HOUSE BILL NO. 985

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-10-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
- DEFINE "WEIGHT CONTROL PROGRAM" FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE
- 3 MISSISSIPPI DIETETICS PRACTICE ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 73-10-13,
- 4 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXEMPT WEIGHT CONTROL PROGRAMS FROM
- 5 THE MISSISSIPPI DIETETICS PRACTICE ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-10-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 73-10-3. (1) For the purposes of this chapter the following
- 10 terms shall have the meanings set forth herein:
- 11 (a) "Advisory council" means the Mississippi Council of
- 12 Advisors in Dietetics established in this chapter.
- 13 (b) "Board" means the Mississippi State Board of
- 14 Health.
- 15 (c) "Association" means the American Dietetic
- 16 Association (ADA).
- 17 (d) "Mississippi association" means the Mississippi
- 18 Dietetic Association, an affiliate of the American Dietetic
- 19 Association.

20 (e)	"Commission	on	Dietetic	Registration"	(CDR)) means
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- 21 the Commission on Dietetic Registration that is a member of the
- 22 National Commission for Health Certifying Agencies.
- 23 (f) "Degree" means a degree received from a college or
- 24 university that was accredited through the Council on
- 25 Postsecondary Accreditation and the United States Department of
- 26 Education at the time the degree was conferred.
- 27 (g) "Registered dietitian" means a person registered by
- 28 the Commission on Dietetic Registration.
- 29 (h) "Licensed dietitian" means a person licensed under
- 30 this chapter.
- 31 (i) "Provisionally licensed dietitian" means a person
- 32 provisionally licensed under this chapter.
- 33 (j) "Dietetics practice" means the integration and
- 34 application of the principles derived from the sciences of
- 35 nutrition, biochemistry, food, physiology, management and
- 36 behavioral and social sciences to achieve and maintain people's
- 37 health. Dietetics practice includes, but is not limited to:
- 38 (i) Providing medical nutrition therapy.
- 39 (ii) Development, administration, evaluation and
- 40 consultation regarding nutritional care standards of quality in
- 41 food services and medical nutrition therapy.
- 42 (iii) Providing case management services.
- (k) "Medical nutrition therapy" is a nutritional
- 44 diagnostic therapy and counseling services for the purpose of

- 45 disease management. It means the assessment of the nutritional
- 46 status of patients with a condition, illness or injury that
- 47 appropriately requires medical nutrition therapy as part of the
- 48 treatment. The assessment includes review and analysis of medical
- 49 and diet history, blood chemistry lab values and anthropometric
- 50 measurements to determine nutritional status and treatment
- 51 modalities.
- 52 Therapy ranges from diet modification and nutrition
- 53 counseling to administration of specialized nutrition therapies
- 54 such as intravenous medical nutritional products as determined
- 55 necessary to manage a condition or treat illness or injury.
- 56 (1) "Diet modification and nutrition counseling" means
- 57 intervention and advice in assisting individuals or groups in the
- 58 development of personal diet plans to achieve appropriate
- 59 nutritional intake. To develop the diet plan, the dietitian
- 60 integrates information from the nutritional assessment with
- 61 information on food and other sources of nutrients and meal
- 62 preparation consistent with cultural background and socioeconomic
- 63 status.
- (m) "Specialized nutrition therapies" mean medical
- 65 foods, enteral nutrition delivered via tube, or parenteral
- 66 nutrition delivered by intravenous infusion.
- 67 (n) "Nutrition educator" shall mean one who
- 68 communicates scientific nutrition information to individuals
- 69 and/or groups and who provides information on food sources of

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- 71 "Recommended Dietary Allowances" of the Food and Nutrition Board,
- 72 National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council.
- 73 (o) "Dietitian" means one engaged in dietetics
- 74 practice, medical nutrition therapy or nutrition education. The
- 75 terms dietitian or dietician are used interchangeably in this
- 76 chapter.
- 77 (p) "Direct, technical supervision" means the direct,
- 78 technical supervision by a licensed dietitian, as prescribed in
- 79 regulations by the board, of the dietetics practice or medical
- 80 nutrition therapy provided to an individual and/or group by a
- 81 provisionally licensed dietitian.
- (q) "Department" means the Mississippi State Department
- 83 of Health.
- (r) "Weight control program" means a general program of
- 85 instruction with food, supplements, food products or a food plan
- 86 designed for one or more healthy population groups in order to
- 87 achieve or maintain a healthy weight. A weight control program is
- 88 not based on an individual nutrition assessment and is not
- 89 individualized to provide medical nutrition therapy, nutrition
- 90 care services or case management services to manage, treat or
- 91 rehabilitate a medical condition, illness or injury for a specific
- 92 person or group.



93	(2) All other terms shall have their commonly ascribed
94	definitions unless some other meaning is clearly intended from it
95	context.

- 96 **SECTION 2.** Section 73-10-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 97 amended as follows:
- 98 73-10-13. This chapter shall not be construed to affect or 99 prevent:
- 100 (a) A student enrolled in an approved academic program
 101 in dietetics from engaging in the practice of dietetics, if such
 102 practice constitutes a part of a supervised course of study, and
 103 if the student is designated by a title which clearly indicates
 104 his or her status as a student or trainee.
- 105 (b) Any person fulfilling the experience requirements
 106 of Section 73-10-11(3) from engaging in the practice of dietetics
 107 under the supervision of a licensed or registered dietician.
- (c) A registered dietitian who is serving in the Armed
 Forces or the Public Health Service of the United States or is
 employed by the Department of Veterans Affairs from engaging in
 the practice of dietetics provided such practice is restricted to
 such service or employment.
- 113 (d) Any person providing dietetic services, including 114 but not limited to dietetic technicians, dietetic assistants and 115 dietary managers, from practicing dietetics while working under 116 the direct technical supervision of a licensed dietician.

117	(e) Persons licensed or registered to practice the
118	health professions from engaging in the practice of dietetics when
119	covered under the scope of practice of his or her profession,
120	except that such persons may not use the title "dietitian" or
121	"nutritionist."

- (f) Persons who perform the activities and services of
 a nutrition educator in the employ of a federal, state, county or
 municipal agency, or another political subdivision, or a chartered
 elementary or secondary school or accredited degree-granting
 educational institution insofar as such activities and services
 are part of a salaried position.
- (g) Federal, state, county or local government
 employees involved with programs providing the services of a
 nutrition educator that help to prevent disease and maintain good
 nutritional health, including, but not limited to, the Cooperative
 Extension Service, the Child Nutrition Program, and Project Head
 Start.
- (h) Individuals who do not hold themselves out to be
 dietitians from marketing or distributing food products including
 dietary supplements as defined by the Food and Drug Administration
 or from engaging in the explanation and education of customers
 regarding the use of such products.
- (i) Any person from furnishing general nutrition
 information as to the use of food, food materials or dietary
 supplements, including a weight control program, nor prevent in

- 142 any way the free dissemination of literature; * * * however, no
- 143 such individual may call themselves a dietitian unless they are
- 144 licensed under this chapter.
- 145 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 146 and after July 1, 2020.
