HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 47

- A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING EAGLE SCOUT JAMES
 ARMSTRONG ON EARNING 138 SCOUT MERIT BADGES, WHICH IS EVERY MERIT
 BADGE THAT THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA OFFERS AND THE MOST MERIT
 BADGES EARNED BY A PERSON IN THE HISTORY OF THE BOY SCOUTS OF
 AMERICA.
- 6 WHEREAS, James Armstrong, of Vaiden, Mississippi, and an
- 7 Eagle Scout since 2016, has earned 138 scout merit badges, which
- 8 is every merit badge offered by the Boy Scouts of America and the
- 9 most merit badges earned by a person in the history of the Boy
- 10 Scouts of America; and
- 11 WHEREAS, a dedicated scout, James has been a member of the
- 12 Scouts since beginning his scouting career in the Cub Scouts in
- 13 2008, from which he began his steady and persistent progress
- 14 through the Scouts rising to the rank of Boy Scout in 2013, and
- 15 continuing to earn merit badges until earning 91 merit badges when
- 16 he became an Eagle Scout at age 14 in 2016; and
- 17 WHEREAS, after becoming an Eagle Scout, James continued to
- 18 earn merit badges such as Aviation, Chemistry and Robotics until
- 19 he earned his 138th merit badge, which was in scuba diving and

- 20 required specialized training and travel to achieve, and among the
- 21 many projects James completed during his scouting career, his
- 22 Eagle project was replacing a gravel path to the Christ's Cross at
- 23 the Crossroads in Winona, Mississippi, with a seven foot concrete
- 24 ramp with handrails following Americans with Disabilities Act
- 25 (ADA) guidelines; and
- 26 WHEREAS, among his numerous scouting awards and various
- 27 leadership positions, James has also earned the Order of Arrow
- 28 Brotherhood which is the National Honor Society of the Boy Scouts
- 29 of America, and throughout the way he has demonstrated Scout
- 30 spirit through the Scout Oath and Scout Law, service and
- 31 leadership; and
- 32 WHEREAS, James Armstrong's time as a Scout will come to an
- and when he reaches 18 years of age on April 6, 2020, with him
- 34 having done everything he could have done as a Boy Scout and
- 35 having done what no other Boy Scout has done by earning 138 merit
- 36 badges; and
- 37 WHEREAS, in addition to being a one of a kind Boy Scout,
- 38 James is also an outstanding student at Winona High School, where
- 39 he is on the A Honor Roll and taking dual enrollment classes
- 40 through Holmes Community College, has a perfect attendance record
- 41 and is a member of the National Beta Club, Super Scholars, Mu
- 42 Alpha Theta, SkillsUSA, National Art Honors Society,
- 43 Superintendent's Advisory Council and National Society for High
- 44 School Scholars; and

45	WHEREAS, after graduating from high school in May 2020, James
46	plans to continue his education at Holmes Community College for
47	two years before heading to Mississippi State University to pursue
48	a degree in engineering; and
49	WHEREAS, James is a member of Vaiden Baptist Church and also
50	involved with many community activities such as Veterans Day
51	ceremonies, Flag Day ceremonies, Easter Service at Christ's Cross
52	at the Crossroads, Blue Star Dedication in Winona and Kilmichael,
53	the Christmas party at Winona Manor Nursing Home and Christmas
54	Parades in Vaiden, Kilmichael, Winona and Carrollton; and
55	WHEREAS, James is the son of Tim and Bobbie Armstrong who
56	have helped him in many ways during his time as a Scout and a
57	young man and he is the grandson of Johnnie and Purvie Weeks of
58	Pearl, Mississippi, and Joyce Armstrong and the late Joe Armstrong
59	of Vaiden, Mississippi; and
60	WHEREAS, as evidenced by his incredible achievements as a Boy
61	Scout, academic success and community involvement and service to
62	others, James Armstrong demonstrates his determination to prepare
