## HOUSE BILL NO. 585

- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-7-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 AUTHORIZE A VEHICLE TRANSPORTING A LOAD OF TIMBER PRODUCTS TO
- 3 OPERATE AT NIGHT PROVIDED THAT THE VEHICLE HAS A ROTATING LIGHT
- 4 AFFIXED TO THE END OF THE LOAD; TO AMEND SECTION 63-5-19,
- 5 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF
- THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-7-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 9
- 10 63-7-47. (1) Whenever the load upon any vehicle extends to
- 11 the rear four (4) feet or more beyond the rear or body of such
- vehicle, there shall be displayed at the extreme rear end of the 12
- 13 load a red flag or cloth not less than sixteen (16) inches square.
- (2) \* \* \* A vehicle transporting a load of timber products 14
- 15 that extends more than four (4) feet beyond the bed or trailer may
- operate at night provided that from one-half (1/2) hour before 16
- sunset to one-half (1/2) hour after sunrise  $\star$   $\star$  and the period 17
- 18 described in Section 63-7-11, such vehicle shall have affixed as
- 19 close as practical to the end of the load a rotating or

20 oscillating amber strobe-type lamp or light-emitting diode light.

- SECTION 2. Section 63-5-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 22 amended as follows:
- 23 63-5-19. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
- 24 no single vehicle, unladen or with load, shall have an overall
- 25 length, inclusive of front and rear bumpers, in excess of forty
- 26 (40) feet.
- 27 (2) No semitrailer operating in a truck tractor-semitrailer
- 28 combination and no trailer drawn by a motor vehicle shall exceed a
- 29 length of fifty-three (53) feet.
- 30 (3) No semitrailer or trailer operating in a truck
- 31 tractor-semitrailer-trailer combination and no trailer operating
- 32 in a double trailer combination drawn by a motor vehicle shall
- 33 exceed a length of thirty (30) feet.
- 34 (4) No semitrailer or trailer combinations in excess of two
- 35 (2) units, excluding the towing motor vehicle, shall be allowed to
- 36 operate on the highways of this state.
- 37 (5) No motor home shall have an overall length exclusive of
- 38 front and rear bumpers, in excess of forty-five (45) feet.
- 39 (6) The load upon the rear vehicle of a combination of
- 40 vehicles transporting forest or agricultural products in their
- 41 natural state shall not project more than twenty-eight (28) feet
- 42 beyond the rear axle of the vehicle except in the special
- 43 circumstance hereinafter prescribed. If such products project
- 44 more than twenty-eight (28) feet beyond the rear axle and, due to
- 45 the end use for which they are intended (such as tall utility

- 46 poles or light poles or the like), such products cannot be
- 47 shortened without rendering them useless for the finished product
- 48 for which they have been cut, then such special circumstance may
- 49 be considered good cause for the obtaining of a permit which shall
- 50 be procured pursuant to Section 63-5-51 before vehicles
- 51 transporting such products may operate. Except as otherwise
- 52 provided in Sections 63-5-21 and 63-7-47, any vehicle transporting
- 53 projecting loads as described in this subsection that extend four
- 54 (4) feet or more beyond the rear or body of the vehicle shall
- operate only during daylight hours, and the load on vehicles
- 56 designed to transport forestry products shall be secured by at
- 57 least two (2) chains, two (2) wire ropes, or two (2) nylon straps,
- 58 one (1) positioned behind the front bolster and one (1) in front
- 59 of the back bolster.
- 60 (7) Except as otherwise provided in Sections 63-5-21 and
- $61 \quad 63-7-47$ , the rear projecting load of any vehicle operating during
- 62 the period described under Section 63-7-11 may not extend four (4)
- 63 feet or more beyond the rear or body of the vehicle, or as
- 64 otherwise allowable by federal law.
- 65 (8) The length limitations on projecting loads prescribed in
- 66 this section do not apply to a single vehicle or the rear vehicle
- 67 of a combination of vehicles designed for on-farm delivery and
- 68 unloading of any agricultural product, in its natural or
- 69 manufactured form, which is fitted with an auger or similar
- 70 unloading device permanently affixed to the vehicle that extends

- 71 no more than eight (8) feet horizontally beyond the rear or body
- 72 of the vehicle provided that no portion of such device which
- 73 extends four (4) feet or more beyond the rear or body of the
- 74 vehicle is less than seven (7) feet above the roadway surface.
- 75 However, any such vehicle may not be operated on the public
- 76 highways, roads or streets of this state during the period
- 77 described under Section 63-7-11.
- 78 (9) A vehicle designed and especially constructed to
- 79 transport raw cotton from harvest to the cotton gin may have a
- 80 total overall length not to exceed fifty (50) feet whenever any
- 81 such vehicle is being operated within a radius of fifty (50) miles
- 82 of the vehicle's home base or its contractual customer.
- 83 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 84 and after July 1, 2020.
