SENATE BILL NO. 2496

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-13-71, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXCLUDE CERTAIN ACTIVITIES FROM THE DEFINITION OF THE PRACTICE OF SURVEYING; TO AMEND SECTION 73-13-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE PRECEDING SECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-13-71, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 73-13-71. As used in Sections 73-13-71 through 73-13-105,
- 9 the following terms shall have the following meanings, unless a
- 10 different meaning clearly appears from the context:
- 11 (* * *a) * * * "Board * * *" * * means the Board of
- 12 Licensure for Professional Engineers and Surveyors as provided for
- 13 in Section 73-13-5 * * *.
- 14 (* * *b) * * * "Professional surveyor * * *" * *
- 15 means a person who engages in the practice of surveying * * *,
- 16 whether in an individual capacity, or in behalf of or as an
- 17 employee of any state, county or municipal authority of the State
- 18 of Mississippi.

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               ( * * *c) * * * "Surveyor intern * * *" * * means a
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    candidate for licensure as a professional surveyor who has
    successfully passed the fundamentals of land surveying
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    examination, has met the requirements of the board for enrollment,
    has received from the board a certificate stating that he has
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    successfully passed this portion of the professional land
    surveying examinations and has been enrolled as a surveyor intern.
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               ( * * *d) (i) The practice of "surveying * * *" * *
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    means providing professional services such as consultation,
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    investigation, testimony evaluation, expert technical testimony,
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    planning, mapping, assembling and interpreting reliable scientific
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    measurement and information relative to the location, size, shape
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    or physical features of the earth, improvements on the earth, the
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    space above the earth, or any part of the earth, utilization and
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    development of these facts and interpretation into an orderly
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    survey map, plan or report and in particular, the retracement of
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    or the creating of land boundaries and descriptions of real
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    property.
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                         The practice of surveying includes, but is
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    not limited to, any one or more of the following:
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                         * * *1. Locating, relocating, establishing,
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    reestablishing, laying out or retracing any property boundary or
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easement.

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42	* * $*2.$ Making any survey for the
43	subdivision of any tract of land, including rights-of-way and
44	easements.
45	* * $*3.$ Determining, by the use of
46	principles of surveying, the position for any survey monument or
47	reference point; or setting, resetting or replacing any such
48	monument or reference point, commonly known as control surveys.
49	* * * 4 . Creating, preparing or modifying
50	electronic or computerized data, including land information
51	systems and geographic information systems, relative to the
52	performance of the activities in the above-described * * * $\frac{1}{2}$
53	<u>1.</u> through * * * <u>3</u> .
54	(iii) The practice of surveying does not include
55	work products that represent only a generalized location of a
56	feature, object or boundary upon which the public would not
57	reasonably rely as the precise location of that feature, object or
58	boundary, or the transcription of previously created data into any
59	presentation format by manual or electronic means, and the
60	maintenance thereof, provided that the data is clearly not
61	intended to indicate the authoritative location of property
62	boundaries, the precise definition of the shape or contour of the
63	earth, or the precise location of fixed works of humans.
64	SECTION 2. Section 73-13-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
65	amended as follows:

- 73-13-3. The term "engineer" as used in Sections 73-13-1
- 67 through 73-13-45 shall mean a professional engineer as hereinafter
- 68 defined.
- The term "professional engineer" within the meaning and
- 70 intent of Sections 73-13-1 through 73-13-45 shall mean a person
- 71 who has met the qualifications as required under Section
- 72 73-13-23(1) and who has been issued a certificate of registration
- 73 as a professional engineer.
- 74 The term "engineer intern" as used in Sections 73-13-1
- 75 through 73-13-45 shall mean a candidate for licensure as a
- 76 professional engineer who has met the qualifications as required
- 77 under Section 73-13-23(2) and who has been issued a certificate of
- 78 enrollment as an engineer intern.
- 79 The term "practice of engineering" within the meaning and
- 80 intent of Sections 73-13-1 through 73-13-45 shall mean any service
- 81 or creative work the adequate performance of which requires
- 82 engineering education, training, and experience in the application
- 83 of special knowledge of the mathematical, physical, and
- 84 engineering sciences to such services or creative work as
- 85 consultation, investigation, expert technical testimony
- 86 evaluation, planning, design, and design coordination of
- 87 engineering works and systems, planning the use of land, air and
- 88 water, performing engineering surveys and studies, and the review
- 89 of construction for the purpose of monitoring compliance with
- 90 drawings and specifications; any of which embraces such

- 91 engineering services or work, either public or private, in
- 92 connection with any utilities, water resources, structures,
- 93 buildings, machines, equipment, processes, work systems, projects,
- 94 communication systems, transportation systems, industrial or
- 95 consumer products or equipment of control systems; or engineering
- 96 services or work of a communications, mechanical, electrical,
- 97 hydraulic, pneumatic, chemical, geotechnical (including geology
- 98 and geohydrology incidental to the practice of engineering),
- 99 geological, environmental, or thermal nature, insofar as they
- 100 involve safeguarding life, health or property, and including such
- 101 other professional services as may be necessary to the planning,
- 102 progress and completion of any engineering services.
- 103 Design coordination includes the review and coordination of
- 104 those technical submissions prepared by others, including as
- 105 appropriate and without limitation, consulting engineers,
- 106 surveyors, architects, landscape architects and other
- 107 professionals working under direction of the engineer.
- The term "firm," as used in Sections 73-13-1 through
- 109 73-13-45, shall mean a business entity that offers the
- 110 professional engineering or surveying services to the public of
- 111 its licensed personnel who are either employees, officers,
- 112 directors, partners, members or managers. A business entity may
- 113 be formed as either:
- 114 (a) A professional service corporation;
- 115 (b) A corporation;

116	(c) A partnership, including limited partnerships and
117	limited liability partnerships; or
118	(d) A limited liability company.
119	Prior to any contract for or the provision of professional
120	engineering or surveying services in this jurisdiction, a firm
121	shall obtain a certificate of authority under Section 73-13-43 or
122	Section 73-13-105 of this chapter. A sole proprietorship, owned
123	and operated by a licensee under this chapter is not required to
124	obtain a certificate of authority under Section 73-13-43 or
125	Section 73-13-105. A professional association of licensed
126	professional engineers or professional surveyors is not required
127	to obtain a certificate of authority under Section 73-13-43 or
128	Section 73-13-105. Both the licensed sole proprietor and the
129	licensees within a professional association shall maintain their
130	individual licenses in active status and only offer the
131	professional services for which they are licensed and qualified to
132	provide.
133	Engineering surveys include all survey activities required to
134	support the sound conception, planning, design, construction,
135	maintenance and operation of engineered projects but exclude the
136	practice of surveying as defined in Section 73-13-71 * * *.
137	A person or firm shall be construed to practice or offer to
138	practice engineering within the meaning and intent of Sections

73-13-1 through 73-13-45, who practices any branch of the

profession of engineering; or provides, by verbal claim, sign,

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141	advertisement, letterhead, card, or in any other way represents
142	himself to be a professional engineer, or through the use of some
143	other title implies that he is a professional engineer; or who
144	holds himself out as able to perform or provide, or who does
145	perform any engineering service or work or any other professional
146	service designated by the practitioner or recognized by
147	educational authorities as engineering.

- The term "board" as used in Sections 73-13-1 through 73-13-45 148 shall mean the Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and 149 150 Surveyors provided for by said sections.
- 151 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 152 and after July 1, 2019.

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
