## SENATE BILL NO. 2307 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 73-5-1, 73-5-3, 73-5-5, 73-5-7, 2 73-5-8, 73-5-9, 73-5-11, 73-5-12, 73-5-15, 73-5-17, 73-5-19, 73-5-21, 73-5-23, 73-5-25, 73-5-27, 73-5-29, 73-5-31, 73-5-33, 73-5-35, 73-5-37, 73-5-39, 73-5-41 AND 73-5-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE 3 4 OF 1972, WHICH CREATE AND EMPOWER THE STATE BOARD OF BARBER 5 6 EXAMINERS; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTION 73-5-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO MAKE A MINOR, NONSUBSTANTIVE CHANGE; TO REENACT AND AMEND 7 SECTION 73-5-45, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE AUTOMATIC 8 9 REPEALER ON THE REENACTED PROVISIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-5-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 12 reenacted as follows: 73-5-1. The State Board of Barber Examiners is continued and 13 14 reconstituted as follows: The Board of Barber Examiners shall 15 consist of five (5) members, to be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, one (1) member to be 16 17 appointed from each of the congressional districts as existing on January 1, 1991. Each member shall be a practical barber and a 18

qualified elector of this state. He shall have been engaged in

the practice of barbering in the State of Mississippi for at least

five (5) years immediately before the time of his appointment and

- 22 shall be a person of good moral character. From and after July 1,
- 23 1983, the appointments to the board shall be made in the manner
- 24 hereinafter provided, and the present members of the State Board
- of Barber Examiners whose terms have not expired by July 1, 1983,
- 26 shall continue to serve until their successors have been appointed
- 27 and qualified. The Governor shall appoint, with the advice and
- 28 consent of the Senate, five (5) members from the congressional
- 29 districts as follows: The member from the First Congressional
- 30 District shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years to
- 31 commence on July 1, 1983; the member from the Second Congressional
- 32 District shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years to
- 33 commence on July 1, 1984; the member from the Third Congressional
- 34 District shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years to
- 35 commence on July 1, 1983; the member from the Fourth Congressional
- 36 District shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years to
- 37 commence on July 1, 1984; and the member from the Fifth
- 38 Congressional District shall be appointed for a term of one (1)
- 39 year to commence on July 1, 1983. The members of the board as
- 40 constituted on July 1, 2002, whose terms have not expired shall
- 41 serve the balance of their terms, after which time the membership
- 42 of the board shall be appointed as follows: There shall be
- 43 appointed one (1) member of the board from each of the four (4)
- 44 Mississippi congressional districts as they currently exist, and
- 45 one (1) from the state at large, and the Governor shall make
- 46 appointments from the congressional district having the smallest

- 47 number of board members until the membership includes one (1)
- 48 member from each district as required. From and after July 1,
- 49 2002, no member of the board who is connected in any way with any
- 50 barbering school shall participate in the administration of
- 51 examinations of barber applicants. From and after July 1, 2004,
- 52 no member of the board shall be connected in any way with any
- 53 school in which barbering is taught.
- All members of the board shall be appointed by the Governor,
- 55 with the advice and consent of the Senate, for terms of four (4)
- 56 years each from the expiration date of the previous term, until
- 57 their successors have been appointed and qualified. No member of
- 58 the board shall hold any elected office. Appointments made to
- 59 fill a vacancy of a term shall be made by the Governor within
- 60 sixty (60) days after the vacancy occurs.
- The Governor may remove any one or more members of the board
- 62 for just cause. Members appointed to fill vacancies caused by
- 63 death, resignation or removal of any member or members shall serve
- 64 only for the unexpired term of their predecessors. Any member who
- does not attend two (2) consecutive meetings of the board for
- 66 reasons other than illness of the member shall be subject to
- 67 removal by the Governor. The president of the board shall notify
- 68 the Governor in writing when any such member has failed to attend
- 69 two (2) consecutive regular meetings.
- 70 **SECTION 2.** Section 73-5-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 71 reenacted as follows:

