1 2 3 4 5 6 7	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 77-3-803, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE DEFINITIONS OF CERTAIN TERMS AS USED IN THE CALLER ID ANTI-SPOOFING ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 77-3-805, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE PROHIBITION AGAINST CALLER IDENTIFICATION SPOOFING; TO CREATE NEW SECTION 77-3-811, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CREATE A PRIVATE RIGHT OF ACTION FOR DAMAGES AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
9	SECTION 1. Section 77-3-803, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
10	amended as follows:
11	77-3-803. As used in this article:
12	(a) <b>* * *</b> <u>"Automatic number identification" means a</u>
13	system that identifies the billing account for a call and includes
14	an enhanced 911 service capability that enables the automatic
15	display of the ten-digit number used to place a 911 call from a
16	wire line, wireless, interconnected VoIP or nontraditional
17	telephone service.
18	(b) <b>* * *</b> <u>"Caller identification information" means</u>
19	information provided by a caller identification service regarding
20	the telephone number, or other origination information, of a call
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21	or facsimile transmission made using a telecommunications service
22	or an interconnected VoIP service, or of a text message sent using
23	a text-messaging service.
24	(c) <b>* * *</b> <u>"Caller identification service" means any</u>
25	service or device designed to provide the user of the service or
26	device with the telephone number of, or other information
27	regarding the origination of, a call made using a
28	telecommunications service or interconnected VoIP service. The
29	term includes automatic number identification services.
30	(d) <b>* * *</b> <u>"Interconnected VoIP service" means an</u>
31	interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol service that:
32	(i) Enables real-time, two-way voice
33	communications;
34	(ii) Requires a broadband internet connection from
35	the user's location;
36	(iii) Requires internet protocol-compatible
37	customer premises equipment; and
38	(iv) Permits users generally to receive calls that
39	originate on the public switched telephone network and to
40	terminate calls to the public switched telephone network.
41	(e) <b>* * *</b> "Place of primary use" means the street
42	address where a subscriber's use of a telecommunications service
43	or interconnected VoIP service primarily occurs, which shall be:
44	(i) The residential street address or the primary
45	business street address of the subscriber or, in the case of a
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46	subscriber of interconnected VoIP service, the subscriber's
47	registered location; and
48	(ii) Within the licensed service area of the
49	provider.
50	(f) "Provider" means a person or entity that offers
51	telecommunications service or interconnected VoIP service.
52	(g) "Registered location" means the most recent
53	information obtained by an interconnected VoIP service provider
54	that identifies the physical location of an end user.
55	(h) "Subscriber" means a person:
56	(i) Who subscribes to a caller identification
57	service in connection with a telecommunications service or an
58	interconnected VoIP service; and
59	(ii) Whose place of primary use for the service
60	described in paragraph (h)(i) is located in Mississippi.
61	(i) "Telecommunications service" means the offering of
62	telecommunications for a fee directly to the public, or to classes
63	of users so as to be effectively available directly to the public,
64	regardless of the facilities used.
65	SECTION 2. Section 77-3-805, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
66	amended as follows:
67	77-3-805. <b>* * *</b> <u>Except as provided in Section 77-3-807,</u> a
68	person * * * shall not, in connection with any telecommunications
69	service or interconnected VOIP service, knowingly and with the
70	intent to <b>* * *</b> defraud or <b>* * *</b> <u>cause harm to another person or</u>
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71 to wrongfully obtain anything of value, cause any caller

72 identification service to transmit misleading or inaccurate caller

73 identification information to a subscriber.

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75 SECTION 3. The following shall be codified as Section 76 77-3-811, Mississippi Code of 1972:

77 <u>77-3-811.</u> (1) Except as provided in Section 77-3-807 and 78 subsection (3) of this section, any person who is aggrieved by a 79 violation of this article may bring an action for the recovery of 80 the person's actual damages, <u>punitive damages</u>, court costs and 81 attorney's fees, against any person:

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(a) Responsible for; or

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(b) Who knowingly participated in;

the violation. An action under this subsection may be brought in the circuit court of the aggrieved person's county of residence or principal place of business in Mississippi.

(2) Upon petition by any person that another person has violated this article, the circuit court of the petitioner's county of residence or principal place of business in Mississippi may enjoin the respondent from further violations. The injunctive relief available under this subsection is in addition to any damages to which a person may be entitled under subsection (1) of this section.
