## HOUSE BILL NO. 841

- AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE WAIVER OF TUITION, REQUIRED FEES AND BOOK COSTS AT THE STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES FOR THE CHILDREN OF CERTAIN DECEASED VETERANS AND DISABLED VETERANS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE PARTIAL WAIVER 5 OF TUITION, REQUIRED FEES AND BOOK COSTS AT THE STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES FOR THE 7 CHILDREN, SPOUSES AND UNREMARRIED WIDOWS AND WIDOWERS OF CERTAIN 8 DECEASED VETERANS AND DISABLED VETERANS; TO PROVIDE THAT 9 APPLICATIONS FOR WAIVERS MUST INCLUDE CERTAIN DOCUMENTATION; TO 10 PROVIDE THAT TUITION MAY BE WAIVED FOR BOTH FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME STUDENTS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE 11 12 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING SHALL BE THE ADMINISTERING AGENCY 13 OF THE TUITION WAIVER PROGRAMS; TO AMEND SECTION 37-103-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS 14 15 ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 17 SECTION 1. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
- following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in 18
- 19 this section unless the context clearly indicates:
- 20 (a) "Child" means a natural child, legally adopted
- 21 child or stepchild.
- 22 (b) "Tuition" means the quarter, semester, trimester or
- 23 term charges, all required fees and book costs; however, the term

- "tuition" does not include food, housing costs, school supplies, 25 materials, dues or fees for extracurricular activities.
- 26 (2) Beginning with the 2020-2021 academic year, any resident
- 27 of the State of Mississippi, as defined in Section 37-103-1 et
- 28 seq., who is the child of a veteran of the United States Armed
- 29 Forces who (a) was killed in the line of duty or died as the
- 30 result of a service-connected disability as determined by the
- 31 United States Department of Veterans Affairs, (b) has been rated
- 32 as having one hundred percent (100%) or total disability by the
- 33 United States Department of Veterans Affairs or (c) was discharged
- 34 or retired from the armed forces with a disability rating of forty
- 35 percent (40%) or more and has maintained that percentage, and who
- 36 is enrolled in or accepted for enrollment at a state institution
- 37 of higher learning or a public community or junior college in
- 38 Mississippi, may apply for a waiver of tuition at the institution
- 39 of higher learning or community or junior college. In order to be
- 40 eliqible for a tuition waiver, a child must not have reached
- 41 twenty-four (24) years of age on the first day of the quarter,
- 42 semester, trimester or term for which the child is enrolling.
- 43 However, any child who has begun earning academic credit in
- 44 furtherance of an associate or baccalaureate degree or certificate
- 45 program before attaining twenty-four (24) years of age whose
- 46 instruction is interrupted for any reason is eligible to receive
- 47 academic waivers in furtherance of the degree or certificate
- 48 toward which the student is working, subject to the conditions

- prescribed in subsection (3) of this section. An application for a tuition waiver must be accompanied by proper proof that the veteran is a veteran of the United States Armed Forces and that the veteran was killed in the line of duty or died as a result of a service-connected disability as determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or meets the applicable disability requirement.
- (3) A waiver of tuition awarded under this section may not 56 57 exceed the actual cost of tuition at the institution of higher 58 learning or community or junior college at which the child of a 59 deceased or qualified disabled veteran is enrolled or accepted for enrollment and may be reduced by an amount to ensure the value of 60 61 the waiver, combined with any other grants, scholarships and 62 benefits received by the student, does not exceed the actual cost 63 or tuition. Both full-time and part-time students may apply for a 64 waiver under this section. Students enrolling on a full-time 65 basis may receive a maximum of four (4) annual waivers, and in 66 those instances when a degree program requires five (5) years for 67 completion, five (5) annual waivers. The number of waivers that 68 may be granted to a student attending school on a part-time basis 69 may not exceed the length of time required to complete the 70 associate or baccalaureate degree or certificate program toward 71 which the student is working. A person who has a baccalaureate 72 degree is not eligible for a waiver of tuition under this section,

- and any person who has an associate degree may receive waivers only in furtherance of a baccalaureate degree.

exceed sixty percent (60%) of the actual cost of tuition at the institution of higher learning or community or junior college at which the child, spouse or unremarried widow or widower is enrolled or accepted for enrollment and may be reduced by an amount to ensure the value of the waiver, combined with any other grants, scholarships and benefits received by the student, does not exceed the actual cost or tuition. - 181 SECTION 3. Section 37-103-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 182
- 183 37-103-19. Resident status of a spouse or child of a (1)member of the Armed Forces of the United States on extended active 185 duty shall be that of the military spouse or parent for the 186 purpose of attending state-supported institutions of higher 187 learning and community/junior colleges of the State of Mississippi 188 during the time that the military spouse or parent is stationed within the State of Mississippi and shall be continued through the 189 190 time that the military spouse or parent is stationed in an 191 overseas area with last duty assignment within the State of 192 Mississippi, excepting temporary training assignments en route 193 from Mississippi. Resident status of a spouse or minor child 194 terminates upon reassignment under Permanent Change of Station 195 Orders of the military spouse or parent for duty in the 196 continental United States outside the State of Mississippi,

197	excepting temporary training assignments en route from
198	Mississippi. However, except for spouses who enroll at a
199	professional school or college, spouses or children of members of
200	the Armed Forces who attain Mississippi residency in accordance
201	with the provisions of this subsection and who enroll full time in
202	a Mississippi institution of higher learning or community/junior
203	college shall maintain their residency status so long as they
204	remain enrolled in good standing at a Mississippi institution of
205	higher learning or community/junior college. Enrollment during
206	summer school is not required to maintain such resident status.

- (2) The spouse or child of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States who dies or is killed is entitled to pay the resident tuition fee if the spouse or child becomes a resident of Mississippi within one hundred eighty (180) days of the date of death as well as entitled to received a tuition waiver under Sections 1 or 2 of this act.
- (3) If a member of the Armed Forces of the United States is stationed outside Mississippi and the member's spouse or child establishes residence in Mississippi and registers with the Mississippi institution of higher learning or community/junior college at which the spouse or child plans to attend, the institution of higher education or community/junior college shall permit the spouse or child to pay the tuition, fees and other charges provided for Mississippi residents without regard to

- 222 Mississippi.
- 223 (4) A member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the
- 224 child or spouse of a member of the Armed Forces of the United
- 225 States who is entitled to pay tuition and fees at the rate
- 226 provided for Mississippi residents under another provision of this
- 227 section shall maintain resident classification for tuition and fee
- 228 purposes as long as he or she is continuously enrolled at a
- 229 Mississippi institution of higher learning or community/junior
- 230 college. A student may withdraw or may choose not to reenroll for
- 231 no more than one (1) semester or term while pursuing a degree or
- 232 certificate without losing resident status only if that student
- 233 provides sufficient documentation by a physician that the student
- 234 has a medical condition that requires withdrawal or nonenrollment.
- 235 For purposes of this subsection, a person is not required to
- 236 enroll in a summer term to remain continuously enrolled in a
- 237 degree or certificate program. The person's eligibility to pay
- 238 tuition and fees at the rate provided for Mississippi residents
- 239 under this subsection does not terminate because the person is no
- 240 longer a member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the
- 241 child or spouse of a member of the Armed Forces of the United
- 242 States.
- 243 **SECTION 4.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall be codified as
- 244 new sections in Chapter 106, Title 37, Mississippi Code of 1972.

245 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 246 and after July 1, 2020.
