SENATE BILL NO. 2389

AN ACT TO CREATE THE "TELECOMMUNICATIONS FRAUD PREVENTION AND UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROTECTION ACT"; TO DEFINE CERTAIN TERMS USED IN THE ACT; TO PROVIDE FOR THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION IN CARRYING OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS 5 ACT; TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION TO EMPLOY FRAUD AND ENFORCEMENT AGENTS; TO AUTHORIZE THE FRAUD AND ENFORCEMENT AGENTS TO ENFORCE 7 AND INVESTIGATE VIOLATIONS OF THE TELEPHONE SOLICITATION ACT, CALLER ID ANTI-SPOOFING ACT, AUTOMATIC DIALING-ANNOUNCING DEVICES 8 ACT, UNSOLICITED RESIDENTIAL TELEPHONIC SALES CALLS ACT, AND 9 10 CERTAIN UNLAWFUL ACTS AND CRIMES; TO GRANT LAW ENFORCEMENT POWERS TO THE FRAUD AND ENFORCEMENT AGENTS; TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION 11 12 TO PURCHASE ALL NECESSARY EQUIPMENT TO ENFORCE THE PROVISIONS OF 13 THIS ACT; TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION TO PROVIDE MUTUAL AID AND TO COOPERATE WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES; TO PROHIBIT THE 14 1.5 EXPANSION OF ANY REGULATORY JURISDICTION OF THE COMMISSION; AND 16 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 18 SECTION 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be 19 cited as the "Telecommunications Fraud Prevention and Utility 20 Infrastructure Protection Act." SECTION 2. Public policy. It is hereby declared to be the 21 22 policy of the State of Mississippi that deceptive, scam, 23 telemarketing and fraudulent activities by way of 24 telecommunications and other means are negatively impacting the 25 citizens of the state resulting in massive monetary and property S. - 26 losses and that additional action by the Public Service Commission
- 27 is needed to protect Mississippians, especially vulnerable
- 28 populations, from imposters using telecommunications to defraud
- 29 consumers by identifying those involved and investigating these
- 30 actions to the fullest to stop such criminal activity.
- It is further declared to be the policy of the State of
- 32 Mississippi that the safe, reliable delivery of public utility
- 33 service across the state is made possible by properly protected
- 34 public utility infrastructure and that the Public Service
- 35 Commission is appropriately positioned to aid law enforcement
- 36 efforts to investigate destructive acts against public utility
- 37 critical infrastructure, property and theft of utility service.
- 38 **SECTION 3. Construction of act.** Nothing in this act shall
- 39 be construed to increase, in any way, the regulatory jurisdiction
- 40 of the commission as said jurisdiction is defined in Section
- 41 77-3-1 et seq. or any duty or ability to supervise any public
- 42 utility other than such laws as are in effect at the time of
- 43 passage or to in any way supersede or infringe upon any authority
- 44 granted any state agency or law enforcement agency.
- 45 **SECTION 4. Definitions.** Whenever used in this act unless
- 46 expressly stated otherwise:
- 47 (a) The term "person" means individual, firm,
- 48 copartnership, corporation, company, association or joint-stock
- 49 association, and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee or
- 50 personal representative thereof.

- 53 (c) The term "telecommunications" means any apparatus
- 54 that facilitates voice or text communication over a distance by
- 55 cable, wire, voice over internet protocol, cellular or wireless
- 56 networks, or any other facility that allows voice or text
- 57 communication between two (2) or more persons.
- 58 (d) The term "public utility infrastructure" means any
- 59 apparatus, equipment or property of a public utility that
- 60 facilitates the provision of public utility services in the State
- 61 of Mississippi.
- (e) The term "fraud and enforcement agent" means any
- 63 person employed or designated by the commission as a fraud and
- 64 enforcement agent as described by the terms of this act.
- (f) The term "subject acts" means the Mississippi
- 66 Telephone Solicitation Act, Section 77-3-701 et seq.; the
- 67 Unsolicited Residential Telephonic Sales Calls Act, Section
- 68 77-3-601 et seq.; the Caller ID Anti-Spoofing Act, Section
- 69 77-3-801 et seq.; and the Automatic Dialing-Announcing Devices
- 70 Act, Section 77-3-451 et seq.
- 71 **SECTION 5. Powers and duties of the commission.** For the
- 72 purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act, the commission
- 73 shall have the power:
- 74 (a) To enter into joint investigative agreements and to
- 75 coordinate and cooperate in any investigation requested by any

