1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO IS ISSUED A GRAND LODGE OF 3 MISSISSIPPI, FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS, DISTINCTIVE MOTOR VEHICLE 4 OR MOTORCYCLE LICENSE TAG AND ALSO HAS A DISABILITY WHICH LIMITS 5 OR IMPAIRS THE ABILITY TO WALK OR HAS A CHILD, PARENT OR SPOUSE 6 WITH A DISABILITY WHICH LIMITS OR IMPAIRS THE ABILITY TO WALK MAY 7 BE ISSUED A SPECIAL DECAL INDICATING SUCH DISABILITY; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 27-19-56.14, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH 8 9 AUTHORIZES THE ISSUANCE OF GRAND LODGE OF MISSISSIPPI, FREE AND 10 ACCEPTED MASONS, DISTINCTIVE MOTOR VEHICLE AND MOTORCYCLE LICENSE 11 TAGS, FOR THE PURPOSES OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED 12 PURPOSES. 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 14 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 15 16 27-19-56. (1) (a) Upon application by any legal resident of the State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or 17 18 impairs the ability to walk, or by the owner of a motor vehicle who has a child, parent or spouse with a disability which limits 19 20 or impairs the ability to walk and the child, parent or spouse is 21 living with the applicant, the Department of Revenue shall prepare and issue through the county tax collectors a special license 22 23 plate bearing the International Symbol of Access adopted by

- 270 Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, 271 license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit 272 bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with 273 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of 274 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges 275 under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard, 276 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and 277 is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.
- 278 (9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are
 279 disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after
 280 the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person
 281 with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk.
 282 The identification required to park in such an area, except as
 283 provided in subsection (8) of this section, is as follows:
 - (a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard must be displayed or the vehicle must have a special license tag issued under this section or Section 27-19-53 properly displayed or the vehicle must have a license tag issued under Section 27-19-56.14 and bearing the special decal issued under subsection (1) (c) of this section properly displayed.

295 Any person who parks in an area set aside for persons who are 296 disabled in violation of this subsection shall be punished as 297 provided for in subsection (5) of this section.

- 321 which displays the Freemason emblem and displays the words "Grand

- 323 (2) The tags shall be of such color and design as the

- 325 the Mississippi License Tag Commission.
