SENATE BILL NO. 2616

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 19-13-111, 31-7-15 AND 31-7-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT IN THE LETTING OF PUBLIC CONTRACTS, PREFERENCE SHALL BE GIVEN TO RESIDENT BIDDERS WHENEVER ALL THINGS ARE EQUAL WITH REGARD TO QUALITY AND SERVICE BUT DIFFER 5 ONLY WITH REGARD TO PRICE, IF THE AGGREGATE OF THE PRICES IN BIDS RECEIVED FROM RESIDENT BIDDERS IS NOT MORE THAN TWO PERCENT 7 GREATER THAN THE AGGREGATE OF THE PRICES IN BIDS RECEIVED FROM NONRESIDENT BIDDERS; TO PROVIDE THAT A NONRESIDENT BIDDER 8 9 DOMICILED IN A STATE HAVING LAWS GRANTING PREFERENCE TO RESIDENT 10 BIDDERS SHALL BE AWARDED MISSISSIPPI CONTRACTS ONLY ON THE SAME 11 BASIS AS THE NONRESIDENT BIDDER'S STATE AWARDS CONTRACTS TO 12 MISSISSIPPI RESIDENTS BIDDING UNDER SIMILAR CIRCUMSTANCES; AND FOR 13 RELATED PURPOSES. 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- SECTION 1. Section 19-13-111, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 15
- 16 amended as follows:
- 17 19-13-111. All bids and contracts for stationery, blank
- books, office supplies and other things must be specific in 18
- 19 stating the kinds or brands and qualities of all articles, as far
- 20 as practicable; the weight per ream and material of all paper; the
- 21 price per quire and the weight per ream of books and record books,
- 22 with the style of binding and size of each kind of book duly
- classified * * *. If other things * * * are substantially 23

- 24 equal * * * with respect to quality * * * and service but
- 25 differing only with respect to price, the board of supervisors
- 26 shall give preference to bids from citizens of this state, if the
- 27 aggregate of the prices in bids received from citizens of this
- 28 state is not more than two percent (2%) greater than the aggregate
- 29 of the prices in bids received from nonresident bidders. A
- 30 nonresident bidder domiciled in a state having laws granting
- 31 preference to resident bidders shall be awarded Mississippi
- 32 contracts only on the same basis as the nonresident bidder's state
- 33 awards contracts to Mississippi residents bidding under similar
- 34 circumstances; and resident bidders actually domiciled in
- 35 Mississippi, whether corporate, individuals, or partnerships, are
- 36 to be granted preference over nonresidents in awarding of
- 37 contracts in the same manner and to the same extent as provided by
- 38 the laws of the state of domicile of the nonresident. When a
- 39 nonresident contractor submits a bid for a contract, he shall
- 40 attach to the bid a copy of his resident state's current law
- 41 pertaining to his state's treatment of nonresident bidders.
- 42 **SECTION 2.** Section 31-7-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 43 amended as follows:
- 44 31-7-15. (1) (a) Whenever two (2) or more competitive bids
- 45 are received * * * and one or more * * * relates to * * * goods
- 46 and services grown, processed or manufactured within this
- 47 state, * * * the bids relating to goods and services grown,

48	processed or manufactured within this state shall be given
49	<pre>preference if:</pre>
50	(i) The aggregate of the prices in received bids
51	that relate to the goods and services grown, processed or
52	manufactured in this state is not more than two percent (2%)
53	greater than the aggregate of the prices received from the lowest
54	bidder; and
55	(ii) All other things stated in * * * the received
56	bids are $\underline{\text{substantially}}$ equal with respect to * * * quality and
57	service * * *.
58	(b) A * * * preference similar to that authorized in
59	paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be given to commodities
60	grown, processed or manufactured within this state whenever
61	purchases are made without competitive bids, and when practical
62	the Department of Finance and Administration may by regulation
63	establish reasonable preferential policies for other commodities,
64	giving preference to resident suppliers of this state.
65	(c) A nonresident bidder domiciled in a state having
66	laws granting preference to resident bidders shall be awarded
67	Mississippi contracts only on the same basis as the nonresident
68	bidder's state awards contracts to Mississippi residents bidding
69	under similar circumstances. Resident bidders actually domiciled
70	in Mississippi, whether corporate, individuals, or partnerships,
71	are to be granted preference over nonresidents in awarding of
72	contracts in the same manner and to the same extent as provided by

- 73 the laws of the state of domicile of the nonresident. When a
- 74 nonresident contractor submits a bid for a contract, he shall
- 75 attach to the bid a copy of his resident state's current law
- 76 pertaining to his state's treatment of nonresident bidders.
- 77 (2) Any foreign manufacturing company with a factory in the
- 78 state and with over fifty (50) employees working in the state
- 79 shall have preference over any other foreign company where both
- 80 price and quality are the same, regardless of where the product is
- 81 manufactured.
- 82 (3) On or before January 1, 1991, the Department of Finance
- 83 and Administration shall adopt bid and product specifications to
- 84 be utilized by all state agencies that encourage the procurement
- 85 of commodities made from recovered materials. Preference in
- 86 awarding contracts for commodities shall be given to commodities
- 87 offered at a competitive price.
- 88 (4) Each state agency is required to procure products made
- 89 from recovered materials when those products are available at a
- 90 competitive price. For purposes of this subsection, "competitive
- 91 price" means a price not greater than ten percent (10%) above the
- 92 lowest and best bidder. A decision not to procure products made
- 93 from recovered materials must be based on a determination that
- 94 such procurement:
- 95 (a) Is not available within a reasonable period of
- 96 time; or

- (c) Is not available at a competitive price.
- 100 (5) Whenever economically feasible, each state agency is
 101 required to purchase products manufactured or sold by the
 102 Mississippi Industries for the Blind.
- SECTION 3. Section 31-7-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- 105 31-7-47. In the letting of public contracts, whenever all 106 things stated in the bids are substantially equal with regard to quality and service but differ only with respect to price, 107 108 preference shall be given to resident contractors * * * if the 109 aggregate of the prices in bids received from the resident 110 contractors is not more than two percent (2%) greater than the 111 aggregate of the prices in bids received from nonresident 112 contractors. A nonresident bidder domiciled in a state, city, 113 county, parish, province, nation or political subdivision having laws granting preference to local contractors shall be awarded 114 115 Mississippi public contracts only on the same basis as the 116 nonresident bidder's state, city, county, parish, province, nation 117 or political subdivision awards contracts to Mississippi 118 contractors bidding under similar circumstances. Resident 119 contractors actually domiciled in Mississippi, be they corporate,

individuals or partnerships, are to be granted preference over

nonresidents in awarding of contracts in the same manner and to

122	the same extent as provided by the laws of the state, city,
123	county, parish, province, nation or political subdivision of
124	domicile of the nonresident. When a nonresident contractor
125	submits a bid for a contract, he shall attach to the bid a copy of
126	his resident state's current law pertaining to his state's
127	treatment of nonresident bidders.
128	SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
129	and after July 1, 2019.
