## SENATE BILL NO. 2226

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-89-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO EXTEND THE DATE OF THE REPEAL ON THE PROVISION WHICH CREATES THE
- 3 INFANT MORTALITY REDUCTION COLLABORATIVE AND PROVIDES FOR ITS
- MEMBERSHIP; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 41-89-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, 6
- 7 is amended as follows:
- 41-89-21. (1) There is created the Infant Mortality 8
- Reduction Collaborative, to be composed of eleven (11) members as
- 10 follows:
- (a) The Chairman of the House Medicaid Committee or the 11
- 12 designee of the chairman;
- (b) The Chairman of the Senate Public Health and 13
- 14 Welfare Committee or the designee of the chairman;
- 15 (c) The State Health Officer or the designee of the
- health officer; 16
- 17 (d) The Director of the Division of Pharmacy of the
- 18 State Department of Health;

- 21 (f) The Pharmacy Director of the Division of Medicaid;
- 22 (g) Two (2) licensed physicians who are certified in
- 23 obstetrics and gynecology appointed by the State Health Officer;
- 24 (h) One (1) representative of the pharmaceutical
- 25 industry appointed by the State Health Officer;
- 26 (i) One (1) representative of private insurance
- 27 providers appointed by the Governor; and
- 28 (j) One (1) representative of the Blair E. Batson
- 29 Hospital for Children appointed by the Vice Chancellor for Health
- 30 Affairs of the University of Mississippi Medical Center.
- 31 (2) The State Health Officer shall be the chairman of the
- 32 Infant Mortality Reduction Collaborative. The collaborative shall
- 33 adopt bylaws and rules for its efficient operation, which may
- 34 include designation of its organizational structure including
- 35 other officers and committees, duties of officers and committees,
- 36 a process for selecting officers, quorum requirements for
- 37 committees, provisions for special or ad hoc committees, staff
- 38 policies and other such procedures as may be necessary. The
- 39 collaborative may establish committees responsible for conducting
- 40 specific collaborative programs or activities.
- 41 (3) The Infant Mortality Reduction Collaborative shall be
- 42 assigned to the State Department of Health for administrative

43	purposes	only,	and	the	department	shall	designate	staff	to	assist
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- 44 the collaborative.
- 45 (4) The Infant Mortality Reduction Collaborative shall meet
- 46 and conduct business at least quarterly. All meetings of the
- 47 collaborative and any committees of the collaborative shall be
- 48 open to the public, with opportunities for public comment provided
- 49 on a regular basis. Notice of all meetings shall be given as
- 50 provided in the Open Meetings Act (Section 25-41-1 et seq.) and
- 51 appropriate notice also shall be given to all persons so
- 52 requesting of the date, time and place of each meeting.
- 53 (5) The Infant Mortality Reduction Collaborative may apply
- 54 for and expend grants or other contributions for the purpose of
- 55 promoting maternal and infant health in Mississippi.
- 56 (6) The Infant Mortality Reduction Collaborative shall
- 57 annually make policy recommendations to the Legislature and
- 58 recommendations for regulatory changes to state agencies on the
- 59 following matters:
- 60 (a) Ensuring the availability, accessibility and
- 61 affordability of a hormonal supplement that is used to prevent
- 62 preterm deliveries in pregnant women;
- 63 (b) Ensuring access to preconception health care;
- (c) Reducing the number of early elective deliveries;
- 65 and
- 66 (d) The development of perinatal regions of care.

67	(7)	In	developing	its	recommendations,	the	collaborative	may
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- 68 consult with experts and shall examine actions taken in other
- 69 states.
- 70 (8) This section shall stand repealed on July 1,  $\star$  \* 2023.
- 71 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 72 and after July 1, 2020.
