HOUSE BILL NO. 415 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, AS

AMENDED BY HOUSE NO. 1063, 2020 REGULAR SESSION, TO AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE, RATHER THAN THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF ASSESSING OFFICERS, TO ISSUE 5 CERTIFICATES OF EDUCATIONAL RECOGNITION TO TAX ASSESSORS; TO 6 AUTHORIZE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO PAY THE SALARIES OF TAX 7 ASSESSORS AND COLLECTORS EVERY TWO WEEKS; TO AMEND SECTIONS 25-3-17, 25-3-19, 25-3-29 AND 25-3-36, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 8 9 TO AUTHORIZE SUCH COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO PAY EVERY TWO 10 WEEKS THE SALARIES OF COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEYS, BOARDS OF 11 SUPERVISORS, COUNTY AUDITORS, DEPUTY CHANCERY CLERKS, SHERIFFS, 12 CERTAIN DEPUTY SHERIFFS AND JUSTICE COURT JUDGES; AND FOR RELATED 13 PURPOSES. 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 25-3-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, as 15 16 amended by House Bill No. 1063, 2020 Regular Session, is amended 17 as follows: 25-3-3. (1) The term "total assessed valuation" as used in 18 19 this section only refers to the ad valorem assessment for the 20 county and, in addition, in counties where oil or gas is produced, 21 the actual value of oil at the point of production, as certified 22 to the counties by the Department of Revenue under the provisions

of Sections 27-25-501 through 27-25-525, and the actual value of

- 24 gas as certified by the Department of Revenue under the provisions
- 25 of Sections 27-25-701 through 27-25-723.
- 26 (2) The salary of assessors and collectors of the various
- 27 counties is fixed as full compensation for their services as
- 28 county assessors or tax collectors, or both if the office of
- 29 assessor has been combined with the office of tax collector. The
- 30 annual salary of each assessor or tax collector, or both if the
- 31 offices have been combined, shall be based upon the total assessed
- 32 valuation of his respective county for the preceding taxable year
- 33 in the following categories and for the following amounts:
- 34 (a) For counties having a total assessed valuation of
- 35 Three Billion Dollars (\$3,000,000,000.00) or more, a salary of
- 36 Seventy Thousand Five Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$70,560.00);
- 37 (b) For counties having a total assessed valuation of
- 38 at least Two Billion Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) but less than
- 39 Three Billion Dollars (\$3,000,000,000.00), a salary of Sixty-seven
- 40 Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$67,200.00);
- 41 (c) For counties having a total assessed valuation of
- 42 at least One Billion Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) but less than Two
- 43 Billion Dollars (\$2,000,000,000.00), a salary of Sixty-four
- 44 Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$64,575.00);
- 45 (d) For counties having a total assessed valuation of
- 46 at least Five Hundred Million Dollars (\$500,000,000.00) but less
- 47 than One Billion Dollars (\$1,000,000,000.00), a salary of
- 48 Sixty-one Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$61,425.00);

- 49 (e) For counties having a total assessed valuation of
- 50 at least Two Hundred Fifty Million Dollars (\$250,000,000.00) but
- 51 less than Five Hundred Million Dollars (\$500,000,000.00), a salary
- of Fifty-eight Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$58,800.00);
- (f) For counties having a total assessed valuation of
- 54 at least One Hundred Fifty Million Dollars (\$150,000,000.00) but
- less than Two Hundred Fifty Million Dollars (\$250,000,000.00), a
- 56 salary of Fifty-six Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$56,700.00);
- 57 (g) For counties having a total assessed valuation of
- 58 at least Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$75,000,000.00) but less
- 59 than One Hundred Fifty Million Dollars (\$150,000,000.00), a salary
- of Fifty-five Thousand One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars
- 61 (\$55,125.00);
- 62 (h) For counties having a total assessed valuation of
- 63 less than Seventy-five Million Dollars (\$75,000,000.00), a salary
- of Fifty Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-nine Dollars (\$50,929.00).
- 65 (3) In addition to all other compensation paid pursuant to
- 66 this section, the board of supervisors shall pay to a person
- 67 serving as both the tax assessor and tax collector in their county
- an additional Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per year.
- 69 (4) The annual salary established for assessors and tax
- 70 collectors shall not be reduced as a result of a reduction in
- 71 total assessed valuation. The salaries shall be increased as a
- 72 result of an increase in total assessed valuation.

