HOUSE BILL NO. 1066

AN ACT TO CREATE A SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE COMPOSED OF THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF RULES COMMITTEE, THE HOUSE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE RULES COMMITTEE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROPOSING OPTIONS FOR THE DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL FLAG OF THE STATE 5 OF MISSISSIPPI TO BE CONSIDERED BY THE LEGISLATURE; TO PROVIDE THAT THE MEMBERS OF THOSE COMMITTEES SHALL MEET TOGETHER IN 7 CAUCUSES OF THE MEMBERS FROM EACH OF THE FOUR CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS FROM WHICH THEY WERE SELECTED, AND EACH CAUCUS OF 9 MEMBERS MAY PROPOSE A NEW DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG AS AN 10 OPTION FOR THE DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG; TO PROVIDE THAT 11 EACH CAUCUS THAT PROPOSES A NEW DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG 12 SHALL PRESENT ITS FLAG DESIGN TO THE LEGISLATURE NOT LATER THAN THE BEGINNING OF THE 2021 REGULAR SESSION; TO PROVIDE FOR A STATEWIDE SPECIAL ELECTION ON THE SAME DATE AS THE REGULAR GENERAL 14 ELECTION IN NOVEMBER 2022, WHICH WILL BE A NONBINDING REFERENDUM 15 16 ON OPTIONS PROPOSED FOR THE DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG; TO 17 ALLOW THE ELECTORATE IN THE SPECIAL ELECTION TO VOTE FOR ONE OF 18 THE OPTIONS FOR THE DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG, WHICH WILL 19 BE ANY DESIGNS PROPOSED BY THE CAUCUSES AND THE DESIGN OF THE 20 CURRENT OFFICIAL STATE FLAG DESIGN; TO PROVIDE THAT IF NONE OF THE PROPOSITIONS RECEIVES A MAJORITY OF THE VOTES CAST IN THE SPECIAL 21 22 ELECTION, THERE SHALL BE A RUNOFF ELECTION THREE WEEKS LATER BETWEEN THE TWO PROPOSITIONS RECEIVING THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF 24 VOTES; TO PROVIDE THAT THE RESULTS OF THE REFERENDUM ARE NONBINDING ON THE LEGISLATURE, BUT THE LEGISLATURE SHALL CONSIDER 25 26 THE OPTIONS PROPOSED FOR THE DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG IN 27 THE SPECIAL ELECTION DURING THE 2023 REGULAR SESSION; TO PROVIDE 28 THAT IF THE LEGISLATURE CHOOSES TO CHANGE THE DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG, THE LEGISLATURE SHALL AMEND THE CODE SECTION SETTING THE DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG TO REFLECT THE 30 31 DESCRIPTION OF THE NEW DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG; TO 32 REQUIRE THAT THE SPECIAL ELECTION BE ADMINISTERED BY MEANS OF 33 BALLOTS CONTAINING A COLOR PICTURE OR DRAWING OF EACH OF THE 34 OPTIONS PROPOSED FOR THE DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG; TO

- 35 REQUIRE THE SECRETARY OF STATE TO PROVIDE THOSE BALLOTS TO THE
- 36 ELECTION COMMISSIONERS OF EACH COUNTY; TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-351
- 37 AND 23-15-355, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE
- 38 PRECEDING PROVISIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 39 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 40 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is created a special legislative
- 41 committee, to be composed of the members of the House Rules
- 42 Committee, the House Management Committee and the Senate Rules
- 43 Committee, for the purpose of proposing options for the design of
- 44 the official flag of the State of Mississippi to be considered by
- 45 the Legislature. The members of those committees shall meet
- 46 together in caucuses of the members from each of the four (4)
- 47 congressional districts from which they were selected, and each
- 48 caucus of members may propose a new design of the official state
- 49 flag as an option for the design of the official state flag. Each
- 50 caucus that proposes a new design of the official state flag shall
- 51 present its flag design to the Legislature not later than the
- 52 beginning of the 2021 Regular Session.
- 53 (2) In developing their flag designs, the caucuses are
- 54 authorized:
- 55 (a) To hold public meetings at such times and locations
- 56 as the caucus determines;
- 57 (b) To receive written, public comment, in a manner as
- 58 the caucus determines, and to hold public hearings, under the
- 59 terms and conditions as the caucus determines;

60	(c) To collect, examine and consider all information
61	which the caucus determines may be helpful in developing its flag
62	design;
63	(d) To consult with historical experts, social science
64	experts, representatives of organizations and associations, and
65	others, whose knowledge or expertise may assist the caucus in
66	developing its flag design; and
67	(e) To make any inquiries and conduct any business that
68	may assist the caucus in developing its flag design.
69	(3) There shall be a statewide special election, to be held
70	on the same date as the regular general election on Tuesday,
71	November 8, 2022, which will be a nonbinding referendum on options
72	proposed for the design of the official state flag. The special
73	election shall be conducted in the same manner as regular general
74	elections are held, except as otherwise provided in subsection (5)
75	of this section. The question put before the voters at the
76	statewide special election shall read on the ballots as follows:
77	"PLEASE VOTE FOR ONE OF THE FOLLOWING PROPOSITIONS
78	THE FOLLOWING PROPOSITIONS ARE OPTIONS PROPOSED FOR THE
79	DESIGN OF THE OFFICIAL FLAG OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI TO BE
80	CONSIDERED BY THE LEGISLATURE:

