## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 641

1 2 3 4	COMMISSIONER, FORMER MISSISSIPPI SENATOR AND REPRESENTATIVE, DICK									
5	WHEREAS, Mississippi Central District Transportation									
6	Commissioner, former State Senator and Representative, Dick Hall									
7	from Jackson, Mississippi, has announced that he will not seek									
8	reelection in 2019. Commissioner Hall is completing 21 years on									
9	the three-member transportation regulatory body. Mississippians									
10	owe Commissioner Hall a debt of gratitude for his service and he									
11	is leaving a lasting legacy to the history of our state; and									
12	WHEREAS, Mississippi Transportation Commissioner Dick Hall is									
13	a lifelong Mississippian whose family helped to settle the									
14	Mississippi Territory. After earning a Bachelor's Degree from									
15	Mississippi State University, he served as an Officer in the									
16	United States Army Field Artillery; and									
17	WHEREAS, prior to being elected Commissioner, Hall served 24									
18	years in the Mississippi Legislature. His experience in the									
19	Mississippi Legislature was extremely broad-based, serving three

- 20 terms as a Representative and three terms as a Senator. In both
- 21 the House and the Senate, Hall chaired the Environment Committees
- 22 of each chamber, respectively. Other chairmanships included the
- 23 Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee and the Senate
- 24 Appropriations Committee, the first Republican to occupy this
- 25 position in over 100 years; and
- 26 WHEREAS, during his time in the Legislature, Dick Hall
- 27 authored and co-authored many pieces of legislation. Some of his
- 28 greatest accomplishments were the passing of the Education Reform
- 29 Act of 1982, the 1987 Four-Lane Highway Program, the Budget Reform
- 30 Act of 1992, and the Mental Health Reform Act of 1997; and
- 31 WHEREAS, Dick Hall was appointed Central District
- 32 Transportation Commissioner by Governor Kirk Fordice in 1999 to
- 33 fill an unexpired term. He is now in his fifth full term as
- 34 Central District Transportation Commissioner, currently serving as
- 35 Chairman of the three-member Commission. The Central District
- 36 covers 22 counties with a population of roughly one million; and
- 37 WHEREAS, during Hall's 21 years as Commissioner, he has seen
- 38 many accomplishments across the Central District. Commissioner
- 39 Hall is known for saying, "We're not just building a
- 40 transportation system. We're building an economy. MDOT allocates
- 41 approximately \$150 Million annually to pavement projects, but
- 42 Commissioner Hall has suggested that an estimated \$1 Billion would
- 43 be needed to repair pavement to an acceptable condition and \$400
- 44 Million would be needed annually to maintain pavement in good

- 45 condition." In 1987, an election year, business leaders
- 46 championed a major Four-Lane Highway Program and higher gas taxes
- 47 to fund the program, passed with support of three-term veteran
- 48 Representative Dick Hall. Despite the bad political timing, he
- 49 joined other conservative legislators behind the leadership of
- 50 Representative John Pennebaker to not only pass the program, but
- 51 also to override a veto from Governor Bill Allain; and
- 52 WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi vests oversight of its
- 53 transportation resources and operations in a three-member-elected
- 54 Mississippi Transportation Commission representing three
- 55 geographic areas in the state as defined by the Supreme Court
- 56 Districts: Northern, Central and Southern. The commissioners
- 57 represent the electorate and have the authority and responsibility
- 58 for the supervision of all modes of transportation in the state
- 59 dealing with aeronautics, highways, ports, public transit and
- 60 railroads. In accordance with state law, the commission is
- 61 responsible for planning, developing and coordinating a
- 62 comprehensive, balanced intermodal transportation policy for the
- 63 state. The commission membership appointed its Chairman, Dick
- 64 Hall. The commission appoints an Executive Director of the
- 65 Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) to carry out the
- 66 day-to-day policies and procedures of the agency; and
- 67 WHEREAS, despite challenges, Dick Hall has pointed out that
- 68 Mississippi has the eighth most efficient Department of
- 69 Transportation among all states, and he commends a substantial

- 70 number of highway and bridge projects that are in process or
- 71 complete across the Central Transportation District, such as the
- 72 addition of lanes on I-55 through portions of Madison and Hinds
- 73 Counties; and
- 74 WHEREAS, Commissioner Hall has served as President of the
- 75 Mississippi Republican-Elected Officials Association and as State
- 76 Chairman of the United Republican Fund. Other honors have
- 77 included being the first recipient of the Hugh L. White Free
- 78 Enterprise Award and Conservation Legislator of the Year, first
- 79 recipient of the Friend of Education Award, Alumnus of the Year by
- 80 the Mid-Mississippi Chapter of The Mississippi State University
- 81 Alumni Association, was honored with the Owen Cooper Memorial
- 82 Award by the Mississippi Transportation Institute (MTI) at the
- 83 Owen Cooper Award Luncheon during the 2016 MTI Conference held at
- 84 the Jackson Convention Center, and won National Significant Sigma
- 85 Chi of Gamma Upsilon Chapter in 2013. He is a member of the
- 86 Multi-State I-69 Coalition and was awarded the National
- 87 Significant Sigma Chi Award. His civic and other memberships
- 88 include: YMCA; the Mississippi Symphony; March of Dimes;
- 89 Mississippi Museum of Natural Science Foundation; and the Jackson
- 90 Touchdown Club; American Health Works Association; Mississippi
- 91 Wildlife Federation; National Association of Republican
- 92 Legislators; and Sigma Chi; and
- 93 WHEREAS, an Elder and former Deacon in the Presbyterian
- 94 Church, Dick Hall and his wife, Jennifer, live in the Brandon

- 96 Church. He is the father of three sons, one stepson and one
- 97 stepdaughter, and four grandchildren who have supported him in all
- 98 of his endeavors. He is active in his community, serving on
- 99 various boards of directors and volunteering his time for
- 100 charitable endeavors; and
- 101 WHEREAS, while serving in the Legislature, Senator Hall
- 102 enlightened debates with his intelligent perspective, and garnered
- 103 unparalleled respect from both sides of the aisle; and
- 104 WHEREAS, we pay tribute and cherish fondly the service and
- 105 friendship of our former colleague Dick Hall, and recognize his
- 106 legacy of infrastructure accountability for this great state that
- 107 he loved and served:
- 108 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 109 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 110 we do hereby commend the public career and recognize the legacy of
- 111 Central District Transportation Commissioner, former Mississippi
- 112 Senator and Representative Dick Hall, of Brandon, Mississippi, and
- 113 wish him and his family success in their future endeavors.

- 116 Mississippi Transportation Commission, the Speaker of the House of
