HOUSE BILL NO. 1498

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO COMPENSATE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE EMPLOYED IN A FULL-TIME INSTRUCTIONAL CAPACITY WITH RELEVANT CONTENT-SPECIFIC EXPERIENCE AND ASSISTANT TEACHERS WHO BECOME 5 LICENSED TEACHERS UP TO AN AMOUNT THAT IS EQUIVALENT TO THE SALARY 6 SCALE FOR LICENSED TEACHERS, AS DETERMINED BY ALLOCATING ONE AND ONE-HALF YEARS OF COMPARABLE CLASSROOM EXPERIENCE FOR EVERY TWO 7 YEARS OF RELEVANT EXPERIENCE THE INDIVIDUAL POSSESSES BEFORE 8 9 BECOMING EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR YEARS OF SERVICE PROVIDED AS AN ASSISTANT TEACHER BEFORE BECOMING A LICENSED 10 11 TEACHER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
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- 13 SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 14
- 15 37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the Mississippi Adequate
- Education Program for teachers' salaries in each county and 16
- 17 separate school district shall be determined and paid in
- accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in 18
- this subsection. For teachers holding the following types of 19
- 20 licenses or the equivalent as determined by the State Board of
- Education, and the following number of years of teaching 21
- 22 experience, the scale shall be as follows:

It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made 63 64 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the 65 funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 66 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal 67 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of 68 Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority 69 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 70 establish, administer and maintain the system.

All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no

- school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the local supplement paid to any
- 75 individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that
- 76 paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties
- 77 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school
- 78 year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health
- 79 and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the
- 80 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a
- 81 part of the amount of individual local supplement.
- The level of professional training of each teacher to be used
- 83 in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each
- 84 year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license
- 85 issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current
- 86 school year. Provided, however, that school districts are
- 87 authorized, in their discretion, to negotiate the salary levels
- 88 applicable to certificated employees who are receiving retirement
- 89 benefits from the retirement system of another state, and the
- 90 annual experience increment provided above in Section 37-19-7
- 91 shall not be applicable to any such retired certificated employee.
- 92 Except as otherwise provided, local school districts are
- 93 <u>authorized to compensa</u>te individuals who are employed in a
- 94 full-time instructional capacity, and who have provided
- 95 professional service in a specific area of expertise that is
- 96 relevant to the instruction to be provided in a public school
- 97 district, up to an amount that is equivalent to the salary scale

98	prescribed in this subsection for licensed teachers, as determined
99	by allocating one and one-half (1-1/2) years of comparable
L00	classroom experience for every two (2) years of relevant
L01	experience such individual possesses prior to becoming employed by
L02	a local school district. Such individuals must be licensed as

L22	(i) Any licensed teacher who has met the
L23	requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the
L24	National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is
L25	employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education
L26	as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall
L27	submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the
L28	certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be
L29	eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
L30	year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State
L31	Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be
L32	eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
L33	second term of the school year.
L34	(ii) A licensed nurse who has met the requirements
L35	and acquired a certificate from the National Board for
L36	Certification of School Nurses, Inc., and who is employed by a
L37	local school board or the State Board of Education as a school
L38	nurse and not as an administrator. The licensed school nurse
L39	shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education
L40	that the certificate was received before October 15 in order to be
L41	eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
L42	year, or the licensed school nurse shall submit the documentation
L43	to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order
L44	to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the
L45	second term of the school year. Provided, however, that the total

148	(iii) Any licensed school counselor who has met
149	the requirements and acquired a National Certified School
150	Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified
151	Counselors and who is employed by a local school board or the
152	State Board of Education as a counselor and not as an
153	administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall submit
154	documentation to the State Department of Education that the
155	endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be
156	eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school
157	year, or the licensed school counselor shall submit such
158	documentation to the State Department of Education prior to
159	February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary
160	supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
161	However, any school counselor who started the National Board for
162	Professional Teaching Standards process for school counselors
163	between June 1, 2003, and June 30, 2004, and completes the
164	requirements and acquires the Master Teacher certificate shall be
165	entitled to the master teacher supplement, and those counselors
166	who complete the process shall be entitled to a one-time
167	reimbursement for the actual cost of the process as outlined in
168	paragraph (b) of this subsection.
169	(iv) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and

audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a

171 Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American 172 Speech-Language-Hearing Association and any certified academic 173 language therapist (CALT) who has met the certification 174 requirements of the Academic Language Therapy Association and who 175 is employed by a local school board or is employed by a state 176 agency under the State Personnel Board. The licensed 177 speech-language pathologist and audiologist and certified academic 178 language therapist shall submit documentation to the State 179 Department of Education that the certificate or endorsement was 180 received before October 15 in order to be eligible for the full 181 salary supplement in the current school year, or the licensed 182 speech-language pathologist and audiologist and certified academic language therapist shall submit the documentation to the State 183 184 Department of Education before February 15 in order to be eligible 185 for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of 186 the school year. However, the total number of certified academic 187 language therapists eligible for a salary supplement under this 188 paragraph (iv) shall not exceed twenty (20). 189 (b) An employee shall be reimbursed for the actual cost 190 of completing each component of acquiring the certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for postgraduate 191 192 courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each

component, not to exceed four (4) components, for a teacher,

school counselor or speech-language pathologist and audiologist,

regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of

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196 the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any 197 private individual or entity may pay the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any 198 199 employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and 200 the State Department of Education shall reimburse the school 201 district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the process 202 resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. 203 private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing the 204 process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an 205 employee, the local school district may agree to directly 206 reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the 207 employee.

