## SENATE BILL NO. 2045

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 3-3-15 AND 37-13-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES THAT RECEIVE STATE FUNDS AND PUBLIC COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES TO DISPLAY THE OFFICIAL STATE FLAG ON MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY OF EACH WEEK ON OR AT EACH BUILDING 5 IN WHICH AN OFFICE OF THE GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY IS LOCATED AND ON EACH CAMPUS OF EACH PUBLIC COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY OR SCHOOL 7 DISTRICT; TO REQUIRE THAT IF A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY OR A PUBLIC COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY OR SCHOOL DISTRICT IS NOT DISPLAYING THE 8 9 OFFICIAL STATE FLAG AS REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION, THE GOVERNOR 10 SHALL NOTIFY THE GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY OR THE PUBLIC COLLEGE OR 11 UNIVERSITY OR SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE NONCOMPLIANCE, AND THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER SHALL WITHHOLD ALL STATE FUNDING FOR SUCH PUBLIC 12 13 ENTITY UNTIL SUCH TIME AS IT IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION; TO PROVIDE THAT LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL 14 15 ENTITIES OR HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS SHALL NOT PROHIBIT THE DISPLAY 16 OF THE STATE FLAG ON PRIVATE PROPERTY OR PUBLIC PROPERTY WHICH IS 17 LEASED TO A PRIVATE ENTITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 19 SECTION 1. Section 3-3-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 20 21 3-3-15. (1) The official state flag \* \* \* shall be 22 displayed on Monday through Friday of each week from sunrise to 23 sunset on or at each building in which an office of a governmental 24 entity that receives state funds is located and on each campus of each public college or university or public school district; 25

- 28 campuses twenty-four (24) hours a day if properly illuminated.
- 29 The state flag should not be displayed when the weather is
- 30 inclement, except when an all-weather flag is displayed. The
- 31 state flag shall receive all of the respect and ceremonious
- etiquette given the American flag. \* \* \* However, nothing in this 32
- 33 section shall be construed so as to affect the precedence given to
- 34 the flag of the United States of America, and the state flag shall
- 35 never be displayed on a flagpole above the flag of the United
- 36 States of America.

- 37 (a) If the Governor receives notification or otherwise (2)
- 38 has knowledge that a governmental entity that receives state funds
- 39 or a public college or university or public school district is not
- 40 displaying the official state flag as required by subsection (1)
- 41 of this section, the Governor shall notify the governmental entity
- 42 or the public college or university or the public school district
- 43 in writing that:
- 44 (i) He has information indicating that the
- 45 governmental entity or the public college or university or public
- 46 school district is not in compliance with the requirements of
- 47 subsection (1) of this section; and
- 48 (ii) The governmental entity or the public college
- 49 or university or the public school district has thirty (30) days
- 50 to show to the satisfaction of the Governor that it is in

51	compliance with the requirements of subsection (1) of this
52	section.
53	(b) If the governmental entity or the public college or
54	university or public school district does not meet the
55	requirements of subsection (1) of this section, the Governor shall
56	direct (i) the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
57	Learning to withhold all state funds for the support of such
58	university or college, or (ii) the board of trustees of the
59	community or junior college district to withhold all state funds
60	for the support of such community college, or (iii) the local
61	school board to withhold all state funds for the support of such
62	school district, or (iv) the State Fiscal Officer to withhold all
63	state funds for the support of such governmental entity, as the
64	case may be, until such time as the university, college, public
65	school district or governmental entity complies with the
66	requirements of this section.
67	(c) The State Fiscal Officer, upon receipt of
68	notification from the Governor under paragraph (b) of this
69	subsection that a governmental entity or a public college or
70	university or public school district is not in compliance with the
71	requirements of subsection (1) of this section, shall withhold the
72	payment specified in paragraph (b) of this subsection until such
73	time as it is in compliance with the requirements of subsection
74	(1) of this section, as determined by the Governor.

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- 75 **SECTION 2.** Section 37-13-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 76 amended as follows:
- 77 37-13-5. (1) The flag of the State of Mississippi and the
- 78 flag of the United States shall be displayed in close proximity to
- 79 the school building at all times during the hours of daylight when
- 80 the school is in session when the weather will permit without
- 81 damage to the flag. It shall be the duty of the board of trustees
- 82 of the school district to provide for the flags and their display
- 83 in compliance with the provisions of Section 3-3-15.
- 84 (2) Whenever the flag of the United States is to be flown at
- 85 half-staff by order or instructions of the President or pursuant
- 86 to federal law, all public schools shall lower the United States
- 87 flag in accordance with the executive order or instructions or
- 88 federal law. The school shall announce the reason that the flag
- 89 is being flown at half-staff to all students in assembly or by
- 90 teachers in the various classrooms or by prominently displaying
- 91 written notice throughout the school stating the reason that the
- 92 flag has been lowered.
- 93 (3) In all public schools there shall be given a course of
- 94 study concerning the flag of the United States and the flag of the
- 95 State of Mississippi. The course of study shall include the
- 96 history of each flag and what they represent and the proper
- 97 respect therefor. There also shall be taught in the public
- 98 schools the duties and obligations of citizenship, patriotism,
- 99 Americanism and respect for and obedience to law.

100	<b>SECTION 3.</b> (1) A local unit of government shall not adopt
101	or enforce an ordinance, resolution, rule, or regulation that
102	prohibits the display of a flag of the United States or the state
103	flag of Mississippi on private property, including any public
104	property leased by a private entity, such as 16th section school
105	land As used in this section, "local unit of government" means a
106	county or municipality.

- 107 (2) A homeowners association or neighborhood association
  108 shall not adopt a resolution, rule, or regulation that prohibits
  109 the display of a flag of the United States or a state flag of
  110 Mississippi on private property.
- 111 (3) Nothing in this section shall be considered to permit
  112 any display or use that is inconsistent with any provision of
  113 Chapter 1, Title 4, United States Code, or any rule or custom
  114 pertaining to the proper display or use of the flag of the United
  115 States (as established pursuant to such chapter or any otherwise
  116 applicable provision of law).
- SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2020.