73 In addition to all other compensation paid to assessors 74 and tax collectors in counties having two (2) judicial districts, 75 the board of supervisors shall pay such assessors and tax 76 collectors an additional Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 77 (\$3,500.00) per year. In addition to all other compensation paid 78 to assessors or tax collectors, in counties maintaining two (2) 79 full-time offices, the board of supervisors shall pay the assessor

or tax collector an additional Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars

- 82 In addition to all other compensation paid to assessors 83 and tax collectors, the board of supervisors of a county shall 84 allow for such assessor or tax collector, or both, to be paid 85 additional compensation when there is a contract between the 86 county and one or more municipalities providing that the assessor 87 or tax collector, or both, shall assess or collect taxes, or both, 88 for the municipality or municipalities; and such assessor or tax 89 collector, or both, shall be authorized to receive such additional compensation from the county and/or the municipality or 90 91 municipalities in any amount allowed by the county and/or the 92 municipality or municipalities for performing those services.
- 93 When any tax assessor holds a valid certificate of 94 educational recognition from the * * * Mississippi Cooperative 95 Extension Service or is a licensed appraiser under Section 96 73-34-1 et seq., he shall receive an additional One Thousand Five 97 Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) annually beginning the next fiscal

98 year after completion. When any tax assessor is a licensed state

99 certified Residential Appraiser (RA) or licensed state certified

100 Timberland Appraiser (TA) under Section 73-34-1 et seq., or when

101 any tax assessor holds a valid designation from the International

102 Association of Assessing Officers as a Cadastral Mapping

103 Specialist (CMS) or Personal Property Specialist (PPS) or

104 Residential Evaluation Specialist (RES), he shall receive an

105 additional Six Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$6,500.00) annually

106 beginning the next fiscal year after completion. When any tax

107 assessor holds the valid designation of Certified Assessment

108 Evaluator (CAE) from the International Association of Assessing

109 Officers or is a state certified General Real Estate Appraiser

110 (GA) under Section 73-34-1 et seq., he shall receive an additional

111 Eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,500.00) annually beginning

112 the next fiscal year after completion.

113 (8) The salaries provided for in this section shall be the

total funds paid to the county assessors and tax collectors and

115 shall be full compensation for their services, with any fees being

116 paid to the county general fund.

117 (9) The salaries provided for in this section shall be

118 payable monthly on the first day of each calendar month by

119 chancery clerk's warrant drawn on the general fund of the county;

120 however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and

121 entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be

122 paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month or

- 123 every two (2) weeks pursuant to Section 25-3-29. If a pay date

- 131 assessed valuation is determined; however, the board of
- 132 supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on its
- 133 minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid semimonthly
- on the first and fifteenth day of each month or every two (2)
- 135 weeks pursuant to Section 25-3-29. If a pay date falls on a
- 136 weekend or legal holiday, salary payments shall be made on the
- 137 workday immediately preceding the weekend or legal holiday. The
- 138 chancery clerk shall draw his warrant on the general fund of the
- 139 county, the county road and bridge fund, or any fund of the county
- 140 available for such purposes.
- SECTION 3. Section 25-3-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 142 amended as follows:
- 143 25-3-19. The chancery clerks, as county auditors, shall
- 144 receive compensation for their services as such the annual amount
- of Five Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$5,300.00), payable in
- 146 equal monthly installments out of the county treasury; however,
- 147 the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered

