HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 101

1 A RESOLUTION HONORING AGRICULTURE TEACHER AND FARM MANAGER 2 MIKE DALE FOR 36 YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE STUDENTS OF 3 FORREST COUNTY AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOL AND CONGRATULATING HIM 4 UPON HIS RETIREMENT.

5 WHEREAS, 2019 marks the last year that agriculture teacher 6 and farm manager Mike Dale will train the minds and enhance the 7 skills of the students at Forrest County Agricultural High School 8 (FCAHS) because he is retiring after 36 years of dedicated service 9 to his students; and

10 WHEREAS, his passion for the agriculture and livestock 11 industry and his understanding of the hard work required for the 12 industry stem from his childhood while growing up in a family that 13 was dedicated to the livestock industry; and

14 WHEREAS, to harness his passion for the agriculture and 15 livestock industry, a young Mike Dale graduated from Oak Grove 16 High School and went on to attend Pearl River Community College 17 before transferring to Mississippi State University, where he 18 earned a bachelor of science degree in agriculture and extension 19 education, and later earned his master's degree in agriculture and 20 extension education while also working as a full-time teacher; and

21 WHEREAS, as the agriculture teacher and farm manager at 22 FCAHS, his enthusiasm for training his students during his tenure 23 has translated into numerous achievements by his students, such as 24 winning local, state and national Future Farmers of America (FFA) 25 competitions, serving as state officers of the Mississippi FFA, 26 and going on to have prosperous careers in agriculture, including 27 becoming agriculture teachers in their own communities; and

28 WHEREAS, as farm manager, his enthusiasm is evidenced by the 29 growth of the FCAHS 320-acre campus which now includes nearly two 30 hundred head of livestock, a commercial cow/calf operation, a herd 31 of hair sheep, meat goats, horses and pigs, and the numerous wins 32 by his students in local and state livestock competitions; and

33 WHEREAS, under Mr. Dale's leadership, students not only meet 34 the daily needs of the livestock, but also are challenged to solve 35 problems that arise, such as building fences, constructing barns, 36 administering vaccines, managing pastureland, cutting hay, welding 37 projects and much more and how to use these resources to 38 understand the origins of their food and fiber; and

39 WHEREAS, Mr. Dale's guidance has been instrumental in helping 40 students prepare their animals for local, district and state level 41 shows such as the State Fair and the Dixie National Livestock 42 Show, and he can also be credited for playing a special role in 43 bringing about a Hair Sheep Division at these state-level shows in

51 WHEREAS, Mr. Dale has not only been dedicated to his 52 students, but he has always been especially dedicated to his wife 53 Cheryl, who is the Dean of the School of Business at William Carey 54 University, and their triplet sons -- Landon, Linden and Logan, 55 all of whom graduated from FCAHS and went on to receive their 56 bachelor degrees from Mississippi State University, and have 57 successful careers tied to the agricultural industry; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Dale encompasses all aspects of the best of the Future Farmers of America (FFA) creed which can be summed up in the final statement of the creed, which states, "I believe that American agriculture can and will hold true to the best traditions of our national life and that I can exert an influence in my home and community which will stand solid for my part in that inspiring task."; and
