Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and 8 maintenance of the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending 9 10 June 30, 2020\$ 29,364,252.00. 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 12 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special 13 source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available 14 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi

- 15 Cooperative Extension Service for the fiscal year beginning
- 16 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.....\$ 14,603,305.00.
- 17 **SECTION 3.** No general funds authorized to be expended herein
- 18 shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds
- 19 which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions
- 20 of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 21 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 22 Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service provide programs in the
- 23 emphasis areas of Agriculture, Family and Consumer Education,
- 24 Natural Resources and Environment, 4-H, and Business and Community
- 25 Development in each county.
- 26 **SECTION 5.** No part of the funds appropriated or authorized
- 27 to be expended hereby shall be spent directly or indirectly for
- 28 payment of attorneys' fees for the services of any attorney who
- 29 was not employed by the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
- 30 pursuant to the express authorization of the Board of Trustees of
- 31 State Institutions of Higher Learning prior to performance of such
- 32 legal services.
- 33 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 34 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2021 shall be submitted to
- 35 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 36 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 37 during the Fiscal Year 2020 budget request process.
- 38 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that if
- 39 the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act are used directly

40	or indirectly to match or otherwise secure any federal grants,		
41	research grants or donations, such special source funds not		
42	classified as current restricted funds shall be added and		
43	accounted for under Section 2 of this act. Further, it is the		
44	intention of the Legislature that all such aforementioned special		
45	source funds be included in all reports and requests for the 2020		
46	Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature.		
47	SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Nine		
48	Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Two Hundred Forty-five Dollars		
49	(\$975,245.00) shall be derived from the Education Enhancement Fund		
50	from funds deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31,		
51	Mississippi Code of 1972.		
52	SECTION 9. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance		
53	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of		
54	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized		
55	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the		
56	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,		
57	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted		
58	performance measures provided below:

85	SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that			
86	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the			
87	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things			
88	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,			
89	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind			



- 90 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 91 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 92 made without competitive bids.
- 93 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 94 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 95 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 96 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 97 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 98 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 99 actions contrary to this provision.
- 100 **SECTION 12.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 101 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 102 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 103 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 104 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 105 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
- 106 **SECTION 13.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 107 and after July 1, 2019, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2019.
