SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 562

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTIONS
- 2 34, 35, 116, 128, 133 AND 134 OF THE MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF
- 3 1890 TO CHANGE THE TERMS OF OFFICE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE
- 4 LEGISLATURE, THE GOVERNOR, THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, THE SECRETARY
- 5 OF STATE, THE STATE TREASURER AND THE STATE AUDITOR FROM FOUR
- 6 YEARS TO ONE YEAR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF
- 8 MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi
- 9 Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the
- 10 state:
- 11 Amend Section 34, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 12 as follows:
- 13 Section 34. The House of Representatives shall consist of
- 14 members chosen * * * annually by the qualified electors of the
- 15 several counties and representative districts.
- Amend Section 35, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 17 as follows:
- 18 Section 35. The Senate shall consist of members chosen * * *
- 19 annually by the qualified electors of the several districts.

- 20 Amend Section 116, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 21 as follows:
- 22 Section 116. The chief executive power of this state shall
- 23 be vested in a Governor, who shall hold his office for \star \star \star one
- 24 (1) year and be elected annually. Any person elected to the
- 25 Office of Governor shall be eliqible to succeed himself in office.
- 26 However, no person shall be elected to the Office of Governor more
- 27 than twice * * * .
- 28 Amend Section 128, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 29 as follows:
- 30 Section 128. There shall be a Lieutenant Governor who shall
- 31 be elected \star \star \star annually, and who shall possess the same
- 32 qualifications as required of the Governor. Any person elected to
- 33 the Office of Lieutenant Governor shall be eligible to succeed
- 34 himself in office, but no person who has been elected to the
- 35 Office of Lieutenant Governor for two (2) successive terms shall
- 36 be eligible to hold that office until one (1) term has intervened.
- 37 Amend Section 133, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 38 as follows:
- 39 Section 133. There shall be a Secretary of State, who shall
- 40 be elected * * * annually. He shall be at least twenty-five (25)
- 41 years of age, a citizen of the state five (5) years next preceding
- 42 the day of his election, and he shall continue in office during
- 43 the term of \star \star one (1) year, and shall be keeper of the
- 44 capitol; he shall keep a correct register of all official acts and

- 45 proceedings of the Governor; and shall, when required, lay the
- 46 same, and all papers, minutes, and vouchers relative thereto,
- 47 before the Legislature, and he shall perform such other duties as
- 48 may be required of him by law. He shall receive such compensation
- 49 as shall be prescribed.
- 50 Amend Section 134, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 51 as follows:
- 52 Section 134. A State Treasurer and an Auditor of Public
- 53 Accounts shall be elected \star \star annually, who shall hold their
- office for the term of * * one (1) year and shall possess the
- 55 same qualifications as required for the Secretary of State. They
- 56 shall receive such compensation as may be provided by law.
- 57 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be
- 58 submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at
- 59 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday
- of November 2019, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution
- 61 and by general law.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed
- 63 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed
- 64 constitutional amendment changes the terms of office of the
- 65 members of the Legislature, the Governor and the constitutional
- 66 officers of the Executive Branch of Mississippi government from
- 67 four (4) to one (1) year."
