

REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3019: Appropriation; Public Safety, Department of.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4 **SECTION 1.** The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State
6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the expenses of
7 the Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year beginning
8 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.....\$ 96,145,158.00.

9 **SECTION 2.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
10 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
11 to the credit of the Department of Public Safety for the purpose
12 of defraying the expenses incurred in the operation of the various
13 divisions of the department for the fiscal year beginning
14 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.....\$ 112,896,442.00.

15 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
16 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall

18 expenditure and authorized positions:

124 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
125 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
126 appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2021 do not
127 exceed Fiscal Year 2020 funds appropriated for that purpose,
128 unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
129 2020 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
130 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
131 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
132 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
133 provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
134 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
135 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2020
136 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
137 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
138 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
139 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
140 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
141 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2020 "Personal Services"



142 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
143 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
144 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
145 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

146 Funds are provided herein for all full-time employees to
147 receive up to a Three Percent (3%) pay increase to the realignment
148 component of the Variable Compensation Plan, excluding head of
149 agencies, board members and commission members.

150 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
151 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
152 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
153 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
154 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
155 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
156 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
157 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
158 appropriated level.

159 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
160 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
161 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
162 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

163 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
164 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
165 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
166 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.



167 **SECTION 4.** The Commissioner of Public Safety may, on a
168 case-by-case basis, within funds available, recommend that
169 corrective salary adjustments be made to the compensation of
170 employees of the Department of Public Safety where an inequity was
171 created between employees of equivalent capacity by previous
172 application of the agency appropriation acts. Any such corrective
173 salary adjustment plan must have prior approval by the State
174 Personnel Board. Such adjustments will not be retroactive.

175 Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe Benefits major
176 object of expenditure may be used to purchase accumulated
177 compensatory time within funds available.

178 **SECTION 5.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
179 local governments pay for part of the computer cost of the
180 Mississippi Justice Information Center by maintaining their
181 contribution to the Department of Public Safety.

182 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
183 Department of Public Safety designate certain employees to aid the
184 Office of Forensics Laboratories in the billing and collecting of
185 all fees charged for services rendered by the Office of Forensics
186 Laboratories.

187 **SECTION 7.** No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be
188 transferred to, expended by, or used, directly or indirectly, for
189 the benefit of any public relations, publicity or publication
190 activities of any other state agency, department or officer, nor
191 shall any personnel paid with funds appropriated herein be



192 transferred or assigned to any other state agency, department or
193 officer for public relations, publicity, or publication activities
194 of such office.

195 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
196 Department of Public Safety shall not issue citations for
197 violations of speed limits on a quota basis. No funds expended
198 under this act shall be used for such quota-based citations for
199 violations of speed limits.

200 **SECTION 9.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
201 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
202 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
203 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
204 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
205 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
206 performance measures provided below:

351 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
352 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
353 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
354 Committee for Fiscal Year 2021.

355 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that all
356 divisions within the Mississippi Department of Public Safety shall
357 maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the
358 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
359 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
360 maintained for Fiscal Year 2019. It is further the intention of
361 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
362 2021 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
363 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
364 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2020 budget request
365 process.



366 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
367 of Section 2, funds may be expended to defray the costs of
368 clothing for sworn nonuniform law enforcement officers in an
369 amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually per
370 officer.

371 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
372 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
373 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
374 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
375 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
376 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
377 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
378 made without competitive bids.

379 **SECTION 13.** The department is authorized to expend available
380 funds on technology or equipment upgrades or replacements when it
381 will generate savings through efficiency or when the savings
382 generated from such upgrades or replacements exceed expenditures
383 thereof.

384 **SECTION 14.** Of the funds provided herein, and in addition to
385 the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) authorized in Section 45-3-7,
386 Mississippi Code of 1972, Department of Public Safety Officers who
387 are licensed commercial pilots shall receive an additional Nine
388 Hundred Dollars (\$900.00), for a total of One Thousand Dollars
389 (\$1,000.00), additional compensation for such service.



390 **SECTION 15.** It is the direction of the Legislature that all
391 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) nonexempt sworn officers of the
392 Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol who are working one hundred
393 seventy-one (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day work cycle be
394 compensated based on the annual salary established by the State
395 Personnel Board for a one-hundred-sixty-hour per month schedule
396 divided by two thousand eighty-seven and one hundred forty-three
397 one thousandths (2,087.143), for an hourly rate, to be multiplied
398 by two thousand two hundred twenty-three (2,223) or one hundred
399 seventy-one (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day work cycle for a new
400 annual salary. All hours worked over one hundred seventy-one
401 (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day schedule shall be governed by
402 the FLSA or other special compensation plan. All realignments
403 after July 1, 2010, shall be calculated using this formula. This
404 section shall be known as the "David R. Huggins Act."