108 provided to county election commissioners, of the proposed new 109 state flag design of the Third Congressional District.) 110 FOR PROPOSITION 'D': 111 PROPOSITION 'E' 112 (If the members of the special legislative committee from the 113 caucus of the Fourth Congressional District have proposed a new design of the official state flag, here shall be inserted the 114 115 color picture or drawing, which the Secretary of State has 116 provided to county election commissioners, of the proposed new 117 state flag design of the Fourth Congressional District.) FOR PROPOSITION 'E': " 118 119 If the members of the special legislative committee from the 120 caucus of any of the congressional districts do not propose a new design of the official state flag, then the lettering for the 121 122 different propositions as provided above shall be re-lettered so 123 that there will be consecutive lettering from Proposition "B" 124 through the last proposition. 125 The qualified electors may indicate their preference on 126 the line following the proposition that they prefer. If none of 127 the propositions receives a majority of the votes cast in the 128 special election, the two (2) propositions receiving the highest 129 number of votes shall be placed on the ballot for a second 130 election to be held three (3) weeks later in accordance with

appropriate procedures that are followed in other elections

involving runoff elections. The results of the referendum are

133 nonbinding on the Legislature, but the Legislature shall consider 134 the options proposed for the design of the official state flag in 135 the special election during the 2023 Regular Session. If the 136 Legislature chooses to change the design of the official state flag, the Legislature shall amend Section 3-3-16 to reflect the 137 138 description of the new design of the official state flag and take whatever other steps that may be necessary to effectuate the new 139 140 design of the official state flag.

The statewide special election for the referendum on options proposed for the design of the official state flag shall be administered by means of ballots containing a uniform representation of the options proposed for the design of the official state flag, which shall be provided by the Secretary of State to the election commissioners of each county. The Secretary of State shall determine whether, in each county, it would be more efficient to administer the election by paper ballots, voting machines, electronic voting systems, optical mark reading equipment or other mechanized equipment. The method used in each county shall be as uniform as practicable when compared to any other county in which the same method is used. In any event, the Secretary of State shall include a color picture or drawing of each of the options proposed for the design of the official state flag on all ballots provided for in this section. The Secretary of State is authorized to enter into any necessary contracts for providing the required color picture or drawing of each of the

- 158 options proposed for the design of the official state flag on all
- 159 ballots in all counties of this state. The costs incurred in
- 160 providing the ballots which are required to include a color
- 161 picture or drawing of each of the options proposed for the design
- of the official state flag shall be borne by the State of
- 163 Mississippi, and the Legislature shall appropriate the funds
- 164 necessary for this purpose. All other costs associated with the
- 165 holding of the statewide special election shall be borne by each
- 166 individual county.
- 167 (6) The county election commissioners shall transmit to the
- 168 Secretary of State, in the same manner as the vote for state
- 169 officers is transmitted, a statement of the total number of votes
- 170 cast for each proposition in the statewide special election and in
- 171 the runoff election, if there is a runoff. The Secretary of State
- 172 shall tabulate those returns and certify the results to the
- 173 Governor and to each house of the Legislature.
- 174 **SECTION 2.** Section 23-15-351, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 175 amended as follows:
- 176 23-15-351. It shall be the duty of the chair of the election
- 177 commission of each county to have printed all necessary ballots
- 178 for use in elections, except ballots in municipal elections which
- 179 shall be printed as herein provided by the authorities of the
- 180 respective municipalities; and the election commissioner shall
- 181 cause the official ballot to be printed by a printer sworn to keep
- 182 the ballots secret under the penalties prescribed by law. The

183	printer shall deliver to the election commissioners for holding
184	elections, a certificate of the number of ballots printed for each
185	precinct, and shall not print any additional ballots, except on
186	instruction of proper election commissioners; and failure to
187	observe either of these requirements shall be a misdemeanor.
188	In the case of the statewide special election on options
189	proposed for the design of the official state flag provided for in
190	Section 1 of this act, the provisions of this article regarding
191	the printing and distribution of the official ballots shall be
192	governed by the provisions of Section 1(5) of this act.
193	SECTION 3. Section 23-15-355, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
194	amended as follows:
195	23-15-355. Ballots in all elections shall be printed and
196	distributed at public expense and shall be known as "official
197	ballots." The expense of printing the ballots shall be paid out
198	of the county treasury, except that in municipal elections such
199	expenses shall be paid by the respective cities, towns and
200	villages.
201	In the case of the statewide special election on options
202	proposed for the design of the official state flag provided for in
203	Section 1 of this act, the provisions of this section regarding
204	payment of the expenses of printing the official ballots shall be

206 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 207 and after July 1, 2020.

governed by the provisions of Section 1(5) of this act.
