HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 2

1 A RESOLUTION REMEMBERING THE GALLANT SERVICE AND COMMENDING 2 THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF PATROLMAN JAMES KEVIN WHITE, OF THE 3 BROOKHAVEN POLICE DEPARTMENT, WHO WAS LOST IN THE LINE OF DUTY ON 4 SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2018, AND EXPRESSING SYMPATHY TO HIS 5 FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HIS PASSING.

6 WHEREAS, it is written in II Corinthians 4:17-18, "For our 7 light affliction, which is but for a moment, worked for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory; While we look not at 8 9 the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: 10 for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are eternal," and as such, the immaculate author and 11 12 finisher of our soul's destiny summoned the mortal presence of dearly beloved, James Kevin White, to rest eternally, as he has 13 14 made life's final transition from earthly travailing to heavenly 15 reward, rendering great sorrow and loss to his family and friends; 16 and

WHEREAS, the community of Brookhaven, Mississippi, lost a wonderful friend, true public servant and decorated United States Army veteran with the passing Patrolman James Kevin White on

20 Saturday, September 29, 2018, in service to the citizens of 21 Brookhaven, and there is now a hush in our hearts as we come 22 together to pay our respects to the memory of one who has been 23 called to join that innumerable heavenly caravan; and

24 WHEREAS, Patrolman White, a native of the community known as 25 the "Home Seeker's Paradise," was born on July 7, 1983, to James 26 Darrell White and Laurie Maxwell White, and possessed a zeal for 27 life that was complimented by his personal determination to do his 28 best in any endeavor undertaken, whether in the aid and assistance 29 of others or the betterment of himself, which was made evident in 30 his joining the Mississippi Army National Guard and subsequent 31 tour of duty during Operation Iraqi Freedom, where he earned a 32 Purple Heart; and

WHEREAS, Patrolman White, who had previously worked with the 33 34 Brookhaven Police Department before returning in June 2015 after a 35 stint with the Monticello Police Department, was a man of integral 36 character dedicated to the cause of serving others who did not cower in fear when facing the most adverse of conditions, and 37 38 valiantly assumed the selflessness of a hero when using his life 39 as a shield to protect the lives of others through the payment of 40 the ultimate sacrifice; and

41 WHEREAS, having extended himself to persevere above and 42 beyond the call of duty, honor and loyalty to the United States, 43 which he so fervently held sacred throughout the performance of 44 his duties and Mississippi sworn law enforcement officer,

White and James "Lee" Edward White; fiancé, Elizebeth "Liz" 55 56 Howell; siblings, Lisa "Wese" White and Trey McBlair; special 57 honorary brother, Dustin Vanderslice; stepsister, Leslie Kelly; stepbrother, Yaun White; nieces and nephews, Holly, Leiana, 58 59 Colton, Sidnie, Stevie, Maggie and Hannah; grandparents, Curtis 60 and Nadine Maxwell and Margaret Pitre; and a host of other 61 relatives, friends and brothers and sisters in uniform; and

WHEREAS, counted among Mississippi's and Brookhaven's heroes, committed to our national and local safety and security, the State of Mississippi shares the sentiment that to a country, a fallen officer means a national loss; to a community, a fallen officer means a true hero; to a child, spouse or parent, a fallen officer means a loved one who will not be coming home; and