405 **SECTION 16.** Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
406 Four Hundred Ninety-five Thousand One Hundred Ninety Dollars
407 (\$495,190.00) is appropriated out of any funds in the State
408 Treasury to the credit of the Department of Public Safety for the
409 purposes of paying for eleven (11) hours of compensatory time at
410 an hourly rate based on two thousand eighty-seven and one hundred
411 forty-three one thousandths (2,087.143) hours per year for sworn
412 officers who hold the rank of Lieutenant and above. The funds
413 provided in this section to pay for the eleven (11) hours



414 authorized in this section shall be expended only for this
415 purpose.

416 **SECTION 17.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
417 Department of Public Safety shall provide an annual report to the
418 Mississippi Legislature detailing any elected official or any
419 other person who is not an employee of the Department of Public
420 Safety who was transported in Highway Patrol aircraft during the
421 fiscal year. The report shall be provided to each member of the
422 Mississippi Legislature on or before January 15, 2020.

423 **SECTION 18.** The Commissioner of Public Safety shall have the
424 authority to transfer any funds from any division within the
425 Department of Public Safety to any other division of the
426 Department of Public Safety Special Funds, including, but not
427 limited to, Funds 3711, 371C, 371E, 3713, 3714, 3715, 3740, 3741,
428 3742, 3744, 3747 and 3718, not to exceed Twenty Million Dollars
429 (\$20,000,000.00) collectively during Fiscal Year 2020. However,
430 none of the funds appropriated by this act shall be expended
431 unless the Department of Public Safety provides prior written
432 notification of any transfer of funds provided in this section.

433 **SECTION 19.** The Bureau of Narcotics is authorized to expend
434 a sum, not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00)
435 from account No. 3371800000, for purposes of effectuating the
436 provisions of House Bill 812, 2017 Regular Session, Section 1.
437 Expenditures authorized by this section may include, but not be
438 limited to, costs associated with contracting with one or more



439 vendors, contractors or other persons or entities to create,
 440 operate and maintain the forfeiture website and to provide
 441 continuing support in relation thereto. In the event, an amount
 442 less than Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) is required to
 443 effectuate the purposes of this section, the Bureau is authorized
 444 to expend the remainder of such authorized funds for the purchase
 445 of commodities, vehicles and/or other equipment necessary in the
 446 furtherance of the needs of the Bureau.

447 **SECTION 20.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is
 448 the intention of the Legislature that Four Million Three Hundred
 449 Forty-six Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$4,346,890.00)
 450 may be allocated for the programs supported from General Fund
 451 court assessments as follows:

466 **SECTION 21.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
467 Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics, Mississippi Department of Public
468 Safety, shall have the authority to receive, budget and expend
469 special funds from the Drug Evidence Disposition Funds
470 (3372000000), not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
471 (\$500,000.00).

472 **SECTION 22.** Of the funds appropriated by this act, and
473 contingent upon the passage of House Bill No 571, 2019 Regular
474 Session, Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is
475 provided for the duties and operations of a Statewide Human
476 Trafficking Coordinator and a data analyst within the Bureau of
477 Investigation in the Department of Public Safety, who shall
478 coordinate all statewide activities and work with the Department
479 of Child Protection Services for all victims recovered.

480 **SECTION 23.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Four
481 Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,500,000.00), or so much
482 thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury
483 to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section
484 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as
485 determined by the Treasurer's Office. These are provided for the
486 purpose of conducting a Highway Patrol Trooper School.

487 **SECTION 24.** Of the funds appropriated by this act, it is the
488 intention of the Legislature that Three Million Three Hundred



489 Thousand Dollars (\$3,300,000.00) is provided as an increase over
490 and above the Fiscal Year 2019 appropriation level of funding for
491 the Driver Services Division to provide additional support for the
492 duties and operations of the Commercial Driver's License (CDL) and
493 other Driver Services operations. Of this amount, One Million
494 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) is derived from the
495 Capital Expense Fund.

496 **SECTION 25.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
497 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
498 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
499 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
500 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
501 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

502 **SECTION 26.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
503 and after July 1, 2019.

**Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and
inserting in lieu thereof the following:**

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE
