Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1639

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be		
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General		
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the		
8	expenses of the Mississippi Department of Insurance for the fiscal		
9	year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020		
10	\$ 12,011,661.00.		
11	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of		
12	this act, the following positions are authorized:

14	Permanent: Full Time 139		
15	Part Time 0		
16	Time-Limited: Full Time 1		
17	Part Time 4		
18	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's		
19	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be		
20	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2021 do not		
21	exceed Fiscal Year 2020 funds appropriated for that purpose,		
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- 22 unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
- 23 2020 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
- 24 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
- 25 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
- 26 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
- 27 provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
- 28 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
- 29 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2020
- 30 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
- 31 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
- 32 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- 33 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 34 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 35 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2020 "Personal Services"
- 36 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 37 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 38 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 39 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 40 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 41 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 42 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 43 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 44 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 45 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 46 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

- 47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 48 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 49
- used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 50
- 51 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 52 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 53 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 54 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 55 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor. 56
- 57 SECTION 3. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 58 Mississippi Department of Insurance shall maintain complete
- 59 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 60 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
- in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 61
- 62 Year 2019. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
- 63 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2021 shall be
- submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 64
- 65 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 66 provided during the Fiscal Year 2020 budget request process.
- 67 SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 68
- the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 69
- 70 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 71 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

- 99 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 100 Section 1, Fifteen Thousand Seventy-nine Dollars (\$15,079.00) is
- 101 provided for the Mississippi Fire Personnel Minimum Standards and
- 102 Certification Board.
- 103 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 104 Section 1, funds in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars
- 105 (\$10,000.00) are provided and shall be expended to pay the annual
- 106 dues for the National Conference of Insurance Legislators.
- 107 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none
- 108 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members
- 109 of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate
- 110 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony
- 111 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public
- 112 announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening
- 113 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has
- 114 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or
- any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following
- 116 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the
- 117 Mississippi State Legislature."
- 118 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 119 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 120 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 121 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 122 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind

- 123 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 124 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 125 made without competitive bids.
- 126 **SECTION 9.** Within the limits of the funds available to the
- 127 Mississippi Insurance Department for such purpose, the
- 128 Commissioner of Insurance for the Mississippi Insurance Department
- 129 may grant a paid internship to students pursuing junior or senior
- 130 undergraduate level year coursework toward a bachelor's degree in
- 131 risk management insurance or graduate level coursework towards a
- 132 master's degree in business administration. Those applicants
- deemed qualified by the Mississippi Department of Insurance shall
- 134 receive funds that may be used to pay for tuition, books and
- 135 related fees to pursue their degree. It is the intent of the
- 136 Legislature that the paid internship program shall be used as
- 137 incentive for risk management insurance careers at the Mississippi
- 138 Insurance Department.
- 139 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Two
- 140 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided for the
- 141 State Fire Marshal's Office for fire safety prevention and
- 142 services, including, but not limited to, fire protection supplies
- 143 and materials, smoke alarms, and public service announcements
- 144 providing fire prevention information.
- 145 **SECTION 11.** In addition to all other sums herein
- 146 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 147 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
- 148 Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in

149 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a 150 manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office, to the Mississippi 151 Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Fund and/or the 152 Supplementary Rural Fire Truck Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.....\$ 153 3,000,000.00. 154 These funds are provided to the Department of Insurance for 155 the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Program created in 156 Section 17-23-1 and Section 17-23-11, Miss. Code of 1972. 157 SECTION 12. In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 158 159 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury 160 to the credit of the Propane Education and Research Program Fund, 161 for the purpose of research and development of more cost effective 162 uses of propane and on educational programs, safety programs, and 163 market development of propane for the fiscal year beginning July 164 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.....\$ 130,000.00 165 SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 166 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 167 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 168 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 169 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 170 SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from 171 172 and after July 1, 2019.
