HOUSE BILL NO. 1788 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO DIRECT THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER TO TRANSFER 2 \$50,000,000.00 TO THE MISSISSIPPI PANDEMIC RESPONSE BROADBAND 3 AVAILABILITY GRANT PROGRAM FUND; TO CREATE THE "MISSISSIPPI PANDEMIC RESPONSE BROADBAND AVAILABILITY ACT"; TO PROVIDE A 4 5 STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE INTENT AND FINDINGS; TO CREATE THE 6 "MISSISSIPPI PANDEMIC RESPONSE BROADBAND AVAILABILITY GRANT 7 PROGRAM FUND" AS A SPECIAL FUND IN THE STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR GRANTS TO MISSISSIPPI PUBLIC SCHOOL 8 9 DISTRICTS, INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS AND NATIVE AMERICAN TRIBAL SCHOOL 10 DISTRICTS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI PANDEMIC RESPONSE 11 BROADBAND AVAILABILITY GRANT PROGRAM SHALL BE ADMINISTERED BY THE 12 MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING 13 GRANTS TO ELIGIBLE SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND SCHOOLS TO PROVIDE THEM WITH GRANT MONIES FOR ELIGIBLE EXPENSES; TO DIRECT THE MISSISSIPPI 14 15 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES TO 16 GOVERN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM; TO PRESCRIBE THE 17 REQUIREMENTS FOR THE GRANTS; TO SPECIFY THAT THE USE OF GRANT 18 FUNDS SHALL BE SUBJECT TO AUDIT AND REGULATION OF THE MISSISSIPPI 19 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, AND NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE TERMS OF THE 20 GRANT SHALL REOUIRE REPAYMENT OF GRANT MONIES TO THE STATE; TO 21 SPECIFY THAT ALL MONIES SHALL BE DISBURSED FROM THIS SPECIAL FUND 22 IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CARES ACT AND 23 GUIDELINES FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE TREASURY 24 REGARDING THE USE OF MONIES FROM THE CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND; TO 25 TRANSFER UNDISTRIBUTED MONIES IN THE FUND AS OF DECEMBER 1, 2020, 26 TO THE UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FUND; TO PROVIDE THAT A 27 DECLARATION OF ANY PORTION OF THIS ACT AS INVALID SHALL NOT AFFECT 28 THE REMAINING PORTIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

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30 SECTION 1. Upon the effective date of this act, the State 31 Fiscal Officer shall transfer to the Mississippi Pandemic Response 32 Broadband Availability Grant Program Fund out of the 33 Budget Contingency Fund......\$ 50,000,000.00.

34 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Sections 2 through 5 of this act shall be known 35 and may be cited as the "Mississippi Pandemic Response Broadband 36 Availability Act."

37 **SECTION 3.** (1) The Legislature finds and declares that due 38 to the COVID-19 pandemic there is an immediate increased need for 39 reliable Internet service in Mississippi, including expanded 40 broadband access, to facilitate and assist with distance learning. 41 Therefore, the Mississippi Department of Education shall establish 42 the Mississippi Pandemic Response Broadband Availability Grant Program to provide grants to Mississippi public school districts, 43 independent schools and Native American tribal schools for the 44 45 purpose of expanding broadband access in the unserved areas of the 46 State of Mississippi.

47 (2) As used in this act, the following words and phrases
48 shall have the meanings ascribed in this section unless the
49 context clearly indicates otherwise:

50 (a) "Broadband access" means access to broadband
51 services as defined in Section 77-17-3(d).

52 (b) "COVID-19" means the Coronavirus Disease 2019.
53 (c) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of
54 Education.

No. 1788 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 20/HR12/R2360SG PAGE 2 (CAA\AM) 55 (3) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a special 56 fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Pandemic Response Broadband Availability Grant Program Fund," which shall consist of 57 funds made available by the Legislature in any manner and funds 58 59 from any other source designated for deposit into such fund. 60 Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any 61 62 investment earnings or interest earned on amounts in the fund 63 shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Monies in the fund 64 shall be used for the purpose of providing payments to eligible Mississippi public school districts, independent schools and 65 66 Native American tribal school districts as provided in this act. 67 Monies in the fund shall be administered and disbursed by the department in compliance with the guidelines, guidance, rules, 68 69 regulations and/or other criteria, as may be amended from time to 70 time, of the United States Department of the Treasury regarding 71 the use of monies from the Coronavirus Relief Fund established by 72 the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act. If on 73 December 1, 2020, there are undistributed monies in the fund, or 74 if at any other time undistributed monies in the fund are 75 determined by the department to be ineligible to be spent by the 76 department, those monies shall be transferred to the Unemployment 77 Compensation Fund.

78 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The department shall distribute grant
79 monies, without the requirement of application by school districts

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80 or schools, as equitably and efficiently as possible after 81 determining the unserved areas of the state using the latest 82 publicly available Federal Communications Commission broadband data, and after determining which and to what extent Mississippi 83 84 public school districts, independent schools and Native American 85 tribal school districts educate students living in such unserved 86 areas of the state. The Mississippi Department of Education shall 87 consult with the Mississippi Association of Independent Schools 88 and the administrations of the Native American tribal school districts in determining which and to what extent such schools and 89 90 schools districts educate students living in such unserved areas of the state. Any grant monies provided under this act shall be 91 92 spent by the recipient school district no later than December 1, 2020, or by such later date as may be specified in the quidelines, 93 quidance, rules, regulations and/or other criteria of the United 94 95 States Department of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from 96 the Coronavirus Relief Fund established in Section 5001 of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act. Grants shall 97 98 be conditioned on the school district or school broadband provider 99 agreements including that broadband capacity shall be expanded to 100 a significant extent for the district's or school's students 101 during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

102 (2) The department may develop regulations and procedures to103 govern the administration of the program.

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104 SECTION 5. (1) The grant monies distributed under this act 105 shall be used by school districts and schools to negotiate and 106 contract with existing or potential broadband providers to 107 increase or gain broadband access for the unserved areas where 108 their students reside. To achieve such increased broadband 109 access, the school districts and schools may utilize any broadband technology available to increase or gain broadband access in the 110 111 unserved areas.

(2) The use of grants shall be subject to audit by the United States Department of the Treasury's Office of Inspector General and the Mississippi Department of Education. A school district or school found to be fully or partially noncompliant with grant requirements shall return to the state all or a portion of the grant monies received. Recipient school districts and schools shall confirm their understanding of these terms.

119 (3) Mississippi public school districts, independent schools 120 and Native American tribal schools that receive grant monies under this act shall provide periodic project status reports to the 121 122 Mississippi Department of Education and any other documentation 123 that the Mississippi Department of Education determines is 124 necessary to ensure compliance with this act and the United States 125 Department of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from the 126 Coronavirus Relief Fund established in Section 5001 of the 127 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act.

If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or any part of this act is declared to be in conflict with federal law, or if for any reason is declared to be invalid or of no effect, the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases or parts thereof shall be in no manner affected thereby but shall remain in full force and effect.
