HOUSE BILL NO. 1650 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE-DIVISION OF MEDICAID FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI MEDICAID LAW AND DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF THAT LAW FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2020.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 8 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General 9 Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Governor's 10 Office - Division of Medicaid for the purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law and defraying the 11 12 expenses of the administration of such law, as provided in Section 43-13-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year 13 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020..... 14 15\$ 868,013,306.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 16 17 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Medical Care Fund created by Section 18 19 43-13-143, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of providing

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20 medical assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law for the 21 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020..... 22 390,386,040.00.\$ 23 SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 24 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in 25 the State Treasury to the credit of the Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid which is comprised of special source 26 27 funds collected by or otherwise available to the Division, for the 28 purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi 29 Medicaid Law and defraying the expenses of the administration of such law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending 30 June 30, 2020.....\$ 5,069,062,534.00. 31 32 Prior period recovery of funds may be maintained and expended by the division when the recovery is received or finalized. Any 33 recoveries due to audits or third party recoveries may be used to 34 35 offset the cost of such audits and third party recoveries and as 36 such, the division may escalate Contractual Services as needed for 37 these purposes.

38 SECTION 4. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 39 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury 40 to the credit of the Health Care Expendable Fund, for the purpose 41 of defraying the expenses of the Governor's Office - Division of 42 Medicaid for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending 43 June 30, 2020.....\$ 63,230,003.00. 44 The above funds shall be allocated as follows:

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46 Medical Program Matching Funds.....\$ 54,230,003.00.
47 It is the intention of the Legislature that funds may be
48 shifted among the above allocated line items where needed at the
49 discretion of the Executive Director of Governor's Office 50 Division of Medicaid.

51 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 52 this act, the following positions are authorized:

58 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be 59 60 appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2021 do not 61 exceed Fiscal Year 2020 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 62 63 2020 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data 64 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel 65 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to 66 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 67 68 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2020 69

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70 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the 71 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at 72 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 73 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 74 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 75 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2020 "Personal Services" 76 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 77 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 78 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 79

Funds are provided herein for all full-time employees to receive up to a Three Percent (3%) pay increase to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan, excluding head of agencies, board members and commission members.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 84 85 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 86 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 87 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 88 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 89 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 90 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 91 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 92 appropriated level.

93 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 94 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are

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95 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 96 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

97 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in 98 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating 99 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 100 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

101 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 102 Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall maintain complete 103 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 104 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 105 106 Year 2019. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 107 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2021 shall be 108 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 109 110 provided during the Fiscal Year 2020 budget request process with 111 the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) being separated from the Medical Services Program and submitted as a separate 112 113 program. All Medicaid 1915 (C) Home and Community Based Services 114 Waivers shall be presented as a budget program separate from the 115 Medical Services Program. In addition, the performance measures 116 reported for the Medical Services Program shall include an 117 unduplicated case count of individuals served by eligibility 118 status, and the number and the costs of emergency room visits.

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SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 119 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 120 121 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 122 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 123 intended mission of this agency. 195 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that 196 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 197 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 198 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 199 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 200 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 201 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 202 made without competitive bids.

203 The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid SECTION 9. 204 shall provide statistical and financial reports on a monthly basis 205 to the Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee. These 206 reports shall include, but are not limited to, an accounting of 207 all funds spent in the medical program, the CHIP program, the 208 Dialysis Transportation program, and each of the Home and 209 Community Based Waiver programs, and an accounting of all funds 210 spent in the administrative program, participant statistics and 211 any other information requested by the Legislative Budget Office 212 and the PEER Committee.

The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall perform its cash flow projections on a predetermined monthly schedule and make this and any other information requested available, upon request, to the Chair of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the House Public Health and Human Services Committee,

A summary of this cash flow projection shall also 221 be presented in the report referenced in the above paragraph.

SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the Division of Medicaid shall pay the maximum rate allowed by federal law or regulation to providers of adult day services for each day of service provided to an eligible beneficiary. In order to receive this per diem rate of reimbursement, providers of adult day services shall participate in the Elderly and Disabled Waiver Program for Home and Community Based Services.

