Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

Senate Bill No. 2524

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

15 SECTION 1. Section 37-144-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 16 amended as follows:

17 37-144-3. (1) The Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship 18 Program shall be administered by a commission to be known as the 19 "Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Commission." The 20 commission shall be directed by a board composed of the following 21 members:

(a) Two (2) generalist physicians appointed by and from
 the membership of the Mississippi State Medical Association, the

24 term of which shall be three (3) years and may be reappointed for 25 one (1) additional term;

(b) One (1) generalist physician appointed by and from the membership of each of the following organizations, the term of which shall be three (3) years and may be reappointed for one (1) additional term:

30 (i) Mississippi Academy of Family Physicians;
31 (ii) Mississippi Chapter, American College of
32 Physicians;
33 (iii) Mississippi Chapter, American Academy of
34 Pediatrics;
35 (iv) Mississippi Chapter, American College of

36 OB-GYN;

37 Mississippi Medical and Surgical Association; (V) 38 (vi) Mississippi Osteopathic Association; 39 (C) Two (2) designees of the Dean of the University of 40 Mississippi School of Medicine whose terms are at the discretion of the dean, at least one (1) of whom is a member of the 41 42 University of Mississippi School of Medicine Admissions Committee; 43 Two (2) medical students, one (1) of whom shall be (d) 44 selected yearly through a process developed by the Dean of the 45 School of Medicine in consultation with the Chairs of the Departments of Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, OB-GYN and 46

47 Pediatrics, and one (1) of whom shall be nominated for a one-year48 term by the Mississippi Chapter of the Student National Medical

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49 Association and approved by the Dean of the University of 50 Mississippi School of Medicine;

51 (e) A member of the Board of Trustees of State
52 Institutions of Higher Learning; * * *

(f) The Chair of the Department of Family Medicine at
the University of Mississippi School of Medicine * * *; and
(g) A licensed psychiatrist appointed by the

56 Mississippi Chapter of the American Psychiatric Association.

57 (2) The premedical advisors from the accredited four-year 58 colleges and universities in the state and the directors or 59 designees of the primary care generalist training programs in the 60 State of Mississippi shall comprise an advisory committee to the 61 commission to assist the commission in its administration of the 62 Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program.

(3) Vacancies on the commission must be filled in a mannerconsistent with the original appointments.

65 All appointments to the commission must be made no later (4) than September 1, * * * 2019. After the members are appointed, 66 67 the Chair of the Department of Family Medicine shall set a date 68 for the organizational meeting that is mutually acceptable to the 69 majority of the commission members. The organizational meeting 70 shall be for the purposes of organizing the commission and 71 establishing rules for transacting its business. A majority of 72 the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum at all commission meetings. An affirmative vote of a majority of the 73

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74 members present and voting shall be required in the adoption of 75 rules, reports and in any other actions taken by the commission. 76 At the organizational meeting, the commission shall elect a chair 77 and vice chair from the members appointed according to paragraphs 78 (a) through (d) of subsection (1). The chair shall serve for a 79 term of two (2) years, upon the expiration of which the vice chair 80 shall assume the office of chair.

81 (5) After the organizational meeting, the commission shall 82 hold no less than two (2) meetings annually.

(6) The commission may form an executive committee for the purpose of transacting business that must be conducted before the next regularly scheduled meeting of the commission. All actions taken by the executive committee must be ratified by the commission at its next regularly scheduled meeting.

88 (7) Members of the commission shall serve without 89 compensation but may be reimbursed, subject to the availability of 90 funding, for mileage and actual and necessary expenses incurred in 91 attending meetings of the commission.

92 (8) Funding for the establishment and continued operation of 93 the program and commission shall be appropriated out of any money 94 in the General Fund not already appropriated to the University of 95 Mississippi Medical Center.

