORATION INTO THE SOCIAL STUDIES 5 CURRICULUM STANDARDS OF EXISTING COURSES PROVIDED AT THE SECONDARY 6 EDUCATIONAL LEVEL; TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 7 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-1-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 37-1-3. (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules
- 12 and regulations and set standards and policies for the
- 13 organization, operation, management, planning, budgeting and
- 14 programs of the State Department of Education.
- 15 The board is directed to identify all functions of
- 16 the department that contribute to or comprise a part of the state
- 17 system of educational accountability and to establish and maintain
- 18 within the department the necessary organizational structure,
- policies and procedures for effectively coordinating such 19
- functions. Such policies and procedures shall clearly fix and 20

- 21 delineate responsibilities for various aspects of the system and
- 22 for overall coordination of the total system and its effective
- 23 management.
- 24 (b) The board shall establish and maintain a
- 25 system-wide plan of performance, policy and directions of public
- 26 education not otherwise provided for.
- 27 (c) The board shall effectively use the personnel and
- 28 resources of the department to enhance technical assistance to
- 29 school districts in instruction and management therein.
- 30 (d) The board shall establish and maintain a central
- 31 budget policy.
- 32 (e) The board shall establish and maintain within the
- 33 State Department of Education a central management capacity under
- 34 the direction of the State Superintendent of Public Education.
- 35 (f) The board, with recommendations from the
- 36 superintendent, shall design and maintain a five-year plan and
- 37 program for educational improvement that shall set forth
- 38 objectives for system performance and development and be the basis
- 39 for budget requests and legislative initiatives.
- 40 (2) (a) The State Board of Education shall adopt and
- 41 maintain a curriculum and a course of study to be used in the
- 42 public school districts that * * * are designed to prepare the
- 43 state's children and youth to be productive, informed, creative
- 44 citizens, workers and leaders, and it shall regulate all matters

45	arising in the practical administration of the school system not
46	otherwise provided for.
47	(b) * * * The State Board of Education shall develop
48	personal living and finances objectives that focus on money
49	management skills for individuals and families for appropriate,
50	existing courses at the secondary level. The objectives must
51	require the teaching of those skills necessary to handle personal
52	business and finances and must include instruction in the
53	following:
54	(i) Opening a bank account and assessing the
55	quality of a bank's services;
56	(ii) Balancing a checkbook;
57	(iii) Managing debt, including retail and credit
58	card debt;
59	(iv) Completing a loan application;
60	(v) The implications of an inheritance;
61	(vi) The basics of personal insurance policies;
62	(vii) Consumer rights and responsibilities;
63	(viii) Dealing with salesmen and merchants;
64	(ix) Computing state and federal income taxes;
65	(x) Local tax assessments;
66	(xi) Computing interest rates by various
67	mechanisms;
68	(xii) Understanding simple contracts; and

(xiii) Contesting an incorrect billing statement.

70	(c) Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the State
71	Board of Education shall develop and implement objectives that
72	focus on American Civics, specifically the fundamental concepts of
73	the United States as a constitutional republic and the rights and
74	responsibilities of citizenship for incorporation into the social
75	studies curriculum standards of existing courses provided at the
76	secondary educational level. The objectives shall reflect
77	knowledge necessary to successfully obtain a passing score on the
78	Civics of the Naturalization Test administered by the United
79	States Citizenship and Immigration Services (UCIS), as required by
80	8 USCS Section 1423, if such assessment was administered. The
81	board shall determine the method and manner in which to implement
82	the objectives as provided in paragraph (a) of this subsection, to
83	be formally indentified in codified state law and board policy as
84	American Civics, and directed under the authority of subsection
85	(1) of this section.
86	(3) The State Board of Education shall have authority to
87	expend any available federal funds, or any other funds expressly
88	designated, to pay training, educational expenses, salary
89	incentives and salary supplements to licensed teachers employed in
90	local school districts or schools administered by the State Board
91	of Education. Such incentive payments shall not be considered
92	part of a school district's local supplement as defined in Section
93	37-151-5(o), nor shall the incentives be considered part of the

local supplement paid to an individual teacher for the purposes of

- 95 Section 37-19-7(1). MAEP funds or any other state funds shall not
- 96 be used to provide such incentives unless specifically authorized
- 97 by law.
- 98 (4) The State Board of Education shall through its actions
- 99 seek to implement the policies set forth in Section 37-1-2.
- SECTION 2. Section 37-13-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 101 amended as follows:
- 102 37-13-5. (1) The flag of the State of Mississippi and the
- 103 flag of the United States shall be displayed in close proximity to
- 104 the school building at all times during the hours of daylight when
- 105 the school is in session when the weather will permit without
- 106 damage to the flag. It shall be the duty of the board of trustees
- 107 of the school district to provide for the flags and their display.
- 108 (2) Whenever the flag of the United States is to be flown at
- 109 half-staff by order or instructions of the President or pursuant
- 110 to federal law, all public schools shall lower the United States
- 111 flag in accordance with the executive order or instructions or
- 112 federal law. The school shall announce the reason that the flag
- is being flown at half-staff to all students in assembly or by
- 114 teachers in the various classrooms or by prominently displaying
- 115 written notice throughout the school stating the reason that the
- 116 flag has been lowered.
- 117 (3) In all public schools there shall be given a course of
- 118 study concerning the flag of the United States and the flag of the
- 119 State of Mississippi. The course of study shall include the

120	history of each flag and what they represent and the proper
121	respect therefor. There also shall be taught in the public
122	schools the duties and obligations of citizenship, patriotism,
123	Americanism and respect for and obedience to law, which shall be
124	components of the objectives for American Civics developed and
125	implemented by the State Board of Education for incorporation into
126	the social studies curriculum standards of existing courses
127	provided at the secondary educational level.
128	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
129	and after July 1, 2019.
