## HOUSE BILL NO. 1254

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE "MISSISSIPPI MANDATORY IDENTIFICATION
- 2 ACT"; TO PROVIDE THE AUTHORIZED FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION; TO
- 3 PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED
- 4 PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known and may be referred to as
- 7 the "Mississippi Mandatory Identification Act."
- 8 **SECTION 2.** (1) Any person who is twelve (12) years of age
- 9 or older shall be required to possess a form of photograph
- 10 identification, and shall have such identification in their
- 11 possession at all times. The following forms of photograph
- 12 identification shall be acceptable:
- 13 (a) Any form of photograph identification authorized
- 14 for voter identification under Section 23-15-563; or
- 15 (b) Any form of photograph identification from a
- 16 recognized educational institution.
- 17 (2) Any person who violates the provisions of subsection (1)
- 18 of this act, shall be penalized as follows:

- 19 (a) For a first offense, the person shall be fined up
- 20 to Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and if such person fails to pay such
- 21 fine within thirty (30) days after the court order, then, at the
- 22 discretion of the judge, such person shall be ordered to perform
- 23 up to ten (10) hours of community service;
- 24 (b) For a second offense, the person shall be fined not
- less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), but not more than One Hundred
- 26 Fifty Dollars (\$150.00), and if such person fails to pay such fine
- 27 within thirty (30) days after the court order, then, at the
- 28 discretion of the judge, such person shall be ordered to perform
- 29 up to twenty-five (25) hours of community service.
- 30 (c) For a third or subsequent offense, the person shall
- 31 be fined not less than One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00), but
- 32 not more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), and if such
- 33 person fails to pay such fine within thirty (30) days after the
- 34 court order, then, at the discretion of the judge, such person
- 35 shall be ordered to perform up to forty (40) hours of community
- 36 service.
- 37 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 38 and after July 1, 2019.