- 73-5-3. The board shall elect a president and secretary and shall adopt and use a common seal for the authentication of its records and orders. The secretary shall keep a record of all proceedings and acts of the board and an accurate account of all funds received and disbursed, which shall be considered as public records.
- The secretary shall execute and file with the Secretary of
  State a bond in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00)

  conditioned according to law, the bond to be made in a surety

  company authorized to do business in this state and approved by

  the Governor. The premium for the bond shall be paid out of the

  funds in the board's special fund in the State Treasury.
- A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum, and it is authorized to perform the requirements of this chapter at any regular or special meeting called for that purpose.
  - Each member of the board shall receive per diem in accordance with Section 25-3-69 when actually attending to the work of the board or any of its committees, and shall be reimbursed for traveling expenses in accordance with Section 25-3-41 in carrying out the provisions of this chapter. The board shall employ an executive director with compensation to be established by the State Personnel Board, and the executive director shall devote his or her full time to oversee all day-to-day operations of the board. The board may employ four (4) inspectors, one (1) to be appointed from each of the four (4) congressional districts, to

- 97 make periodic inspections of all barbershops throughout the state
- 98 and one (1) chief inspector to be appointed from the state at
- 99 large to supervise inspections and investigations statewide. The
- 100 board shall employ the necessary personnel to carry out the
- 101 provisions of this chapter, and maintain and pay the expenses of
- 102 an office to be located in the City of Jackson. All per diem,
- 103 salaries and expenses shall be paid exclusively from the funds in
- 104 the board's special fund, and salaries and expenses of personnel
- 105 may be disbursed monthly.
- The board shall require such of its employees as it may
- 107 consider necessary to make bond and file same with the Secretary
- 108 of State in such sums as it may consider necessary to protect the
- 109 interests of the barbers of the State of Mississippi and require
- 110 the faithful performance of their duties.
- SECTION 3. Section 73-5-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 112 reenacted as follows:
- 113 73-5-5. (1) All fees and any other monies received by the
- 114 board shall be deposited in a special fund that is created in the
- 115 State Treasury and shall be used for the implementation and
- 116 administration of this chapter when appropriated by the
- 117 Legislature for such purpose. The monies in the special fund
- 118 shall be subject to all provisions of the state budget laws that
- 119 are applicable to special fund agencies, and disbursements from
- 120 the special fund shall be made by the State Treasurer only upon
- 121 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer upon requisitions

- 122 signed by the president of the board and countersigned by the
- 123 secretary of the board. Any interest earned on this special fund
- 124 shall be credited by the State Treasurer to the fund and shall not
- 125 be paid into the State General Fund. Any unexpended monies
- 126 remaining in the special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall
- 127 not lapse into the State General Fund.
- 128 (2) The State Auditor shall audit the financial affairs of
- 129 the board and the transactions involving the special fund at least
- 130 once a year in the same manner as for other special fund agencies.
- 131 In addition, the Governor, in his discretion, shall have the power
- 132 from time to time to require an audit of the financial affairs of
- 133 the board, the same to be made by the State Auditor upon request
- 134 of the Governor. The Governor shall have the power to suspend any
- 135 member of the board who shall be found short in any account until
- 136 such time as it shall be definitely determined whether such
- 137 shortage was the result of an act of dishonesty on the part of the
- 138 member.
- SECTION 4. Section 73-5-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 140 reenacted as follows:
- 141 73-5-7. (1) The Board of Barber Examiners shall have
- 142 authority to make reasonable rules and regulations for the
- 143 administration of the provisions of this chapter. Provided,
- 144 however, that any and all rules and regulations relating to
- 145 sanitation shall, before adoption by the board, have the written
- 146 approval of the State Board of Health. The Board of Barber

147	Examiners shall adopt regulations for the guidance of registered
148	barbers in the operation of a shop and in the practice of
149	barbering except, however, it shall be optional with the
150	individual barber as to whether he or she uses a mug. Any member
151	or designee of the Board of Barber Examiners shall have the
152	authority to enter upon and inspect any barbershop or barber
153	school at anytime during business hours. A copy of the rules and
154	regulations of the State Board of Barber Examiners shall be
155	furnished to the owner or manager of each shop and barber school
156	affected by this chapter, and such copy shall be posted in a

conspicuous place in such barbershop or barber school.

