AMEND after line 188 by inserting the following new sections and renumbering any succeeding section:

3 SECTION 7. Section 43-15-201, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 4 amended as follows:

43-15-201. (1) An emergency medical services provider,
without a court order, shall take possession of a child who
is * * <u>seven (7) days</u> old or younger if the child is voluntarily
delivered to the provider by the child's parent and the parent did
not express an intent to return for the child.

10 (2) The parent who surrenders the baby shall not be required 11 to provide any information pertaining to his or her identity, nor 12 shall the emergency medical services provider inquire as to same. 13 If the identity of the parent is known to the emergency medical

14 services provider, the emergency medical services provider shall 15 keep the identity confidential.

16 A female presenting herself to a hospital through the (3) emergency room or otherwise, who is subsequently admitted for 17 purposes of labor and delivery, does not give up the legal 18 19 protections or anonymity guaranteed under this section. If the 20 mother clearly expresses a desire to voluntarily surrender custody of the newborn after birth, the emergency medical services 21 22 provider can take possession of the child, without further action by the mother, as if the child had been presented to the emergency 23 24 medical services provider in the same manner outlined above in 25 subsection (1) of this section.

(a) If the mother expresses a desire to remain
anonymous, identifying information may be obtained for purposes of
securing payment of labor and delivery costs only. If the birth
mother is a minor, the hospital may use the identifying
information to secure payment through Medicaid, but shall not
notify the minor's parent or guardian without the minor's consent.

32 (b) The identity of the birth mother shall not be
33 placed on the birth certificate or disclosed to the Department of
34 Human Services.

35 (4) There is a presumption that by relinquishing a child in 36 accordance with this section, the parent consents to the 37 termination of his or her parental rights with respect to the

38 child. As such, the parent waives the right to notification 39 required by subsequent court proceedings.

40 (5) An emergency medical services provider who takes
41 possession of a child under this section shall perform any act
42 necessary to protect the physical health or safety of the child.

43 SECTION 8. Section 43-15-207, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 44 amended as follows:

45 43-15-207. For the purposes of this article, an emergency 46 medical services provider shall mean a licensed hospital, as 47 defined in Section 41-9-3, which operates an emergency 48 department * * *, an adoption agency duly licensed by the 49 Department of Human Services, or fire station or mobile ambulance 50 staffed with full-time firefighters, emergency medical technicians 51 or paramedics. An emergency medical services provider does not 52 include the offices, clinics, surgeries or treatment facilities of 53 private physicians or dentists. No individual licensed healthcare 54 provider, including physicians, dentists, nurses, physician assistants or other health professionals shall be deemed to be an 55 56 emergency medical services provider under this article unless such 57 individual voluntarily assumes responsibility for the custody of 58 the child.