229 SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 230 of this act in an amount not to exceed, Two Million Seven Hundred 231 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,750,000.00) is provided for the purpose 232 of funding a temporary program to provide nonemergency 233 transportation to locations for necessary dialysis services for 234 end-stage renal disease patients who are sixty-five (65) years of 235 age or older or are disabled as determined under Section 236 1614(a)(3) of the federal Social Security Act, as amended, whose 237 income did not exceed one hundred thirty-five percent (135%) of 238 the nonfarm official poverty level as defined by the Office of 239 Management and Budget and whose eligibility was covered under the 240 former category of eligibility known as Poverty Level Aged and 241 Disabled (PLADS).

242 SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 3, 243 Three Hundred Ninety-eight Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$398,550.00) General Funds and One Million One Hundred One 244 Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,101,450.00) Special Funds 245 are provided for five (5) slots in the Assisted Living Waiver 246 247 program for persons with Traumatic Brain Injury and in need of 248 Cognitive Rehabilitation. The Division shall develop eligibility 249 criteria for these additional slots.

250 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 251 funds appropriated in this act to the Governor's Office - Division 252 of Medicaid for the Mississippi Coordinated Access Network 253 (MS-CAN) program be used in the most efficient and effective 254 manner possible to achieve the intended mission of the division. 255 The division and the coordinated care organizations with which the 256 division has contracted to conduct the MS-CAN program shall 257 establish baselines for the health-related outcome measurement for 258 each of the following health focus areas for presentation at the 259 Joint Legislative Budget Committee hearings for Fiscal Year 2020, 260 which will be used as the baseline levels for establishing targets 261 for improvements in quality of care performance measures for the 262 MS-CAN program in Fiscal Year 2020 and later fiscal years: 263 a. Comprehensive Diabetes Care (CDC) or successive measure.

264 b. Medication Management for People with Asthma (MMA) or 265 successive measure.

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d. Adult BMI Assessment (ABA) and Weight Assessment and
Counseling for Nutrition and Physical Activity for
Children/Adolescents (WCC) or successive measure.

In addition, for comparison purposes, these same baselines for the health-related outcome measurements shall be established for similar Medicaid recipients who are not enrolled in the MS-CAN program.

275 **SECTION 14.** It is the further intention of the Legislature 276 that, for the Fiscal Year 2020, the Division of Medicaid shall not 277 restrict HIV antiretroviral medications.

278 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 4, 279 Four Million One Hundred Sixty-one Thousand Ninety-five Dollars 280 (\$4,161,095.00) shall be allocated to the Delta Health Alliance 281 for the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population Health Demonstration 282 Project. Funds shall be transferred no later than July 31, 2019. 283 A progress report on the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population 284 Health Demonstration Project shall be provided by Delta Health 285 Alliance to the Chairmen of the Senate and House Public Health 286 Committees, Senate and House Medicaid Committees and the Senate 287 and House Appropriations Committees on or before December 31, 288 2019.

289 **SECTION 16.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 290 Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid and the Department of

294 SECTION 17. The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid is 295 authorized to expend funds appropriated herein as necessary to 296 provide currently existing home and community based services 297 through any CMS approved state plan or home and community based 298 services waiver to individuals who qualify for those services to 299 avoid institutionalization or to transition an individual from an 300 institution to any home and community based setting. Provision of 301 such services shall not count against any limit imposed under this 302 act. It is the intention of the Legislature that the cost of 303 providing home and community based services shall not exceed the 304 cost of nursing facility services, as determined by the Division. 305 SECTION 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 306 Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall develop a payment 307 methodology or methodologies to reimburse rural hospitals that 308 have fifty (50) or fewer licensed beds under a cost-based 309 methodology pursuant to the provisions of Section 310 43-13-117(A)(2)(c) of the Mississippi Code or another methodology 311 which results in increased payments for outpatient services for 312 such hospitals. Such payment methodology or methodologies shall be submitted to the House and Senate Appropriations Chairmen no 313 314 later than December 31, 2019.

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315 **SECTION 19.** It is the intention of the Legislature, the 316 Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall use a provider 317 owned company which is domiciled in the State of Mississippi with 318 experience in credentialing Mississippi providers.

319 SECTION 20. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 320 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 321 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 322 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 323 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 324 325 SECTION 21. This act shall take effect and be in force from 326 and after July 1, 2019.
