## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 626

- 1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE MISSISSIPPI CHAPTERS 2 OF THE AMERICAN LEGION ORGANIZATION ON THE COMMEMORATION OF ITS
- 3 100TH ANNIVERSARY.
- 4 WHEREAS, the United States Congress chartered the American
- Legion on September 16, 1919. 2019 is the 100th Anniversary of 5
- this historic and vital service organization; and 6
- 7 WHEREAS, to mark this momentous occasion, the Mississippi
- Legislature is joining the celebration of the service and 8
- 9 dedication of the men and women who served in the United States
- Armed Forces and then joined the organization to serve veterans 10
- 11 and their families as well as advocate for their rights and
- 12 well-being; and
- 13 WHEREAS, for God and Country, the American Legion has the
- 14 following purposes:
- To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States 15
- 16 of America;
- To maintain law and order; 17
- To foster and perpetuate a 100% Americanism; 18

- To preserve the memories and incidents of our associations
- 20 in the Great Wars;
- To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the
- 22 community, state and nation;
- To combat the autocracy of both the classes and the
- 24 masses;
- To make right the master of might;
- To promote peace and goodwill on earth;
- To safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of
- 28 justice, freedom and democracy;
- To consecrate and sanctify our comradeship by our devotion
- 30 to mutual helpfulness; and
- 31 WHEREAS, the American Legion organization has played a major
- 32 role in the drafting and passing of the Servicemen's Readjustment
- 33 Act of 1944, which is also called the "G.I. Bill." In addition to
- 34 organizing commemorative events, members provide assistance at
- 35 Veterans' hospitals and clinics. The American Legion is active in
- 36 issue-oriented U.S. politics. Its primary political activity is
- 37 lobbying on behalf of the interests of veterans and service
- 38 members, including support for benefits such as pensions,
- 39 improvement of the Veterans Health Administration, and access to
- 40 benefits and improved services; and
- 41 WHEREAS, the organization has also historically promoted
- 42 "Americanism," which is the time-honored view that there is more
- 43 that unites us than divides us and that despite our differences in

- 44 background, we all hold dear the ideals that founded the United
- 45 States; and
- 46 WHEREAS, the American Legion organization was founded on
- 47 March 15, 1919, at the American Club in Paris by members of the
- 48 American Expeditionary Forces who served there in World War I. It
- 49 is a U.S. war veterans service organization with membership open
- 50 to those who served at least one day of active duty during World
- 51 War I or II, Korean War, Vietnam War or served during actions in
- 52 Lebanon, Grenada and Panama. People who served after August 2,
- 53 1990, are also eligible for membership. Members must have an
- 54 honorable discharge or still be serving. The American Legion's
- 55 headquarters is in Indianapolis, Indiana. It is made up of
- 56 regional departments and local posts both in the United States and
- 57 a few locations abroad; and
- 58 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we join in the
- 59 celebration which honors our Mississippi veterans whose selfless
- 60 service is a debt we cannot repay to them and their families:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 62 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 63 we do hereby recognize the Mississippi Chapters of the American
- 64 Legion organization on the commemoration of its 100th Anniversary.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 66 the Mississippi Department of Veterans and Military Affairs for
- 67 proper distribution to the local chapters of the American Legion
- 68 and made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