- 148 on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid
- 149 semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month or every
- 150 two (2) weeks pursuant to Section 25-3-29. If a pay date falls on
- 151 a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments shall be made on the
- 152 workday immediately preceding the weekend or legal holiday.
- 153 **SECTION 4.** Section 25-3-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 154 amended as follows:
- 155 25-3-29. Except as otherwise therein provided, the salaries
- 156 mentioned in the foregoing sections shall be paid monthly out of
- 157 the general county fund, and the \star \star salaries and allowances
- 158 shall be included in the budget of each county; however, the board
- 159 of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on its
- 160 minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid semimonthly
- 161 on the first and fifteenth day of each month or every two (2)
- 162 weeks. If a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary
- 163 payments shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the
- 164 weekend or legal holiday.
- SECTION 5. Section 25-3-36, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 166 amended as follows:
- 167 25-3-36. (1) Until October 1, 2008, every justice court
- 168 judge shall receive as full compensation for his or her services,
- 169 and in lieu of any and all other fees, costs or compensation
- 170 heretofore authorized for such justice court judge, an annual
- 171 salary based upon the population of his or her county according to
- 172 the latest federal decennial census; however, no justice court

- 173 judge shall be paid less than the salary authorized under this
- 174 section to be paid the justice court judge based upon the
- 175 population of the county according to the 1980 federal decennial
- 176 census. The amount of which salary shall be determined as
- 177 follows:
- 178 (a) In counties with a population of more than two
- 179 hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Fifty-five Thousand Five
- 180 Hundred Fifty-nine Dollars (\$55,559.00).
- 181 (b) In counties with a population of more than one
- 182 hundred fifty thousand (150,000) but not more than two hundred
- 183 thousand (200,000), a salary of Fifty-one Thousand Five Dollars
- 184 (\$51,005.00).
- 185 (c) In counties with a population of more than
- 186 seventy-five thousand (75,000) but not more than one hundred fifty
- 187 thousand (150,000), a salary of Forty-six Thousand Four Hundred
- 188 Fifty-one Dollars (\$46,451.00).
- 189 (d) In counties with a population of more than
- 190 forty-nine thousand (49,000) but not more than seventy-five
- 191 thousand (75,000), a salary of Forty Thousand Seventy-five Dollars
- 192 (\$40,075.00).
- 193 (e) In counties with a population of more than
- 194 thirty-four thousand (34,000) but not more than forty-nine
- 195 thousand (49,000), a salary of Thirty-four Thousand Six Hundred
- 196 Ten Dollars (\$34,610.00).

- 198 twenty-four thousand five hundred (24,500) but not more than
- 199 thirty-four thousand (34,000), a salary of Thirty-two Thousand
- 200 Seven Hundred Eighty-nine Dollars (\$32,789.00).
- 201 (g) In counties with a population of more than
- 202 twenty-one thousand (21,000) but not more than twenty-four
- 203 thousand five hundred (24,500), a salary of Twenty-nine Thousand
- 204 One Hundred Forty-six Dollars (\$29,146.00).
- 205 (h) In counties with a population of more than sixteen
- 206 thousand five hundred (16,500) but not more than twenty-one
- 207 thousand (21,000), a salary of Twenty-five Thousand Five Hundred
- 208 Two Dollars (\$25,502.00).
- 209 (i) In counties with a population of more than twelve
- 210 thousand (12,000) but not more than sixteen thousand five hundred
- 211 (16,500), a salary of Twenty-one Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty-nine
- 212 Dollars (\$21,859.00).
- 213 (j) In counties with a population of more than eight
- 214 thousand (8,000) but not more than twelve thousand (12,000), a
- 215 salary of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00).
- 216 (k) In counties with a population of eight thousand
- 217 (8,000) or less, a salary of Fourteen Thousand Four Hundred
- 218 Dollars (\$14,400.00).
- 219 The board of supervisors of any county having two (2)
- 220 judicial districts and two (2) justice court judges for the county
- 221 shall pay each justice court judge an amount equal to that