- (2) The board shall have authority to establish rules and regulations governing schools of barbering in this state except those schools operated by a state institution of higher learning or by a public community or junior college. The board shall have further authority to establish curriculum for such regulated schools of barbering in this state.
- 164 Each regulated school of barbering shall submit the following 165 to the board before enrolling students:
- 166 The address of proposed school, and the type and (a) 167 size of building in which the school is to be located;
- The names and addresses of owners and officers of 168 (b) such school, and the names, addresses and instructor license 169 170 number of managers, supervisors and instructors of such school;
- 171 A list of equipment and teaching aids; and

- 172 (d) A copy of the contract to be used between the 173 school and the student.
- 174 All regulated schools of barbering in the State of
- 175 Mississippi shall be required to maintain a surety bond in the
- amount of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) to ensure that
- in the event a school ceases operation, that all unused tuition
- 178 fees will be refunded to the students concerned. This bond shall
- 179 remain in effect for the duration of the school's operation.
- 180 (3) The Board of Barber Examiners shall adopt rules and
- 181 regulations establishing a procedure for the processing and
- 182 investigation of complaints filed with the board. The board shall
- 183 keep records of all complaints, and such records shall indicate
- 184 the action taken on the complaints.
- 185 (4) The Board of Barber Examiners shall keep a record of its
- 186 proceedings relating to the issuance, refusal, suspension and
- 187 revocation of certificates of registration. The record shall also
- 188 contain the name, place of business and the residence of each
- 189 registered barber, and the date and number of his certificate of
- 190 registration. The record shall be open to public inspection at
- 191 all reasonable times.
- 192 **SECTION 5.** Section 73-5-8, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 193 reenacted as follows:
- 194 73-5-8. Any person is qualified to receive a certificate of
- 195 registration as a barber instructor who:
- 196 (a) Is eighteen (18) years of age or older;

197	(b) Is of good moral and temperate habits;
198	(c) Is able to read, write and speak English;
199	(d) Possesses a high school education or its
200	equivalent;
201	(e) Has successfully completed not less than fifteen
202	hundred (1500) hours at a barbering school approved by the State
203	Board of Barber Examiners and holds a valid certificate of
204	registration to practice barbering;
205	(f) Has (i) not less than two (2) years of active
206	experience as a registered barber and has successfully completed
207	not less than six hundred (600) hours of barber instructor
208	training at a school approved by the board, or (ii) less than two
209	(2) years of active experience as a registered barber and has
210	successfully completed not less than one thousand (1,000) hours of
211	barber instructor training at a school approved by the board; and
212	(g) Has passed a satisfactory examination conducted by
213	the board to determine his fitness to practice as a barber
214	instructor.
215	All persons who have received a certificate of registration
216	as a barber instructor from the board before July 1, 2002, shall
217	be considered to have met the requirements of this section, and
218	all those certificates of registration shall be renewable as
219	otherwise provided in this chapter.
220	The board will implement an active and inactive instructor

