SENATE BILL NO. 2286

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-11-51, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD OF FUNERAL SERVICE TO ESTABLISH

3 CRITERIA FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

5 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-11-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

6 amended as follows:

7 73-11-51. (1) No person shall engage in the business or

8 practice of funeral service, including embalming, and/or funeral

9 directing or hold himself out as transacting or practicing or

10 being entitled to transact or practice funeral service, including

11 embalming, and/or funeral directing in this state unless duly

12 licensed under the provisions of this chapter.

13 (2) The board is authorized and empowered to examine

14 applicants for licenses for the practice of funeral service and

15 funeral directing and shall issue the proper license to those

16 persons who successfully pass the applicable examination and

17 otherwise comply with the provisions of this chapter.

18	(3) To be licensed for the practice of funeral directing
19	under this chapter, a person must furnish satisfactory evidence to
20	the board that he or she:

- 21 (a) Is at least eighteen (18) years of age;
- 22 (b) Has a high school diploma or the equivalent
- 23 thereof;
- 24 (c) Has served as a resident trainee for not less than
- 25 twenty-four (24) months under the supervision of a person licensed
- 26 for the practice of funeral service or funeral directing in this
- 27 state;
- 28 (d) Has successfully passed a written and/or oral
- 29 examination as prepared or approved by the board; and
- 30 (e) Is of good moral character.
- 31 (4) To be licensed for the practice of funeral service under
- 32 this chapter, a person must furnish satisfactory evidence to the
- 33 board that he or she:
- 34 (a) Is at least eighteen (18) years of age;
- 35 (b) Has a high school diploma or the equivalent
- 36 thereof;
- 37 (c) Has successfully completed twelve (12) months or
- 38 more of academic and professional instruction from an institution
- 39 accredited by the United States Department of Education for
- 40 funeral service education and have a certificate of completion
- 41 from an institution accredited by the American Board of Funeral

- 42 Service Education or any other successor recognized by the United
- 43 States Department of Education for funeral service education;
- 44 (d) Has served as a resident trainee for not less than
- 45 twelve (12) months, either before or after graduation from an
- 46 accredited institution mentioned above, under the supervision of a
- 47 person licensed for the practice of funeral service in this state
- 48 and in an establishment licensed in this state;
- (e) Has successfully passed the National Conference of
- 50 Funeral Examiners examination and/or such other examination as
- 51 approved by the board; and
- 52 (f) Is of good moral character.
- 53 (5) All applications for examination and license for the
- 54 practice of funeral service or funeral directing shall be upon
- 55 forms furnished by the board and shall be accompanied by an
- 56 examination fee, a licensing fee and a nonrefundable application
- 57 fee in amounts fixed by the board in accordance with Section
- 58 73-11-56. The fee for an initial license, however, may be
- 59 prorated in proportion to the period of time from the date of
- 60 issuance to the date of biennial license renewal prescribed in
- 61 subsection (8) of this section. All applications for examination
- 62 shall be filed with the board office at least sixty (60) days
- 63 before the date of examination. A candidate shall be deemed to
- 64 have abandoned the application for examination if he does not
- 65 appear on the scheduled date of examination unless such failure to
- 66 appear has been approved by the board.

67	(6) The practice of funeral service or funeral directing
68	must be engaged in at a licensed funeral establishment, at least
69	one (1) of which is listed as the licensee's place of business;
70	and no person, partnership, corporation, association or other
71	organization shall open or maintain a funeral establishment at
72	which to engage in or conduct or hold himself or itself out as
73	engaging in the practice of funeral service or funeral directing
74	until such establishment has complied with the licensing
75	requirements of this chapter. A license for the practice of
76	funeral service or funeral directing shall be used only at
77	licensed funeral establishments; however, this provision shall not
78	prevent a person licensed for the practice of funeral service or
79	funeral directing from conducting a funeral service at a church, a
80	residence, public hall, lodge room or cemetery chapel, if such
81	person maintains a fixed licensed funeral establishment of his own
82	or is in the employ of or an agent of a licensed funeral
83	establishment.

