It is the intention of the Legislature that none 510 of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act for the Mississippi Home Corporation (MHC) shall be expended for the 511 512 purpose of making a payment of any kind or for any purpose, 513 directly or indirectly, to a member of the State of Mississippi 514 Legislature, state official, MHC board member, or person who has 515 been a member of the MHC within the last year. 516 SECTION 28. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Ten 517 Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$10,500,000.00) shall be

- 521 SECTION 29. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 522 of this act, the department is authorized to enter into a contract 523 for use by state agencies to establish a pilot program for Fleet 524 Management Services, to include vehicle leasing and disposal, 525 without being subject to the provisions of law otherwise 526 applicable to fleet management.
- 527 SECTION 30. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 528 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 529 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 530 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 531 532 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision. 533

534 SECTION 31. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 535 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 536 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 537 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 538 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 539 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 540 SECTION 32. This act shall take effect and be in force from 541 and after July 1, 2019.
