- AMEND by inserting the following section after line 9 and 2 renumbering:
- 3 SECTION *. Section 37-181-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 4 amended as follows:
- 5 37-181-5. (1) An eligible student shall qualify to
- 6 participate in the program if the parent signs an agreement
- 7 promising:
- 8 (a) To provide an organized, appropriate educational
- 9 program with measurable annual goals to their participating
- 10 student and, to the extent reasonably deemed appropriate by the
- 11 parent, to provide an education for the qualified student in at
- 12 least the subjects of reading, grammar, mathematics, social
- 13 studies and science;



- 14 (b) To document their participating student's
- 15 disability at intervals and in a manner required under subsection
- 16 (8) of this section;
- 17 (c) Not to enroll their participating student in a
- 18 public school and to acknowledge as part of the agreement that the
- 19 home school district has provided clear notice to the parent that
- 20 the participating student has no individual entitlement to a free
- 21 appropriate public education (FAPE) from their home school
- 22 district, including special education and related services, for as
- 23 long as the student is participating in the program;
- 24 (d) Not to file for their participating student a
- 25 certificate of enrollment indicating participation in a home
- 26 instruction program under Section 37-13-91, Mississippi Code of
- 27 1972; and
- 28 (e) Not to participate in the Mississippi Dyslexia
- 29 Therapy Scholarship for Students with Dyslexia Program or the
- 30 Mississippi Speech-Language Therapy Scholarship for Students with
- 31 Speech-Language Impairments Program while participating in the ESA
- 32 program.
- 33 (2) Parents shall use the funds deposited in a participating
- 34 student's ESA for any of the following qualifying expenses to
- 35 educate the student using any of the below methods or combination
- 36 of methods that meet the requirement in subsection (1)(a) of this
- 37 section:
- 38 (a) Tuition and/or fees at an eligible school;

- 39 (b) Textbooks; 40 Payment to a tutor; (C) Payment for purchase of curriculum, including any 41 (d) 42 supplemental materials required by the curriculum; 43 (e) Fees for transportation to and from an educational 44 service provider paid to a fee-for-service transportation provider; 45 Tuition and/or fees for online learning programs or 46 (f) 47 courses; Fees for nationally standardized norm-referenced 48 49 achievement tests, including alternate assessments; and fees for 50 Advanced Placement examinations or similar courses and any 51 examinations related to college or university admission; 52 Educational services or therapies from a licensed or certified practitioner or provider, including licensed or 53 54 certified paraprofessionals or educational aides; 55 Services provided by a public school, including (i) 56 individual classes and extracurricular programs; 57 Tuition and fees at a postsecondary institution; (🖯) 58 Textbooks related to coursework at a postsecondary (k) 59 institution; 60 Surety bond payments if required by the department; (1)
- No more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in annual 61 (m)
- 62 consumable school supplies necessary for educational services and
- therapies, daily classroom activities, and tutoring; 63

- 64 Computer hardware and software and other 65 technological devices if an eligible school, licensed or certified tutor, licensed or certified educational service practitioner or 66 67 provider, or licensed medical professional verifies in writing 68 that these items are essential for the student to meet annual, 69 measurable goals. Once a student is no longer eligible for the 70 program, computer hardware and software and other technological 71 devices purchased with ESA funds may be donated to a library or a 72 nonprofit organization with expertise and training in working with 73 parents to educate children with disabilities or a nonprofit 74 organization with expertise and training in working with disabled 75 adults.
- 76 Neither a participating student, nor anyone on the 77 student's behalf, may receive cash or cash-equivalent items, such 78 as gift cards or store credit, from any refunds or rebates from 79 any provider of services or products in this program. Any refunds 80 or rebates shall be credited directly to the participating student's ESA. The funds in an ESA may only be used for 81 82 education-related purposes. Eligible schools, postsecondary 83 institutions and educational service providers that serve 84 participating students shall provide parents with a receipt for 85 all qualifying expenses.
- 86 (4) Payment for educational services through an ESA shall 87 not preclude parents from paying for educational services using 88 non-ESA funds.

- (5) ESA funds may not be used to attend an eligible school
 that maintains its primary location in a state other than
 Mississippi unless that school is approved for the Educable Child
 Program; or unless the parent verifies in writing that their child
 cannot reasonably obtain appropriate special education and related
 services in Mississippi at a location within thirty (30) miles of
 their legal residence.
- For purposes of continuity of educational attainment, 96 97 students who enroll in the program shall remain eligible to receive quarterly ESA payments until the participating student 98 returns to a public school, completes high school, completes the 99 100 school year in which the student reaches the age of twenty-one 101 (21), or does not have eligibility verified by a parent as 102 required under subsection (8) of this section, whichever occurs 103 first.
- 104 (7) Any funds remaining in a student's Education Scholarship
 105 Account upon completion of high school shall be returned to the
 106 state's General Fund.
- 107 (8) Every three (3) years after initial enrollment in the
 108 program, a parent of a participating student, except a student
 109 diagnosed as being a person with a permanent disability, shall
 110 document that the student continues to be identified by the school
 111 district, a federal or state government agency, or a licensed
 112 physician or psychometrist as a child with a disability, as



- defined by the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 USCS Section 1401(3)).
- 115 (9) A participating student shall be allowed to return to
- 116 his home school district at any time after enrolling in the
- 117 program * * *. Upon a participating student's return to his home
- 118 school district, that student's Education Scholarship Account
- 119 shall be * * * transferred to the student's home school district.
- 120 (10) The department shall begin accepting applications for
- 121 the program on July 1, 2015.
- 122 FURTHER, AMEND the title on line 3:
- 123 TO AMEND SECTION 37-181-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE
- 124 THAT A PARTICIPATING STUDENT IN AN ESA PROGRAM MAY RETURN TO THE
- 125 HOME SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE ESA FUNDS SHALL FOLLOW THE STUDENT;