- 78 (b) To administer, execute and enforce all other
- 79 provisions of this act, to make necessary orders in connection
- 80 therewith, and to prescribe rules, regulations and procedures for
- 81 such administration.
- 82 SECTION 6. Public Service Commission fraud and enforcement
- 83 agents; qualifications. For the purpose of enforcing the
- 84 provisions of this act and subject acts, the commission is
- 85 authorized to employ or designate fraud and enforcement agents,
- 86 who shall be under the supervision of the commission. Each fraud
- 87 and enforcement agent shall be qualified by experience and
- 88 training in law enforcement or investigative work and shall be
- 89 certified as a law enforcement officer, in accordance with Section
- 90 45-6-11. The commission shall give preference in hiring to
- 91 persons with previous law enforcement experience. All fraud and
- 92 enforcement agents shall be appointed by the commission and shall
- 93 be subject to removal at any time by the commission.
- 94 SECTION 7. Duties of Public Service Commission fraud and
- 95 **enforcement agents.** Fraud and enforcement agents shall have the
- 96 authority to enforce and investigate any alleged violations of the
- 97 Mississippi Telephone Solicitation Act, Caller ID Anti-Spoofing
- 98 Act, Automatic Dialing-Announcing Devices Act, Unsolicited
- 99 Residential Telephonic Sales Calls Act and the rules, regulations
- 100 and general orders of the commission promulgated to administer and

- 105 representation to receive money or valuable property;
- 106 (b) Sections 97-19-21 through 97-19-27, which relate to
- 107 procuring, furnishing, and receiving money, goods, or services
- 108 with the intent to defraud;
- 109 (c) Section 43-47-19, which relates to exploitation of
- 110 a vulnerable person;
- 111 (d) Section 97-29-45, which relates to obscene
- 112 electronic telecommunications;
- 113 (e) Section 97-23-19, which relates to embezzlement;
- 114 (f) Section 97-45-19, which relates to identity theft;
- 115 (g) Section 97-19-13, which relates to credit card
- 116 theft;
- 117 (h) Section 97-19-83, which relates to mail fraud;
- 118 (i) Section 97-45-3, which relates to computer fraud;
- 119 (j) Section 97-45-15, which relates to cyberstalking;
- 120 (k) Sections 97-7-43 through 97-7-44, which relate to
- 121 impersonating a public officer or employee;
- 122 (1) Sections 97-1-1 through 97-1-9, which relate to
- 123 conspiracy, accessories and attempts but limited to the unlawful

138	SECTION 8. Authority of fraud and enforcement agents. (1)
139	Fraud and enforcement agents shall have the powers of a law
140	enforcement officer of this state, and shall have the right to
141	bear arms, investigate crimes, subject to the limitations of this
142	act, serve and execute search warrants, conduct civil asset
143	forfeiture as authorized under existing law in conjunction with
144	the Attorney General, and other valid legal process, and make
145	arrests.
146	(2) Fraud and enforcement agents shall have the authority to

aid and assist any law enforcement officer whose life or safety is

in jeopardy. With the approval of the commission or its

designees, fraud and enforcement agents may assist other law

- enforcement agencies in searching for convicted felons who have escaped or for alleged felons.
- 152 Upon request by any law enforcement agency, the 153 Mississippi Highway Patrol, a sheriff of any county or the chief 154 of police of any municipality, the Attorney General, Secretary of 155 State, State Auditor, District Attorney, any municipal or county 156 prosecuting attorney, or any public utility, fraud and enforcement 157 agents, with the consent of the commission or its designees, shall 158 have the authority to assist in any investigation related to any 159 crime, subject to the limitations of this act. Furthermore, fraud 160 and enforcement agents upon approval by the commission or its designees shall have the authority to assist any law enforcement 161 162 agency or political subdivision of the state during time of 163 natural disasters such as hurricanes, tornados or floods.
- (4) Nothing in this act shall be construed as granting the commission or its fraud and enforcement agents general police powers, except those powers and authorities enumerated in this act.
- 168 (5) Specifically, the commission at the request of the
 169 Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Auditor or any other
 170 agency or officer of the state shall cooperate and assist in any
 171 investigation, subject to the limitations of this act.
- SECTION 9. Purchase of necessary equipment authorized. The commission is hereby authorized and empowered to purchase, subject to its budget set by the Legislature, all necessary equipment to

- SECTION 10. Cooperation with other agencies authorized and encouraged. For the purpose of administering and enforcing the provisions of this act, the commission shall have the power to provide mutual aid and is encouraged and empowered to cooperate with any other law enforcement agencies in a manner consistent with the enforcement of this act.
- regulatory jurisdiction. Nothing in this act or any rules,
 regulations, or order of the commission administering this act
 shall at any time be deemed to expand any regulatory authority or
 supervisory jurisdiction of the commission beyond existing state
 or federal law concerning public utilities as defined in Section
 77-3-1 et seq.
- 190 **SECTION 12.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 191 and after its passage.