96 SECTION 2. Section 37-144-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 97 amended as follows:

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98 37-144-5. The Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship
99 Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

100 (a) Developing the administrative policy for the
101 commission and the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship
102 Program;

(b) Promulgating rules and regulations, with the advice and consent of the University of Mississippi Medical Center, pertaining to the implementation and operation of the Rural Physicians Scholarship Program;

107 (C) Developing and implementing strategies and activities for the identification and recruitment of students and 108 109 for marketing the program and for the implementation of the 110 In developing these strategies, the board shall seek the program. input of various organizations and entities, including the 111 112 Mississippi State Medical Association, the Mississippi Academy of 113 Family Physicians, the Mississippi Chapters of the American 114 College of Physicians, the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American College of OB-GYN, the Mississippi Medical and Surgical 115 116 Association * * *, the Mississippi Osteopathic Medicine 117 Association and the American Psychiatric Association;

(d) Establishing a budget, with the advice and consent of the University of Mississippi Medical Center, to support the activities of the program and periodically reviewing and if appropriate, revising, the scholarship and other stipends offered through the program;

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(e) Advising the University of Mississippi Medical Center regarding hiring an executive director and support staff necessary for the commission's work. The commission shall nominate at least two (2) individuals to serve as executive director;

128 (f) Reviewing participants progress in the program and 129 mentoring students and physicians participating in the program;

(g) Developing and participating in programs that provide initial practice support in collaboration with other interested professional organizations;

(h) The commission shall have the authority through use of generally applicable definitions, to designate an area of the state as underserved or rural. The method by which these designations shall be made shall be contained in rules and regulations promulgated by the commission.

138 SECTION 3. Section 37-144-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 139 amended as follows:

37 - 144 - 7. (1) 140 The commission shall develop and implement 141 policies and procedures designed to recruit, identify and enroll 142 undergraduate students who demonstrate necessary interest, 143 commitment, aptitude and academic achievement to pursue careers as 144 family physicians or other generalist physicians in rural or 145 medically underserved areas of Mississippi, and to develop and 146 implement the programs designed to foster successful entry of participants into medical school, completion of medical school, 147

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enrollment into and completion of family medicine or other generalist residency, and establishment and maintenance of a career in family medicine or other generalist specialty in a rural or underserved area of Mississippi.

152 (2) The commission shall have the authority through use of 153 generally applicable definitions, to designate an area of the 154 state as underserved or rural.

The commission, in conjunction with the University of 155 (3) 156 Mississippi Medical Center, shall have the authority to provide 157 students selected for scholarship funding with faculty mentors and 158 other programs designed to enhance the students' likelihood of 159 admission to the medical school. The commission and the 160 University of Mississippi Medical Center will develop coursework 161 that will provide scholarship students with the skills necessary 162 for sustained and successful medical practice in rural 163 Mississippi.

164 (4) Each applicant for admission to the program must submit
165 an application to the commission that conforms to requirements
166 established by the commission.

167 (5) In selecting participants for the program, the board may 168 only accept an applicant if his or her academic record and other 169 characteristics, if given consideration by the University of 170 Mississippi School of Medicine Admissions Committee, would be 171 considered credible and competitive.

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172 (6) An applicant for the program may be admitted only upon a173 majority vote of the members of the commission.

174 (7) Not less than fifteen (15) students will be admitted to 175 the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program each year, 176 provided that there are fifteen (15) or more qualified applicants 177 for the program.

(8) Upon the funding of sixty-one (61) or more rural 178 179 physicians scholarships by the Legislature and recognizing the 180 importance of balancing the needs of comprehensive primary care along with a critical shortage of psychiatrists in Mississippi, 181 182 the commission may grant an exception for fourth-year medical or 183 osteopathic school (M4) students who demonstrate a desire to 184 practice psychiatry in rural Mississippi and who use a practice 185 model and enter the practice of medicine in a rural or underserved area in Mississippi, as defined by commission beginning for the M4 186 187 class of 2020. 188 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2019. 189

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
