SENATE BILL NO. 2041

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2 INCLUDE TALLAHATCHIE AND HOLMES COUNTIES IN THE PROVISION
3 AUTHORIZING SALARY SUPPLEMENTS TO MASTER TEACHERS WHO TEACH IN THE
4 MISSISSIPPI DELTA; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7 amended as follows:

8 37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the Mississippi Adequate
9 Education Program for teachers' salaries in each county and
10 separate school district shall be determined and paid in
11 accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in
12 this subsection. For teachers holding the following types of
13 licenses or the equivalent as determined by the State Board of
14 Education, and the following number of years of teaching
15 experience, the scale shall be as follows:

96 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made
97 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the
98 funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall
99 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal
100 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of
101 Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority
102 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to
103 establish, administer and maintain the system.

104 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a
105 minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no
106 school district shall receive any funds under this section for any
107 school year during which the local supplement paid to any
108 individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that
109 paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties
110 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school
111 year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health
112 and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the
113 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a
114 part of the amount of individual local supplement.

115 The level of professional training of each teacher to be used
116 in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each
117 year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license
118 issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current
119 school year. Provided, however, that school districts are



120 authorized, in their discretion, to negotiate the salary levels
121 applicable to certificated employees who are receiving retirement
122 benefits from the retirement system of another state, and the
123 annual experience increment provided above in Section 37-19-7
124 shall not be applicable to any such retired certificated employee.

125 (2) (a) The following employees shall receive an annual
126 salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars
127 (\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other
128 compensation to which the employee may be entitled:

129 (i) Any licensed teacher who has met the
130 requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the
131 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is
132 employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education
133 as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall
134 submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the
135 certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be
136 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
137 year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State
138 Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be
139 eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
140 second term of the school year.

141 (ii) A licensed nurse who has met the requirements
142 and acquired a certificate from the National Board for
143 Certification of School Nurses, Inc., and who is employed by a
144 local school board or the State Board of Education as a school



145 nurse and not as an administrator. The licensed school nurse
146 shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education
147 that the certificate was received before October 15 in order to be
148 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
149 year, or the licensed school nurse shall submit the documentation
150 to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order
151 to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
152 second term of the school year. Provided, however, that the total
153 number of licensed school nurses eligible for a salary supplement
154 under this subparagraph (ii) shall not exceed thirty-five (35).

155 (iii) Any licensed school counselor who has met
156 the requirements and acquired a National Certified School
157 Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified
158 Counselors and who is employed by a local school board or the
159 State Board of Education as a counselor and not as an
160 administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall submit
161 documentation to the State Department of Education that the
162 endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be
163 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
164 year, or the licensed school counselor shall submit such
165 documentation to the State Department of Education prior to
166 February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
167 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
168 However, any school counselor who started the National Board for
169 Professional Teaching Standards process for school counselors



170 between June 1, 2003, and June 30, 2004, and completes the
171 requirements and acquires the Master Teacher certificate shall be
172 entitled to the master teacher supplement, and those counselors
173 who complete the process shall be entitled to a one-time
174 reimbursement for the actual cost of the process as outlined in
175 paragraph (b) of this subsection.

176 (iv) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and
177 audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a
178 Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American
179 Speech-Language-Hearing Association and any certified academic
180 language therapist (CALT) who has met the certification
181 requirements of the Academic Language Therapy Association and who
182 is employed by a local school board or is employed by a state
183 agency under the State Personnel Board. The licensed
184 speech-language pathologist and audiologist and certified academic
185 language therapist shall submit documentation to the State
186 Department of Education that the certificate or endorsement was
187 received before October 15 in order to be eligible for the full
188 salary supplement in the current school year, or the licensed
189 speech-language pathologist and audiologist and certified academic
190 language therapist shall submit the documentation to the State
191 Department of Education before February 15 in order to be eligible
192 for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of
193 the school year. However, the total number of certified academic



194 language therapists eligible for a salary supplement under this
195 paragraph (iv) shall not exceed twenty (20).

196 (b) An employee shall be reimbursed for the actual cost
197 of completing each component of acquiring the certificate or
198 endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for postgraduate
199 courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each
200 component, not to exceed four (4) components, for a teacher,
201 school counselor or speech-language pathologist and audiologist,
202 regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of
203 the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any
204 private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the
205 process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any
206 employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and
207 the State Department of Education shall reimburse the school
208 district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the process
209 resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. If a
210 private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing the
211 process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an
212 employee, the local school district may agree to directly
213 reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the
214 employee.

