- 5 WHEREAS, from 2002 until 2019, President Beverly Wade Hogan
- 6 has served with honor, distinction and steadfast faith as Tougaloo
- 7 College's leader, and for 17 years, the students, faculty,
- 8 administration, staff and alumni benefitted tremendously from her
- 9 preeminent guidance and innate leadership abilities; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Dr. Hogan provided extraordinary service as
- 11 president to strengthen Tougaloo College and build the
- 12 institution's reputation, and with Dr. Hogan at the helm, the
- 13 college excelled and advanced in its educational purpose and
- 14 institutional pursuit; and
- WHEREAS, the 13th President and first woman to lead this
- 16 historic institution, Dr. Hogan has a long and distinguished
- 17 career as a public administrator, educator, community leader and
- 18 humanitarian beginning prior to her college presidency with more

- 19 than 25 years of executive level management experience which
- 20 shaped her world view and understanding of diverse issues; and
- 21 WHEREAS, her work as a mental health professional, government
- 22 official, college administrator and adjunct instructor in
- 23 administrative law, leadership and public policy, her public
- 24 speeches, her public works and her community service address
- 25 issues of economic and social justice, civil democracy and racial
- 26 and gender equity; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Dr. Hogan was a Toll Fellow with the Council of
- 28 State Governments and a Public Scholar with the Kettering
- 29 Foundation, and she was also affiliated with the German Marshall
- 30 Fund to study employment and training programs in West Germany,
- 31 Denmark and Sweden; and
- 32 WHEREAS, under her leadership at Tougaloo College, new
- 33 undergraduate degree programs in mass communications, hotel and
- 34 hospitality management and religious studies, as well as two
- 35 graduate degree programs, were added, and a new Honors Program,
- 36 the Center for Undergraduate Research, the Center for
- 37 International Studies and Global Change and the Institute for the
- 38 Study of Modern Day Slavery have been established; and
- 39 WHEREAS, significant technological improvements have been
- 40 achieved, including campus-wide connectivity, smart classrooms,
- 41 wireless networks, and the installation of an integrated
- 42 information management system, and campus renovations, the
- 43 repurposing and renovation of the L. Zenobia Coleman Library and

- 44 the construction of the new Bennie G. Thompson Academic and Civil
- 45 Rights Research Center have transformed the living and learning
- 46 environment; and
- WHEREAS, an engaged citizen, Dr. Hogan serves on the board
- 48 for a myriad of nonprofit organizations, community foundations and
- 49 corporations, and she has also served on the board of directors
- 50 for various higher education organizations, including the Council
- of Independent Colleges, National Association for Independent
- 52 Colleges and Universities, the National Association for Equal
- 53 Opportunity in Higher Education, President Obama's Board of
- 54 Advisors for HBCUs, the Advisory Council for the National
- 55 Institutes of Health/National Heart Blood Lung Institute and the
- 56 Department of Defense's National Multidisciplinary Committee, and
- 57 she is currently the Chairperson of the Advisory Board for the
- 58 HBCU Capital Financing Program and serves on UNCF's Corporate
- 59 Board of Directors; and
- 60 WHEREAS, a practitioner and scholar, Dr. Hogan has written
- 61 and published several professional articles, including "A
- 62 Dissonance Analysis of the Vietnam War," "Comparable Worth: The
- 63 Issue of Pay Equity," "Public Policy Implications for HIV-AIDS in
- 64 the Workplace," "Higher Education and Civic Responsibility," "Jobs
- 65 and Economic Growth," and is a contributing author for a textbook
- 66 published in 2008, Leadership and Public Service, Race and Gender;
- 67 and

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- WHEREAS, she holds an undergraduate degree in psychology from
- 69 Tougaloo College, a master's degree of public policy and
- 70 administration from Jackson State University with graduate study
- 71 in clinical psychology, and further doctoral study at Fielding
- 72 Graduate University in human and organization development, she has
- 73 done additional study at Harvard University and Oxford University
- 74 in Oxford, England, and she is the recipient of honorary
- 75 doctorates from Brown University and Rust, Wiley and Benedict
- 76 Colleges; and
- 77 WHEREAS, Dr. Hogan and her husband, Marvin, have two adult
- 78 sons, two daughters-in-law and seven beautiful grandchildren; and
- 79 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
- 80 and honor the steadfast devotion to the betterment of Tougaloo
- 81 College and the zealous vow of impeccable leadership that Dr.
- 82 Beverly Wade Hogan bestowed upon the students, faculty,
- 83 administration, staff and alumni as the President of Tougaloo
- 84 College:
