## SENATE BILL NO. 2408

- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 75-29-951, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM ANNUAL GROSS SALES FOR A COTTAGE FOOD 3 OPERATION FROM TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS TO THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS TO BE EXEMPT FROM FOOD ESTABLISHMENT PERMIT FEES; TO
- 5 AUTHORIZE A COTTAGE FOOD OPERATION TO ADVERTISE COTTAGE FOOD PRODUCTS OVER THE INTERNET, INCLUDING THROUGH SOCIAL MEDIA; AND 6
- 7 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 75-29-951, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 75-29-951. (1) (a) A cottage food operation must comply
- with the applicable requirements of this section but is exempt 12
- 13 from the permitting requirements of Section 41-3-18 if the cottage
- 14 food operation complies with this section and has annual gross
- sales of cottage food products that do not exceed \* \* \* Fifty 15
- 16 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).
- 17 (b) For purposes of this subsection, a cottage food
- 18 operation's annual gross sales include all sales of cottage food
- products at any location, regardless of the types of products sold 19
- 20 or the number of persons involved in the operation. A cottage

- 21 food operation must provide the department, upon request, with
- 22 written documentation to verify the operation's annual gross
- 23 sales.
- 24 (2) A cottage food operation may not sell or offer for sale
- 25 cottage food products over the Internet, by mail order, or at
- 26 wholesale or to a retail establishment; however, this does not
- 27 prohibit the advertising of cottage food products over the
- 28 internet, including through social media. Cottage food products
- 29 are nonpotentially hazardous food products as defined by the
- 30 department.
- 31 (3) A cottage food operation may only sell cottage food
- 32 products which are prepackaged with a label affixed that contains
- 33 the following information:
- 34 (a) The name and address of the cottage food
- 35 operation \* \* \*;
- 36 (b) The name of the cottage food product \* \* \*;
- 37 (c) The ingredients of the cottage food product, in
- 38 descending order of predominance by weight \* \* \*;
- 39 (d) The net weight or net volume of the cottage food
- 40 product \* \* \*;
- 41 (e) Allergen information as specified by federal
- 42 labeling requirements \* \* \*;
- 43 (f) \* \* \* Appropriate nutritional information as
- 44 specified by federal labeling requirements, if any nutritional
- 45 claim is made \* \* \*; and

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- 47 ten-point type in a color that provides a clear contrast to the
- 48 background of the label: "Made in a cottage food operation that
- 49 is not subject to Mississippi's food safety regulations."
- 50 (4) This section does not exempt a cottage food operation
- 51 from any federal tax law, rule, regulation, or certificate that
- 52 applies to all cottage food operations.
- 53 (5) (a) The department may investigate any complaint \* \* \*
- 54 that alleges that a cottage food operation has violated an
- 55 applicable provision of this section or rule adopted under this
- 56 section.
- 57 (b) Only upon receipt of a complaint, the department's
- 58 authorized officer or employee may enter and inspect the premises
- 59 of a cottage food operation to determine compliance with this
- 60 section and department rules. A cottage food operation's refusal
- 61 to permit the department's authorized officer or employee entry to
- 62 the premises or to conduct the inspection is grounds for
- 63 disciplinary action pursuant to Section 41-3-59.
- 64 (6) This section does not apply to a person operating under
- a food permit issued pursuant to Section 41-3-18.
- 66 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 67 and after July 1, 2020.