license. In order to renew an active license, instructors holding

- 222 an active license shall be required to submit proof of twelve (12)
- 223 hours of continuing education each year to the Board of Barber
- 224 Examiners. That education shall be acquired in classes or trade
- 225 shows teaching materials that are approved by the board.
- 226 Instructors holding an inactive license shall be required to
- 227 submit proof of twelve (12) hours continuing education before
- 228 upgrading to an active status.
- 229 **SECTION 6.** Section 73-5-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 230 reenacted as follows:
- 73-5-9. (1) No person shall practice or attempt to practice
- 232 barbering in the State of Mississippi without a certificate of
- 233 registration as a registered barber issued pursuant to the
- 234 provisions of this chapter.
- 235 (2) No person shall be a barber instructor in the State of
- 236 Mississippi without a certificate of registration as a barber
- 237 instructor issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.
- 238 (3) Any person or persons who violates any provision of this
- 239 chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable upon
- 240 conviction in a court of competent jurisdiction as follows:
- 241 (a) For the first offense, by a fine of not less than
- 242 Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars
- 243 (\$500.00);
- 244 (b) For the second offense, by a fine of not less than
- 245 Five Hundred One Dollars (\$501.00) nor more than One Thousand
- 246 Dollars (\$1,000.00);

247 (c) For the third and any later offense,	e, bv

- 248 imprisonment for not less than five (5) days nor more than six (6)
- 249 months in the county jail.
- 250 SECTION 7. Section 73-5-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 251 reenacted as follows:
- 252 73-5-11. (1) To be eligible for enrollment at a barbering
- 253 school approved by the Board of Barber Examiners, a person shall
- 254 have a high school education or its equivalent, and/or shall have
- 255 satisfactorily passed the ability-to-benefit examinations approved
- 256 by the U.S. Department of Education.
- 257 (2) Any person is qualified to receive a certificate of
- 258 registration to practice barbering:
- 259 Who is qualified under the provisions of this
- 260 chapter;
- 261 (b) Who is of good moral character and temperate
- 262 habits;
- 263 Who has completed not less than fifteen hundred
- 264 (1500) hours at a barbering school approved by the State Board of
- 265 Barber Examiners; and
- 266 Who has passed a satisfactory examination conducted
- 267 by the board of examiners to determine his fitness to practice
- 268 barbering.
- 269 (3) A temporary permit to practice barbering until the next
- 270 examination is given may be issued to a student who has completed
- 271 not less than fifteen hundred (1500) hours at a barbering school

- 272 approved by the Board of Barber Examiners. In no event shall a
- 273 person be allowed to practice barbering on a temporary permit
- 274 beyond the date the next examination is given, except because of
- 275 personal illness.
- SECTION 8. Section 73-5-12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 277 reenacted as follows:
- 278 73-5-12. Any cosmetologist who can read, write and speak
- 279 English and has successfully completed not less than fifteen
- 280 hundred (1500) hours in an accredited school of cosmetology, and
- 281 holds a valid, current license, shall be eligible to take the
- 282 barber examination to secure a certificate of registration as a
- 283 barber upon successfully completing six hundred (600) hours in a
- 284 barber school approved by the Board of Barber Examiners.
- 285 All fees for application, examination, registration and
- 286 renewal thereof shall be the same as provided for in this chapter.
- SECTION 9. Section 73-5-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 288 reenacted as follows:
- 289 73-5-15. Each applicant for an examination shall:
- 290 Make application to the Board of Barber Examiners on blank
- 291 forms prepared and furnished by the board, such application to
- 292 contain proof under the applicant's oath for the particular
- 293 qualifications of the applicant; and,
- 294 Furnish to the board, at the time of the filing of such
- 295 application, two (2) five-inch (5") X three-inch (3") signed
- 296 photographs of the applicant, one (1) to accompany the

297	application, and one (1) to be returned to the applicant to be
298	presented to the board when the applicant appears for examination;
299	and,
300	Pay to the board the required fee.
301	Each application or filing made under this section shall
302	include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
303	accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.
304	SECTION 10. Section 73-5-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
305	reenacted as follows:
306	73-5-17. The Board of Barber Examiners shall conduct
307	examinations of applicants for certificates of registration to
308	practice as registered barbers not less than three (3) times a
309	year, which examination shall be had in some town or city selected
310	by the examining board. Examinations of applicants for
311	certificates of registration as barber instructors shall be
312	conducted at a time and place selected by the examining board.
313	The examination of applicants for certificates of
314	registration as registered barbers shall include both a practical
315	demonstration and a written and oral test, and shall embrace the
316	subjects usually practiced in a duly licensed shop of Mississippi
317	under the direct and personal supervision of a registered barber.
318	The examination of applicants for certificates of registration as
319	barber instructors shall include such subjects as the board deems

necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to practice as a

barber instructor.