(c) All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local supplement to which employees with similar training and experience otherwise are entitled. However, an educational employee shall receive the salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for only one (1) of the qualifying certifications authorized under paragraph (a) of this

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- 221 subsection. No school district shall provide more than one (1)
- 222 annual salary supplement under the provisions of this subsection
- 223 to any one individual employee holding multiple qualifying
- 224 national certifications.
- 225 (d) If an employee for whom such cost has been paid, in
- 226 full or in part, by a local school district or private individual
- 227 or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement
- 228 process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or
- 229 individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district
- 230 or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or
- 231 her certificate or endorsement.
- 232 (3) The following employees shall receive an annual salary
- 233 supplement in the amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00),
- 234 plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other compensation to
- 235 which the employee may be entitled:
- 236 Effective July 1, 2016, if funds are available for that
- 237 purpose, any licensed teacher who has met the requirements and
- 238 acquired a Master Teacher Certificate from the National Board for
- 239 Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed in a public
- 240 school district located in one (1) of the following counties:
- 241 Claiborne, Adams, Jefferson, Wilkinson, Amite, Bolivar, Coahoma,
- 242 Leflore, Quitman, Sharkey, Issaquena, Sunflower, Washington,
- 243 Holmes, Yazoo and Tallahatchie. The salary supplement awarded
- 244 under the provisions of this subsection (3) shall be in addition

245 to the salary supplement awarded under the provisions of 246 subsection (2) of this section.

Teachers who meet the qualifications for a salary supplement under this subsection (3) who are assigned for less than one (1) full year or less than full time for the school year shall receive the salary supplement in a prorated manner, with the portion of the teacher's assignment to the critical geographic area to be determined as of June 15th of the school year.

- (4) (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Mississippi Performance-Based Pay (MPBP)" plan. In addition to the minimum base pay described in this section, only after full funding of MAEP and if funds are available for that purpose, the State of Mississippi may provide monies from state funds to school districts for the purposes of rewarding certified teachers, administrators and nonlicensed personnel at individual schools showing improvement in student test scores. The MPBP plan shall be developed by the State Department of Education based on the following criteria:
- (i) It is the express intent of this legislation
 that the MPBP plan shall utilize only existing standards of
 accreditation and assessment as established by the State Board of
 Education.
- 267 (ii) To ensure that all of Mississippi's teachers,
 268 administrators and nonlicensed personnel at all schools have equal
 269 access to the monies set aside in this section, the MPBP program

270 shall be designed to calculate each school's performance as 271 determined by the school's increase in scores from the prior 272 school year. The MPBP program shall be based on a standardized 273 scores rating where all levels of schools can be judged in a 274 statistically fair and reasonable way upon implementation. At the 275 end of each year, after all student achievement scores have been 276 standardized, the State Department of Education shall implement 277 the MPBP plan.

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To ensure all teachers cooperate in the (iii) spirit of teamwork, individual schools shall submit a plan to the local school district to be approved before the beginning of each school year beginning July 1, 2008. The plan shall include, but not be limited to, how all teachers, regardless of subject area, and administrators will be responsible for improving student achievement for their individual school.

The State Board of Education shall develop the processes and procedures for designating schools eligible to participate in the MPBP. State assessment results, growth in student achievement at individual schools and other measures deemed appropriate in designating successful student achievement shall be used in establishing MPBP criteria. The State Board of Education shall develop the MPBP policies and procedures and report to the Legislature and Governor by December 1, 2006.

(5) Beginning in the 2008-2009 school year, if funds (a) are available for that purpose, each school in Mississippi shall

- 297 for by the State Legislature in the amount of One Thousand Dollars

- 301 For the purposes of such funding, a beginning teacher shall be
- 302 defined as any teacher in any school in Mississippi that has less
- 303 than one (1) year of classroom experience teaching in a public
- 304 school. For the purposes of such funding, no full-time academic
- 305 teacher shall mentor more than two (2) beginning teachers.
- 306 (b) To be eligible for this state funding, the
- 307 individual school must have a classroom management program
- 308 approved by the local school board.
- 309 (6) Effective with the 2014-2015 school year, the school
- 310 districts participating in the Pilot Performance-Based
- 311 Compensation System pursuant to Section 37-19-9 may award
- 312 additional teacher and administrator pay based thereon.
- 313 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 314 and after July 1, 2020.
