- WHEREAS, for the year 2015, Mississippi had the second 5
- highest rate of diagnosis of colorectal cancer in the United 6
- 7 States and the third highest death rate from this form of cancer,
- according to statistics from the Centers for Disease Control and 8
- 9 Prevention; and
- 10 WHEREAS, reliable estimates from the Mississippi Cancer
- Registry indicate that on an annual basis, more than 1,700 11
- 12 individuals in Mississippi are diagnosed with colorectal cancer,
- and more than 600 Mississippians die from the disease; and 13