- 222 provided in this subsection for judges in the next higher
- 223 population category per year, if the justice court judge maintains
- 224 regular office hours and is personally present in the office they
- 225 maintain for at least thirty (30) hours per week.
- In any county having a population greater than eight thousand
- 227 (8,000) but less than eight thousand five hundred (8,500)
- 228 according to the 1990 federal decennial census and in which U.S.
- 229 Highway 61 and Mississippi Highway 4 intersect, the board of
- 230 supervisors, in its discretion, may pay such justice court judges
- 231 an additional amount not to exceed the sum of Eleven Thousand Five
- 232 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$11,550.00) per year, payable beginning
- 233 April 1, 1997.
- In any county having a population greater than ten thousand
- (10,000) but less than ten thousand five hundred (10,500)
- 236 according to the 1990 federal decennial census and in which
- 237 Mississippi Highway 3 and Mississippi Highway 6 intersect, the
- 238 board of supervisors, in its discretion, may pay such justice
- 239 court judges an additional amount not to exceed One Thousand Four
- 240 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,450.00) per year, payable beginning
- 241 April 1, 1997.
- In any county having a population greater than twenty-four
- 243 thousand seven hundred (24,700) and less than twenty-four thousand
- 244 nine hundred (24,900), according to the 1990 federal census,
- 245 wherein Mississippi Highways 15 and 16 intersect, the board of
- 246 supervisors shall pay such justice court judge an additional

- amount equal to Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) per year.
- 249 (2) From and after October 1, 2008, every justice court
 250 judge shall receive as full compensation for his or her services,
 251 and in lieu of any and all other fees, costs or compensation
 252 heretofore authorized for such justice court judge, an annual
 253 salary in an amount that is the greater of the following:
- 254 (a) The amount paid to a member of the board of 255 supervisors in the same county in which the justice court judge 256 presides; or
- 257 (b) One hundred three percent (103%) of the salary 258 authorized under this section as of September 30, 2008, for a 259 justice court judge in that county.
- If supervisors of a county receive a salary increase, justice court judges whose salary is determined under this paragraph shall be paid an amount reflecting a commensurate increase.
- 263 (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, in the event that the number of justice court judges 264 265 authorized pursuant to Section 9-11-2(1) is exceeded pursuant to 266 the provisions of Section 9-11-2(4), the aggregate of the salaries 267 paid to the justice court judges of such a county shall not exceed 268 the amount sufficient to pay the number of justice court judges 269 authorized pursuant to Section 9-11-2(1), and such amount shall be 270 equally divided among those justice court judges continuing to hold office under the provisions of Section 9-11-2(4). 271

272	(4) From and after January 1, 1984, all fees, costs, fines
273	and penalties charged and collected in the justice court shall be
274	paid to the clerk of the justice court for deposit, along with
275	monies from cash bonds and other monies which have been forfeited
276	in criminal cases, into the general fund of the county as provided
277	in Section 9-11-19; and the clerk of the board of supervisors
278	shall be authorized and empowered, upon approval by the board of
279	supervisors, to make disbursements and withdrawals from the
280	general fund of the county in order to pay any reasonable and
281	necessary expenses incurred in complying with this section,
282	including payment of the salaries of justice court judges as
283	provided by subsection (1) of this section. The provisions of
284	this subsection shall not, except as to cash bonds and other
285	monies which have been forfeited in criminal cases, apply to
286	monies required to be deposited in the justice court clerk
287	clearing account as provided in Section 9-11-18, Mississippi Code
288	of 1972.

(5) The salaries provided for in this section shall be payable monthly by warrant drawn by the clerk of the board of supervisors on the general fund of the county; however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month or every two (2) weeks pursuant to Section 25-3-29. If a pay date falls on a

- 298 (6) Provided, that the salary of any justice court judge 299 shall not be reduced during his term of office as a result of a 300 population change following a federal decennial census.
- 301 (7) Any justice court judge who is unable to attend and hold 302 court by reason of being under suspension by the Commission on 303 Judicial Performance or the Mississippi Supreme Court shall not 304 receive a salary while under such suspension.
- 305 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 306 and after its passage.