- 322 **SECTION 11.** Section 73-5-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 323 reenacted as follows:
- 324 73-5-19. Whenever the applicable provisions of this chapter
- 325 have been complied with, the Board of Barber Examiners shall issue
- 326 a certificate of registration as a registered barber or barber
- 327 instructor, as the case may be.
- 328 **SECTION 12.** Section 73-5-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 329 reenacted as follows:
- 330 73-5-21. Any person possessed of the following
- 331 qualifications shall, upon payment of the required fee, receive a
- 332 certificate of registration as a registered barber:
- 333 (a) Is at least eighteen (18) years old;
- 334 (b) Is of good moral character and temperate habits;
- 335 and
- 336 (c) Either has a license or certificate of registration
- 337 as a practicing barber in another state or country that has
- 338 substantially the same requirements for licensing or registration
- of barbers as are contained in this chapter, or can prove by sworn
- 340 affidavits that he has lawfully practiced as a barber in another
- 341 state or country for at least five (5) years immediately before
- 342 making application in this state, or can show to the satisfaction
- 343 of the board that he had held a rating in a branch of the military
- 344 service for two (2) or more years that required him to perform the
- 345 duties of a barber. The issuance of a certificate of registration

- 346 by reciprocity to a military-trained applicant or military spouse
- 347 shall be subject to the provisions of Section 73-50-1.
- In addition to the above, the board may require the applicant
- 349 to successfully demonstrate sufficient knowledge of the Barber Law
- 350 of the State of Mississippi, as well as sufficient practical skill
- 351 by requiring the applicant to take a practical examination
- 352 approved by the board.
- 353 **SECTION 13.** Section 73-5-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 354 reenacted as follows:
- 355 73-5-23. (1) Every holder of a certificate of registration
- 356 as a registered barber shall display it in a conspicuous place
- 357 adjacent to or near his or her work chair, and in plain view of
- 358 the patrons of the shop in which he or she is engaged at work.
- 359 (2) It shall be the responsibility of all owners, managers,
- 360 or persons in charge of a barbershop at the time of an inspection
- 361 to ensure that all licenses are displayed at all times.
- 362 (3) Any owner or barber found in violation of this section
- 363 shall be fined not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more
- 364 than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).
- 365 **SECTION 14.** Section 73-5-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 366 reenacted as follows:
- 367 73-5-25. (1) The Board of Barber Examiners may refuse to
- 368 issue, or may suspend definitely or indefinitely, or revoke any
- 369 certificate of registration or license for any one (1) or a
- 370 combination of the following causes:

371	(a) Conviction of a felony shown by a certified copy of
372	the judgment of court in which such conviction is had, unless upon
373	a full and unconditional pardon of such convict, and upon
374	satisfactory showing that such convict will in the future conduct
375	himself in a law-abiding way.

- 377 (c) Continued practice by a person knowingly having an

Gross malpractice or gross incompetency.

378 infectious or contagious disease.

