A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE, LEGACY AND SERVICE OF MR. IRA S. POLK, JR., AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HIS PASSING.

4 WHEREAS, it is written in II Corinthians 4:17-18, "For our

5 light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far

more exceeding and eternal weight of glory; While we look not at

7 the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen:

8 for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which

9 are not seen are eternal," and as such, the immaculate author and

10 finisher of our soul's destiny summoned the mortal presence of

11 dearly beloved, Mr. Ira S. Polk, Jr., to rest eternally, as he has

12 made life's final transition from earthly travailing to heavenly

13 reward, rendering great sorrow and loss to his family and friends;

15 WHEREAS, the community of Moss Point, Mississippi, lost a

16 wonderful friend with the passing of community pillar and former

17 mayor, Mr. Polk, on Monday, March 4, 2019, and there is now a hush

18 in our hearts as we come together to pay our respects to the

- 19 memory of one who has been called to join that innumerable
- 20 heavenly caravan; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Mr. Polk, a lifelong resident of Moss Point and
- 22 graduate of Magnolia High School, was grounded in the success of
- 23 education, matriculating to postsecondary degree completion at
- 24 Tougaloo College, Howard University Medical School of Allied
- 25 Health and Auburn University's certified teacher program; and
- 26 WHEREAS, from his humble beginnings, Mr. Polk was instilled
- 27 with the principles of service and how to champion the cause of
- 28 equality, justice and right, which served as the impetus of his
- 29 decision to devote his life in the service of his fellowman, which
- 30 took on the form of his answering the call to patriot arms when he
- 31 served in the United States Army Corps as a surgical technician,
- 32 as well as being a drum major for civil rights to erase the blight
- 33 of racial injustice in Moss Point; and
- 34 WHEREAS, after the completion of his military service, Mr.
- 35 Polk returned to Moss Point, and cognizant of the words recorded
- 36 in II Thessalonians 3:10 "that if any would not work, neither
- 37 should he eat," he undertook several jobs throughout the course of
- 38 his life in Jackson County, where he served as a science teacher
- 39 and football, basketball and track coach at Moss Point High, and
- 40 devoted 24 years as a coating chemist at Ingalls Shipbuilding and
- 41 at various medical offices; and
- WHEREAS, devoted to the betterment of the community, Mr.
- 43 Polk, who served on the Singing River Hospital Board of Trustees

- 44 and the Moss Point School Board, was elected to the office of
- 45 Mayor of Moss Point in 1993, a role in which he used his
- 46 influential rapport with both citizens and businesses alike to
- 47 advance the greater good of the city, which resulted in: the
- 48 construction of the Pelican Landing Convention Center; the naming
- 49 of the Highway 63 bridge in honor of Vietnam War veterans, as the
- 50 Vietnam Memorial Bridge; the institution of the annual Fall de Rah
- 51 Festival; the passage of local and private legislation by the
- 52 Mississippi Legislature that would generate additional revenue for
- 53 the city through a three percent hotel tax, for each bed rented in
- 54 hotels located in the city; and
- 55 WHEREAS, other notable stars on his crown of service give nod
- 56 to his unmatched leadership and indomitable commitment to social
- 57 obligation and civic duties, as indicated by his memberships and
- 58 affiliations with such organizations as: Omega Psi Phi
- 59 Fraternity, Inc.; Magnolia Elks Lodge #1354; NAACP; SCLC; Magnolia
- 60 High School Alumni Association; and the Jackson County Democratic
- 61 Executive Committee, for which he served as vice chairman; and
- 62 WHEREAS, in his transfiguration from mortality to
- 63 immortality, Mr. Polk now adorns the spiritual raiment, awaiting
- 64 the bridegroom's return in holy anticipation of that wondrous
- 65 event recorded in Revelation 21:1-2 "And I saw a new Heaven and a
- 66 new earth: for the first Heaven and the first earth were passed
- 67 away; and there was no more sea. And I John saw the holy city, new

- 68 Jerusalem, coming down from God out of Heaven, prepared as a bride
- 69 adorned for her husband"; and
- 70 WHEREAS, though he has traversed the river of life to now
- 71 stand upon the celestial shores of Heaven's grandeur, the legacy
- 72 of Mr. Polk's indelible imprint will continue to refresh the
- 73 hearts and fond memories of his beloved survivors: his wife,
- 74 Bessie Polk; children and grandchildren; and a host of other
- 75 relatives and friends; and
- 76 WHEREAS, we encourage the family to find solace from the
- 77 overwhelming sadness created by the earthly departure of their
- 78 beloved family member and be renewed in their faith that Mr. Polk
- 79 fulfilled the purpose of his appointed time in adherence to the
- 80 commandment of II Timothy 4:7, by having "fought a good fight,
- 81 finishing his course and keeping the faith until the hour of his
- 82 departure was at hand"; and
- 83 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 84 commend the life of a genuine and selfless individual such as Mr.
- 85 Polk, whose life light illuminated the path of hope for all he
- 86 encountered along this earthly sojourn:

- 89 mourn the loss and commemorate the life and legacy of Mr. Ira S.
