HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 19

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING MRS. IDA AMELIA FRANKE LADNIER SHAW UPON THE OCCASION OF HER 100TH BIRTHDAY.

WHEREAS, on January 7, 1919, in Pascagoula, Mississippi, the

- 5 Shaw, and decades later, upon the auspicious occasion of her 100th
- 6 birthday, she continues to shower those around her with
- 7 unconditional love and support; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Ida attended Pineville Elementary School and when
- 9 she was old enough, she learned the family business bottling milk
- 10 in her father's dairy, and after she graduated from Pass Christian
- 11 High School, she was determined to further her education, so with
- 12 only her mother's help and encouragement, she dressed chickens to
- 13 earn tuition money and attended Perkinston Junior College; and
- 14 WHEREAS, during her tenure at Perkinston, she played the
- 15 piano and sang in the Glee Club, and to earn extra money, she
- 16 waited tables at a local restaurant, worked in the library and
- even graded papers for a professor on campus; and

18	WHEREAS, Ida received her teacher's certificate during the
19	summer session at Mississippi Southern Teacher's College in
20	Hattiesburg, and in 1939, she accepted her first job in education
21	as the beginners, first and second grade teacher at the school
22	headed by the new principal, Mr. Royal M. Ladnier; and
23	WHEREAS, as their work relationship progressed, so did their
24	personal one, and in 1940, Royal M. Ladnier and Ida Amelia Franke
25	exchanged the vows of holy matrimony at St. Ann's Catholic Church
26	in Lizana, and the two love birds were married for 57 years before
27	Royal's passing in 1997; and
28	WHEREAS, over the next several years, Mr. and Mrs. Ladnier
29	lived in several locations and made several career moves, but as
30	the landscape of their lives changed, their love and adoration for
31	one another never wavered, and they expanded their family with the
32	addition of seven children: Randall, Royce, Linda, Glen, Dale,
33	Janice and Kevin; and
34	WHEREAS, when Royal became the principal of Sellers School in
35	Perkinston, Ida taught second grade there as well as piano to some
36	students, and it seemed as though they had finally found a place
37	they could settle down, so they began building a home for their
38	family along Highway 53 and in 1952, they moved in; and
39	WHEREAS, eventually, Ida closed the teaching chapter of her
40	book and accepted a job with the Department of Welfare as it was
41	known back then, and after 17 years of placing children in foster
42	care and performing research, she retired in 1970; and

her delicious canned fruit and preserves as well as plants at the 44 farmer's market in Biloxi, and in the late 1970s, the Ladniers 45 began raising thoroughbred horses, selling some and racing others 46 47 in Louisiana; and 48 WHEREAS, after Mr. Ladnier's passing in 1997, Ida married Mr. Gilmer Shaw in 2002, but unfortunately, he passed away in 2003, 49 and Ida herself has had to survive breast cancer, a stroke, nose 50 51 cancer and the passing of her youngest daughter, Janice, but 52 despite all that, Ida remains a fighter; and 53 WHEREAS, throughout her life, Ida has played the organ at St. Ann's Catholic Church for 50 years, quilted masterpieces her 54 55 entire life, grown breathtakingly gorgeous, award-winning 56 camellias as well as created a new, dark red bloom variety, served 57 as a notary public and income tax preparer, worked for the census 58 bureau, traveled to numerous exotic places, including Mexico, 59 Europe, the Caribbean, the Panama Canal and Alaska, and in 2008, she attended the Olympics in China; and 60 61 WHEREAS, for the past 100 years, Mrs. Ida Amelia Franke 62 Ladnier Shaw has undoubtedly inspired her family and friends, 63 greeting everyone she meets with a million-watt smile that could 64 illuminate even the darkest day, and her children, grandchildren

and great-grandchildren love her tremendously and revere her as

the wonderful mother and grandmother she truly is; and

WHEREAS, after retirement, Ida spent several years selling
