- 4 WHEREAS, for decades the United States of America and the
- 5 Republic of China (Taiwan) have fostered a close relationship of
- 6 enormous mutual economic, cultural and strategic benefit to both
- 7 parties; and
- 8 WHEREAS, bilateral trade between the United States and Taiwan
- 9 reached 68.2 billion in 2017, making Taiwan the 11th largest
- 10 trading partner of the United States and the largest per capita
- 11 importer of United States agricultural products, and both nations
- 12 could realize further economic gains through establishing a
- 13 bilateral trade agreement (BTA) as well as enhancing platforms
- 14 such as a Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA) and
- 15 Digital Economy Forum (DEF); and

- 16 WHEREAS, the Republic of China (Taiwan) maintains biennial
- 17 agricultural procurement missions to the United States to sign
- 18 multi-billion-dollar supply deals and has been actively

- 19 dispatching a substantial delegation to participate in the
- 20 SelectUSA Investment Summit since 2013; and
- 21 WHEREAS, the World Economic Forum's 2018 Global
- 22 Competitiveness Report rated Taiwan 13th amongst 140 economies and
- 23 recognized Taiwan as one of the World's Four Super Innovators,
- 24 resulting from wide-ranging regulatory efforts to build an
- 25 environment conducive to financial sector development and foreign
- 26 direct investment, and underscoring the impact of Taiwan's
- 27 Five-plus-two industrial innovation initiative targeting the
- 28 high-growth sectors of biotech and pharmaceuticals, green energy,
- 29 national defense, smart machinery and Internet of Things, as well
- 30 as the circular economy and a new paradigm of agriculture; and
- 31 WHEREAS, the Taiwan Relations Act of 1979 has continued to
- 32 provide a sturdy foundation for robust United States-Taiwan
- 33 relations to flourish for nearly 40 years, contributing to peace
- 34 and stability in the Asia-Pacific region, and this year the Taiwan
- 35 Travel Act was passed by both chambers of the United States
- 36 Congress and signed by President Trump to encourage high-level
- 37 officials' visits between our two countries; and
- 38 WHEREAS, both countries have further affirmed their
- 39 partnership in such areas as international humanitarian
- 40 assistance, public health and technology under the Global
- 41 Cooperation and Training Framework (GCTF) established in June
- 42 2015; and



43 WHEREAS, 2019 marks the 36th anniversary of Mississippi-Taiwan sister-state relations, which have nurtured and 44 maintained a friendship built upon unwavering bonds beneficial and 45 rewarding for both governments and their citizens now and in the 46 47 future: Mississippi exported \$62,000,000.00 in goods and services 48 to Taiwan in 2017, making Taiwan the 5th largest export partner for Mississippi in Asia and Taiwan sent a business delegation to 49 50 visit Mississippi companies in November 2017, which reflects 51 Taiwan's commitment to deepening economic ties with Mississippi; 52 and 53 WHEREAS, travel from the Republic of China (Taiwan) to the United States increased by more than 50 percent since Taiwan's 54 55 participation in the United States Visa Waiver Program in 2012, 56 and Taiwan joined the United States Global Entry program in 57 November 2017, and these significant efforts will continue to 58 promote tourism and encourage exchanges between the two peoples; 59 and 60 WHEREAS, nontraditional security threats are increasing in 61 the 21st century, so the meaningful participation and inclusion of 62 Taiwan, the 22nd largest economy in the world, to the 63 International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL), the 64 International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), the United 65 Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), and the

World Health Assembly (WHA) would be beneficial to all nations and

their people:

78	relationship between the State of Mississippi and the Republic of					
79	China (Taiwan); and commend Mr. Peter Chen, Director General of					
80	the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Houston, for efforts					
81	and contributions toward enhancing cooperation between Mississippi					
82	and Taiwan.