215 (c) All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process
216 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid
217 directly by the State Department of Education to the local school
218 district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program



219 allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations
220 promulgated by the State Board of Education. Local school
221 districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any
222 employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall
223 receive any local supplement to which employees with similar
224 training and experience otherwise are entitled. However, an
225 educational employee shall receive the salary supplement in the
226 amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for only one (1) of the
227 qualifying certifications authorized under paragraph (a) of this
228 subsection. No school district shall provide more than one (1)
229 annual salary supplement under the provisions of this subsection
230 to any one individual employee holding multiple qualifying
231 national certifications.

232 (d) If an employee for whom such cost has been paid, in
233 full or in part, by a local school district or private individual
234 or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement
235 process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or
236 individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district
237 or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or
238 her certificate or endorsement.

239 (3) The following employees shall receive an annual salary
240 supplement in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00),
241 plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other compensation to
242 which the employee may be entitled:



243 Effective July 1, * * * 2019, if funds are available for
244 that purpose, any licensed teacher who has met the requirements
245 and acquired a Master Teacher Certificate from the National Board
246 for Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed in a
247 public school district located in one (1) of the following
248 counties: Claiborne, Adams, Jefferson, Wilkinson, Amite, Bolivar,
249 Coahoma, Leflore, Quitman, Sharkey, Issaquena, Sunflower * * *,
250 Washington, Tallahatchie and Holmes. The salary supplement
251 awarded under the provisions of this subsection (3) shall be in
252 addition to the salary supplement awarded under the provisions of
253 subsection (2) of this section.

254 Teachers who meet the qualifications for a salary supplement
255 under this subsection (3) who are assigned for less than one (1)
256 full year or less than full time for the school year shall receive
257 the salary supplement in a prorated manner, with the portion of
258 the teacher's assignment to the critical geographic area to be
259 determined as of June 15th of the school year.

260 (4) (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the
261 "Mississippi Performance-Based Pay (MPBP)" plan. In addition to
262 the minimum base pay described in this section, only after full
263 funding of MAEP and if funds are available for that purpose, the
264 State of Mississippi may provide monies from state funds to school
265 districts for the purposes of rewarding certified teachers,
266 administrators and nonlicensed personnel at individual schools
267 showing improvement in student test scores. The MPBP plan shall



268 be developed by the State Department of Education based on the
269 following criteria:

270 (i) It is the express intent of this legislation
271 that the MPBP plan shall utilize only existing standards of
272 accreditation and assessment as established by the State Board of
273 Education.

274 (ii) To ensure that all of Mississippi's teachers,
275 administrators and nonlicensed personnel at all schools have equal
276 access to the monies set aside in this section, the MPBP program
277 shall be designed to calculate each school's performance as
278 determined by the school's increase in scores from the prior
279 school year. The MPBP program shall be based on a standardized
280 scores rating where all levels of schools can be judged in a
281 statistically fair and reasonable way upon implementation. At the
282 end of each year, after all student achievement scores have been
283 standardized, the State Department of Education shall implement
284 the MPBP plan.

285 (iii) To ensure all teachers cooperate in the
286 spirit of teamwork, individual schools shall submit a plan to the
287 local school district to be approved before the beginning of each
288 school year beginning July 1, 2008. The plan shall include, but
289 not be limited to, how all teachers, regardless of subject area,
290 and administrators will be responsible for improving student
291 achievement for their individual school.



292 (b) The State Board of Education shall develop the
293 processes and procedures for designating schools eligible to
294 participate in the MPBP. State assessment results, growth in
295 student achievement at individual schools and other measures
296 deemed appropriate in designating successful student achievement
297 shall be used in establishing MPBP criteria. The State Board of
298 Education shall develop the MPBP policies and procedures and
299 report to the Legislature and Governor by December 1, 2006.

300 (5) (a) Beginning in the 2008-2009 school year, if funds
301 are available for that purpose, each school in Mississippi shall
302 have mentor teachers, as defined by Sections 37-9-201 through
303 37-9-213, who shall receive additional base compensation provided
304 for by the State Legislature in the amount of One Thousand Dollars
305 (\$1,000.00) per each beginning teacher that is being mentored.
306 The additional state compensation shall be limited to those mentor
307 teachers that provide mentoring services to beginning teachers.
308 For the purposes of such funding, a beginning teacher shall be
309 defined as any teacher in any school in Mississippi that has less
310 than one (1) year of classroom experience teaching in a public
311 school. For the purposes of such funding, no full-time academic
312 teacher shall mentor more than two (2) beginning teachers.

313 (b) To be eligible for this state funding, the
314 individual school must have a classroom management program
315 approved by the local school board.



316 (6) Effective with the 2014-2015 school year, the school
317 districts participating in the Pilot Performance-Based
318 Compensation System pursuant to Section 37-19-9 may award
319 additional teacher and administrator pay based thereon.

320 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
321 and after July 1, 2019.
