HOUSE BILL NO. 1243

1 AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 97-25-59, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 2 1972, TO DEFINE IMPEDING CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE AS A MISDEMEANOR 3 OR A TRESPASS, DEPENDING ON THE AMOUNT OF RESULTING DAMAGE OR 4 ECONOMIC LOSS, AND TO DEFINE CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE TRESPASS AS A 5 MISDEMEANOR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section 97-25-59, Mississippi Code of 1972: 8 9 97-25-59. (1) **Definition of "critical infrastructure** 10 facility." As used in this act, unless otherwise defined, "critical infrastructure facility" means: 11 12 (a) Any portion of an oil, gas, carbon dioxide, hazardous liquid or chemical pipeline or tank that is buried or 13 14 enclosed by a fence or other physical barrier obviously designed 15 to exclude intruders, or clearly marked with a sign or signs 16 reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders and 17 indicating that entry is forbidden without authorization. 18 (b) One (1) of the following, if enclosed by a fence or 19 other physical barrier obviously designed to exclude intruders, or

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20 if clearly marked with a sign or signs reasonably likely to come 21 to the attention of intruders and indicating that entry is 22 forbidden without authorization: 23 A chemical or polymer manufacturing facility; (i) 24 (ii) A telecommunications central switching 25 office; 26 Wireless or other telecommunications (iii) 27 infrastructure, including cell towers, communication towers, 28 telephone poles and lines, cable headend or fiber-optic lines, 29 other than those connecting to individual residences; 30 (iv) A transmission facility used by a federally licensed radio or television station, a governmental law 31 32 enforcement or emergency services radio system, or electric 33 utility; (v) A petroleum refinery; 34 35 (vi) A liquid natural gas terminal or storage 36 facility or compressed gas liquids plant or storage facility; 37 (vii) A natural gas compressor station; 38 (viii) A hydrocarbon processing plant, including a 39 plant used in the processing, treatment or fractionation of oil, 40 natural gas or natural gas liquids; 41 (ix) A natural gas distribution utility facility, 42 including transmission facilities, pipeline interconnections, a 43 city gate or town border station, metering stations, piping, a regulator station or a natural gas storage facility; 44

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45 (X) A crude oil or refined products storage and distribution facility, including storage tanks, valve sites, 46 pipeline interconnections, pump stations, metering stations, 47 48 pipelines, or piping and truck loading or offloading facilities; 49 (xi) An above-ground or underground mining 50 facility; An electrical power generating facility, 51 (xii) 52 substation, switching station, communication facility, electrical 53 control center or electric power lines and associated equipment 54 infrastructure other than those connections to individual 55 residences; 56 (xiii) A data center or supercomputing center that 57 has an average constant draw of at least one (1) megawatt of 58 electricity; 59 (xiv) A commercial airport, trucking terminal or 60 other freight transportation facility, including a railroad 61 switching yard, railroad facility or railroad track; 62 (xv) Any reservoir that supplies water for 63 industrial or municipal supplies or irrigation for multiple users 64 or an irrigation district; or 65 (xvi) A water intake structure, water treatment 66 facility, wastewater treatment plant, pump station or water lines 67 and associated equipment infrastructure other than those 68 connections to individual residences.

No. 1243 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 20/HR26/R1780 PAGE 3 (GT\KW) 69 Any site where the construction or improvement of (C) 70 any facility or structure referenced in this section is occurring. 71 **Impeding critical infrastructure.** (a) (2)A person is 72 quilty of impeding critical infrastructure if he or she 73 intentionally or knowingly impedes the operations of a critical 74 infrastructure facility in a manner not otherwise authorized by 75 law.

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(b) Impeding critical infrastructure is:

(i) A misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or both, if the impediment causes damage or economic loss, the cost of which is less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00);

(ii) A felony punishable by imprisonment for not
more than seven (7) years, a fine of not more than Ten Thousand
Dollars (\$10,000.00), or both, if the impediment causes damage or
economic loss, the cost of which is One Thousand Dollars
(\$1,000.00) or more.

87 (c) If a series of damage or loss results from a single
88 continuing course of conduct, a single violation of this section
89 may be charged and penalties imposed based on the aggregate cost
90 of the damage or loss.

91 (d) An organization that aids, abets, solicits,
92 compensates, hires, conspires with, commands or procures a person
93 to commit the crime of impeding critical infrastructure is subject

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94 to a fine not to exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars 95 (\$100,000.00), provided that the organization acted with the 96 intent that the crime of impeding critical infrastructure be completed. A critical infrastructure facility may maintain a 97 98 civil action against an organization for damages suffered as a 99 consequence of a violation of this subsection, including damages 100 for lost profits, whether or not any fine is imposed pursuant to 101 this subsection.

102 (e) No person shall be liable for a violation of103 paragraph (a) or (b) of this subsection if the person:

(i) Owns or legally occupies the land upon which the critical infrastructure facility is located and is engaged in conduct that is not inconsistent with the operation of the critical infrastructure facility or that is authorized by an agreement;

(ii) Is lawfully engaged in any regulatory or legal process to which the critical infrastructure facility is subject; or

112 (iii) Is engaged in conduct arising out of a bona 113 fide dispute about access to land.

(f) As used in this subsection, "impede" means: (i) To block the operation of or prevent legal access to a critical infrastructure facility or the construction site of a permitted critical infrastructure facility; or

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(ii) To damage, destroy, deface or tamper with the equipment of a critical infrastructure facility, whether completed or under construction.

121 (3) **Critical infrastructure trespass.** (a) A person is 122 guilty of critical infrastructure trespass if he or she enters or 123 remains on or in a critical infrastructure facility or the construction site of a permitted critical infrastructure facility 124 125 knowing he is not authorized to do so, or by means of false, 126 forged, altered or counterfeit identification, or after having 127 been notified to depart or not to trespass. For purposes of this subsection, notice is given by: 128

129 (i) Personal communication to the person by the130 owner or occupant, or his agent, or by a peace officer;

131 (ii) Posting of signs reasonably likely to come to 132 the attention of intruders; or

133 (iii) The presence of fencing or other physical134 barrier designed to exclude intruders.

(b) Critical infrastructure trespass is a misdemeanor
punishable by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, a fine
of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or both.

138 (c) No person shall be liable for a violation of139 paragraph (a) of this subsection if that person:

140 (i) Owns or legally occupies the land upon which141 the facility is located and is engaged in conduct that is not

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142 inconsistent with the operation of the critical infrastructure 143 facility or that is authorized by an agreement; or

(ii) Is lawfully engaged in any regulatory or legal process to which the critical infrastructure facility is subject.

147 (4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit:
148 (a) Public demonstrations or other expressions of free
149 speech or free association to the extent such activity is
150 protected under the United States or Mississippi Constitutions;

(b) Lawful commercial or recreational activities conducted in the open or unconfined areas around a pipeline, including, but not limited to, fishing, hunting, boating and birdwatching; or

(c) The lawful exercise of the right of ownership by an
owner of real property, including use, enjoyment and disposition
within the limits and under the conditions established by law.