(7) Any person holding a valid, unrevoked and unexpired nonreciprocal license in another state or territory having requirements greater than or equal to those of this state as determined by the board may apply for a license to practice in this state by filing with the board a certified statement from the secretary of the licensing board of the state or territory in which the applicant holds his license certifying to his qualifications and good standing with that board. He/she must

92 also successfully pass a written and/or oral examination on the 93 Mississippi Funeral Service licensing law and rules and regulations as prepared or approved by the board, and must pay a 94 95 nonrefundable application fee set by the board. If the board 96 finds that the applicant has fulfilled aforesaid requirements and 97 has fulfilled substantially similar requirements of those required for a Mississippi licensee, the board shall grant such license 98 upon receipt of a fee in an amount equal to the renewal fee set by 99 100 the board for a license for the practice of funeral service or 101 funeral directing, as the case may be, in this state. The board 102 may issue a temporary funeral service or funeral directing work 103 permit before a license is granted, before the next regular 104 meeting of the board, if the applicant for a reciprocal license 105 has complied with all requirements, rules and regulations of the 106 The temporary permit will expire at the next regular 107 meeting of the board. The issuance of a license or temporary 108 permit by reciprocity to a military-trained applicant or military 109 spouse shall be subject to the provisions of Section 73-50-1. 110 (8) Except as provided in Section 33-1-39, any person (a) 111 holding a license for the practice of funeral service or funeral 112 directing may have the same renewed for a period of two (2) years 113 by making and filing with the board an application on or before 114 the due date. Payment of the renewal fee shall be in an amount 115 set by the board in accordance with Section 73-11-56. The board

shall mail the notice of renewal and the due date for the payment

- 117 of the renewal fee to the last-known address of each licensee at
- 118 least thirty (30) days before that date. It is the responsibility
- 119 of the licensee to notify the board in writing of any change of
- 120 address. An application will be considered late if the
- 121 application and proper fees are not in the board's office or
- 122 postmarked by the due date. Failure of a license holder to
- 123 receive the notice of renewal shall not exempt or excuse a license
- 124 holder from the requirement of renewing the license on or before
- 125 the license expiration date.
- 126 (b) If the renewal fee is not paid on or postmarked by
- 127 the due date, the license of such person shall by operation of law
- 128 automatically expire and become void without further action of the
- 129 board. The board may reinstate such license if application for
- 130 licensure is made within a period of five (5) years, upon payment
- 131 of the renewal fee for the current year, all renewal fees in
- 132 arrears, and a reinstatement fee. After a period of five (5)
- 133 years, the licensee must make application, pay the current renewal
- 134 fee, all fees in arrears, and pass a written and/or oral
- 135 examination as prepared or approved by the board.
- 136 (9) No license shall be assignable or valid for any person
- 137 other than the original licensee.
- 138 (10) The board may, in its discretion, if there is a major
- 139 disaster or emergency where human death is likely to occur,
- 140 temporarily authorize the practice of funeral directing and
- 141 funeral service by persons licensed to practice in another state

- 142 but not licensed to practice in this state. Only persons licensed
- 144 (11) Any funeral service technology or mortuary science
- 145 program accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service

in this state, however, may sign death certificates.

- 146 Education in the State of Mississippi, as well as students
- 147 enrolled in such a program, shall be exempt from licensing under
- 148 this chapter when embalming or otherwise preparing a deceased
- 149 human body for disposition as part of a student practicum
- 150 experience, when the student is directly supervised by an
- 151 instructor or preceptor who holds a current funeral service
- 152 license. This exemption shall apply to practicum experiences
- 153 performed at an accredited institution of funeral service
- 154 technology or mortuary science program or at a duly licensed
- 155 funeral establishment or commercial mortuary service. Nothing in
- 156 this subsection shall be construed to allow any funeral service
- 157 technology or mortuary science program, or those students enrolled
- 158 in such a program, to engage in practicum experiences for
- 159 remuneration.

- 160 (12) Each application or filing made under this section
- 161 shall include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
- 162 accordance with Section 93-11-64.
- 163 (13) The board is authorized to establish criteria for
- 164 continuing education.
- 165 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 166 and after July 1, 2019.