(b)

- 379 (d) Advertising, practicing or attempting to practice 380 under a trade name or name other than one's own.
- 381 (e) Habitual drunkenness or habitual addiction to the 382 use of morphine, cocaine or habit-forming drug, or any other 383 illegal controlled substances.
- 384 (f) Immoral or unprofessional conduct.
- 385 (g) Violation of regulations that may be prescribed as 386 provided for in Sections 73-5-7 through 73-5-43.
- 387 In addition to the causes specified in subsection (1) of (2)this section, the board shall be authorized to suspend the 388 389 certificate of registration of any person for being out of 390 compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section 391 93-11-153. The procedure for suspension of a certificate for 392 being out of compliance with an order for support, and the 393 procedure for the reissuance or reinstatement of a certificate 394 suspended for that purpose, and the payment of any fees for the 395 reissuance or reinstatement of a certificate suspended for that

396	purpose, shall be governed by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163. If
397	there is any conflict between any provision of Section 93-11-157
398	or 93-11-163 and any provision of this chapter, the provisions of
399	Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be, shall control.
400	SECTION 15. Section 73-5-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
401	reenacted as follows:
402	73-5-27. The Board of Barber Examiners may neither refuse to
403	suspend or revoke, nor revoke or suspend any certificate of
404	registration as a registered barber or barber instructor, for any
405	of the causes enumerated in this chapter, unless the holder of
406	such certificate has been given at least twenty (20) days' notice,
407	in writing by registered mail, signed by the President and
408	Secretary of the Board of Barber Examiners, setting forth the
409	charges against such holder of such certificate and naming the
410	time and place for a hearing upon the charge or charges, and a
411	public hearing thereof by the Board of Barber Examiners. The
412	person shall return a written response within ten (10) business
413	days acknowledging receipt of the letter and confirmation of
414	attendance at the board hearing no later than the close of
415	business of the tenth day.
416	Upon the hearing of any such charge or charges the board may
417	issue all subpoenas for all necessary witnesses for and against
418	the accused, and require their attendance upon such hearing, may
419	administer oaths, and may procure by process the production of all

- necessary books and papers, bearing or touching upon such charges against the accused.
- SECTION 16. Section 73-5-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:
- 73-5-29. The fee for taking an examination as a registered
- 425 barber shall be in the sum of not more than Fifty-five Dollars
- 426 (\$55.00), and the further sum of not more than Forty-five Dollars
- 427 (\$45.00) shall be required for the issuance of a certificate for
- 428 the registered barber. The fee for taking an examination as a
- 429 registered barber instructor shall be in the sum of not more than
- 430 Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00), and the further sum of not more than
- 431 Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) shall be required for the issuance of a
- 432 certificate of registration for the registered barber instructor.
- 433 A fee of not more than One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) shall
- 434 be required for the issuance of a certificate of registration to a
- 435 practicing barber of another state as authorized by Section
- 436 73-5-21. Likewise, an annual renewal fee payable on the
- 437 anniversary date of the issuance of each certificate of
- 438 registration as a registered barber of not more than Forty-five
- 439 Dollars (\$45.00) shall be charged for the issuance of the renewal
- 440 of the certificate; an annual renewal fee payable on the
- 441 anniversary date of the issuance of each certificate of
- 442 registration as a registered barber instructor of not more than
- 443 Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) shall be charged for the issuance of the
- 444 renewal of the certificate; however, the renewal fee for a

445	registered barber and barber instructor who is sixty-five (65)
446	years of age or older shall be not more than Thirty Dollars
447	(\$30.00). No renewal fee shall be charged for registered barbers
448	and barber instructors who are at least seventy-two (72) years of
449	age. A fee of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each year or any portion
450	thereof in addition to payment of all unpaid renewal fees in
451	arrears and the regular renewal fee shall be required for the
452	restoration of expired certificates of registration issued
453	pursuant to this chapter. Additionally, in order to restore any
454	certificate of registration issued under this chapter that has
455	been expired for a period of five (5) years or longer, the holder
456	thereof must retake and pass the appropriate examination. A
457	penalty of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) in addition to payment of all
458	unpaid renewal fees in arrears and the regular renewal fee shall
459	be required for the restoration of certificates that have expired
460	for a period of thirty (30) to sixty (60) days. A penalty of
461	Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) in addition to payment of all unpaid
462	renewal fees in arrears and the regular renewal fee shall be
463	required for the restoration of certificates that have been
