Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1650

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
9	Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Governor's
10	Office - Division of Medicaid for the purpose of providing medical
11	assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law and defraying the
12	expenses of the administration of such law, as provided in Section
13	43-13-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year
14	beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020
15	\$ 859,283,104.00.
16	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
17	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
18	to the credit of the Medical Care Fund created by Section
19	43-13-143, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of providing
20	medical assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law for the
21	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020
22	\$ 389,186,040.00.

23 SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 24 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in 25 the State Treasury to the credit of the Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid which is comprised of special source 26 27 funds collected by or otherwise available to the Division, for the 28 purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi 29 Medicaid Law and defraying the expenses of the administration of 30 such law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending 31 June 30, 2020.....\$ 5,058,095,085.00.

Prior period recovery of funds may be maintained and expended by the division when the recovery is received or finalized. Any recoveries due to audits or third party recoveries may be used to offset the cost of such audits and third party recoveries and as such, the division may escalate Contractual Services as needed for these purposes.

38 SECTION 4. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 39 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Health Care Expendable Fund, for the purpose 40 41 of defraying the expenses of the Governor's Office - Division of 42 Medicaid for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending 43 June 30, 2020.....\$ 67,296,091.00. 44 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the following positions are authorized: 45 46 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: Full Time..... 997 47 Permanent: Part Time..... 48 2

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 51 52 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be 53 appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2021 do not 54 exceed Fiscal Year 2020 funds appropriated for that purpose, 55 unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 56 2020 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data 57 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel 58 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to 59 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 60 61 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 62 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2020 63 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the 64 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at 65 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 66 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 67 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2020 "Personal Services" 68 69 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 70 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 71 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 72 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 73 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with

74 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or

75 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 76 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 77 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 78 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 79 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 80 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 81 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

90 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 91 Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall maintain complete 92 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 93 94 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 95 Year 2019. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 96 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2021 shall be 97 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 98 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2020 budget request process with 99 the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) being separated 100 H. B. 1650 PAGE 4

101 from the Medical Services Program and submitted as a separate 102 program. In addition, the performance measures reported for the 103 Medical Services Program shall include an unduplicated case count 104 of individuals served by eligibility status, and the number and 105 the costs of emergency room visits.

SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2021.

182 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that 183 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 184 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 185 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 186 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 187 188 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 189 made without competitive bids.

190 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated herein, an amount not 191 to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is 192 provided to implement an Adult Foster Care program for Medicaid 193 recipients as authorized by Section 43-13-117, Mississippi Code of 194 1972.

195 The division shall provide statistical and SECTION 10. 196 financial reports on a monthly basis to the Legislative Budget 197 Office and the PEER Committee. These reports shall include, but 198 are not limited to, an accounting of all funds spent and 199 participant statistics medical program, the CHIP program, the 200 Dialysis Transportation program, and each of the Home and 201 Community Based Waiver programs, and an accounting of all funds 202 spent in the administrative program and any other information 203 requested by the Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee. H. B. 1650

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The Division of Medicaid shall implement the improvements to this report as outlined in Finding Number 25 of the February 21, 2017, Navigant report, titled Mississippi Operational and Performance Assessment of the Governor's Office, Division of Medicaid (DOM).

The Division of Medicaid shall perform its cash flow 208 209 projections on a predetermined monthly schedule and make this and 210 any other information requested available, upon request, to the Chair of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the House 211 212 Public Health and Human Services Committee, the House Medicaid 213 Committee, the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, the 214 Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee. A summary of 215 this cash flow projection shall also be presented in the report 216 referenced in the above paragraph.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the Division of Medicaid shall pay the maximum per diem rate allowed by federal law or regulation to providers of adult day services for each day of service provided to an eligible beneficiary. In order to receive this per diem rate of reimbursement, providers of adult day services shall participate in the Elderly and Disabled Waiver Program for Home and Community Based Services.

SECTION 12. In the division's Fiscal Year 2021 budget submission, all Medicaid 1915 (C) Home and Community Based Waivers shall be presented as a budget program separate from the Medical Services Program.

SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act in an amount not to exceed, Two Million Seven Hundred H. B. 1650 PAGE 9 230 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,750,000.00) is provided for the purpose 231 of funding a temporary program to provide nonemergency 232 transportation to locations for necessary dialysis services for 233 end-stage renal disease patients who are sixty-five (65) years of age or older or are disabled as determined under Section 234 235 1614(a)(3) of the federal Social Security Act, as amended, whose 236 income did not exceed one hundred thirty-five percent (135%) of 237 the nonfarm official poverty level as defined by the Office of 238 Management and Budget and whose eligibility was covered under the 239 former category of eligibility known as Poverty Level Aged and 240 Disabled (PLADS).

241 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 3, 242 Three Hundred Ninety-eight Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars 243 (\$398,550.00) General Funds and One Million One Hundred One Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,101,450.00) Special Funds 244 245 are provided for five (5) slots in the Assisted Living Waiver 246 program for persons with Traumatic Brain Injury and in need of 247 Cognitive Rehabilitation. The Division shall develop eligibility 248 criteria for these additional slots.

SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds appropriated in this act to the Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid for the Mississippi Coordinated Access Network (MS-CAN) program be used in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of the division. The division and the coordinated care organizations with which the division has contracted to conduct the MS-CAN program shall

256 establish baselines for the health-related outcome measurement for 257 each of the following health focus areas for presentation at the 258 Joint Legislative Budget Committee hearings for Fiscal Year 2020, 259 which will be used as the baseline levels for establishing targets 260 for improvements in quality of care performance measures for the 261 MS-CAN program in Fiscal Year 2020 and later fiscal years: 262 Health Focus Area Measurement 263 Blood sugar well controlled in Percentage of members with 264 people with diabetes HbAlc results less than or 265 equal to 8.0% 266 Asthma-related emergency room Percentage reduction in 267 (ER) visits asthma-related ER visits 268 Congestive heart failure (CHF) Percentage decrease in 269 CHF-Related hospital 270 readmissions 271 Obesity Percentage of persons age 272 eighteen and older classified 273 as having a documented Body 274 Mass Index (BMI) of 30.0 or 275 more regardless of sex 276 In addition, for comparison purposes, these same baselines 277 for the health-related outcome measurements shall be established 278 for similar Medicaid recipients who are not enrolled in the MS-CAN 279 It is the further intention of the Legislature that, for program. 280 the Fiscal Year 2020, the Division of Medicaid shall not restrict

281 HIV antiretroviral medications.

SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated herein, an amount not to exceed Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is provided for payments to certain eligible obstetricians and gynecologists for the provision of certain primary care services, as defined by the division, at up to one hundred percent (100%) of the Medicare Physician fee schedule.

288 SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated herein, Five Hundred 289 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be allocated to the Delta 290 Health Alliance for a Patient Centered Medical Model Home in 291 Leland, Mississippi.

292 SECTION 18. No funds appropriated by this act may be 293 expended until the Division of Medicaid provides for the 294 reimbursement of long acting reversible contraceptives (LARCs) 295 insertion at the time of delivery, outside of the current Medicaid 296 All Patient Refined-Diagnosis Related Group Version (APR-DRG) 297 payment methodology, to Medicaid Enrolled hospital providers, and 298 the Division of Medicaid considers the coverage of LARC insertion 299 at the time of delivery to be an add-on benefit, paid according to 300 a payment schedule developed by the Division, that is not included 301 in the APR-DRG reimbursement process.

302 SECTION 19. (1) Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 303 4, an amount not to exceed Three Million Nine Hundred Forty-five 304 Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-nine Dollars (\$3,945,889.00) shall 305 be provided for the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population Health 306 Demonstration Project, of which funds (a) Two Million Eight 307 Hundred Seventy-nine Thousand Fifty-one Dollars (\$2,879,051.00) H. B. 1650 PAGE 12 308 shall be used for the continuation of the existing program and 309 shall be transferred no later than July 31, 2019, and (b) One 310 Million Sixty-six Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars 311 (\$1,066,838.00) shall be used as state funds for the purposes of 312 drawing federal matching funds for expansion of the program.

313 (2) As conditions of receiving the funds appropriated in 314 Sections 1 and 4, (a) the Division of Medicaid shall attempt to 315 procure federal matching funds for all state support funds 316 appropriated to the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population Health 317 Demonstration Project, without delaying any payments authorized by 318 this section that are due on or before July 31, 2019, and (b) a 319 progress report on the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population 320 Health Demonstration Project shall be provided to the Chairmen of 321 the Senate and House Public Health Committees, Senate and House 322 Medicaid Committees and the Senate and House Appropriations 323 Committees on or before December 31, 2019.

324 SECTION 20. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 325 Governor's Office, Division of Medicaid and the Department of 326 Human Services shall work together to implement HB 1090 of the 327 2017 Regular Session, known as the "Medicaid and Human Services 328 Transparency and Fraud Prevention Act".

329 **SECTION 21.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 330 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 331 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 332 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

333 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 334 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 335 SECTION 22. This act shall take effect and be in force from 336 and after July 1, 2019.
