SENATE BILL NO. 2419

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1-1-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE DISTRIBUTION OF SETS OF THE MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972 IN
- 3 ANY FORMAT BY THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON COMPILATION, REVISION AND
- 4 PUBLICATION OF LEGISLATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 1-1-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 1-1-11. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this
- 9 section, the Joint Committee on Compilation, Revision and
- 10 Publication of Legislation shall distribute or provide for the
- 11 distribution of the sets of the compilation of the Mississippi
- 12 Code of 1972 purchased by the state as follows:
- 13 Fifty-seven (57) sets to the Mississippi House of
- 14 Representatives and forty (40) sets to the Mississippi Senate for
- 15 the use of the Legislative Reference Bureau, Legislative Services
- 16 Offices, staffs and committees thereof.
- Ten (10) sets to the Governor's Office; nine (9) sets to the
- 18 Secretary of State; and twenty (20) sets to the Auditor's Office.

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         One (1) set to each of the following: the Lieutenant
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    Governor; each member of the Legislature; the Treasurer; each
    district attorney; each county attorney; each judge of the Court
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    of Appeals and each judge of the Supreme, circuit, chancery,
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    county, * * * justice and municipal courts; each Mississippi
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    Senator and Mississippi Representative in Congress; State
    Superintendent of Education; Director of the Department of Finance
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    and Administration; * * * the Commissioner of Agriculture and
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    Commerce; each Mississippi Transportation Commissioner; * * * the
    Insurance Commissioner; the Clerk of the Supreme Court; the State
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    Board of Health; each circuit clerk; each chancery clerk in the
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    state for the use of the chancery clerk and the board of
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    supervisors; each sheriff in the state for the use of his office
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    and the county officers; and each county for the county library
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    (and an additional set shall be given to each circuit clerk,
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    chancery clerk, sheriff and county library in counties having two
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    (2) judicial districts).
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         Six (6) sets to the Performance Evaluation and Expenditure
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    Review (PEER) Committee; three (3) sets to the Director of the
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    Legislative Budget Office; six (6) sets to the Department of
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    Corrections; two (2) sets to the Department of Archives and
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    History; two (2) sets to the State Soil and Water Conservation
    Commission; sixty-eight (68) sets to the Attorney General's
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    office; six (6) sets to the Public Service Commission; four (4)
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sets to the Public Utilities Staff; thirty-five (35) sets to the

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- 44 Department of Revenue; one (1) set to the Board of Tax Appeals;
- 45 two (2) sets to the State Personnel Board; six (6) sets to the
- 46 State Law Library; one (1) set to the Library of Congress; ten
- 47 (10) sets to the University of Mississippi Law School; one (1) set
- 48 each to the Mississippi School for the Deaf and the Mississippi
- 49 School for the Blind; one (1) set each to the University of
- 50 Mississippi, Mississippi State University, Mississippi University
- 51 for Women, University of Southern Mississippi, Delta State
- 52 University, Alcorn State University, Jackson State University,
- 53 Mississippi Valley State University, and the Board of Trustees of
- 54 State Institutions of Higher Learning; and one (1) set to the
- 55 Supreme Court judges' conference room. In furtherance of the
- 56 State Library's reciprocal program of code exchange with libraries
- 57 of the several states, the joint committee shall, at the direction
- 58 and only upon the written request of the State Librarian,
- 59 distribute or provide for the distribution of sets of the code to
- 60 such libraries.
- One (1) set to each state junior or community college; three
- 62 (3) sets to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks; two
- 63 (2) sets to the Department of Environmental Quality; two (2) sets
- 64 to the Department of Marine Resources; two (2) sets to the
- 65 Mississippi Ethics Commission; six (6) sets to the Mississippi
- 66 Workers' Compensation Commission; four (4) sets to the State
- 67 Department of Rehabilitation Services; and seven (7) sets to the
- 68 Department of Human Services. One (1) set to each of the

- 69 following: State Textbook Procurement Commission; University
- 70 Medical Center; State Library Commission; Department of
- 71 Agriculture and Commerce; Forestry Commission; and seventeen (17)
- 72 sets to the Department of Public Safety. Also, one (1) set to
- 73 each of the following: Adjutant General, Mississippi Development
- 74 Authority, Department of Banking and Consumer Finance, Bureau of
- 75 Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, the State
- 76 Educational Finance Commission, the Mississippi Board of
- 77 Vocational and Technical Education, Division of Medicaid, State
- 78 Board of Mental Health, and Department of Youth Services.
- 79 The joint committee is authorized to distribute or provide
- 80 for the distribution of additional sets of the Mississippi Code,
- 81 not to exceed three (3) sets, to the office of each district
- 82 attorney for the use of his assistants.
- The joint committee shall provide to the Mississippi House of
- 84 Representatives and the Mississippi Senate the annual supplements
- 85 to the Mississippi Code of 1972 for each set of the code
- 86 maintained by the House and Senate.
- 87 * * *
- An elected or appointed officeholder in the State of
- 89 Mississippi, except for a member of the Legislature, shall deliver
- 90 to his successor in office, or to the joint committee if there is
- 91 no successor, the set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 provided the
- 92 officeholder under this section.

93	Before the joint committee delivers or provides for delivery
94	of a copy of the Mississippi Code of 1972 to an individual
95	officeholder, the joint committee shall prepare and submit a
96	written agreement to the officeholder. The agreement shall, among
97	other provisions, state that the code is the property of the State
98	of Mississippi, that it shall be transferred to the officeholder's
99	successor in office, that the officeholder has an obligation to
100	make such transfer and that the officeholder shall be responsible
101	for the failure to deliver the code and for any damage or
102	destruction to the code, normal wear and tear excepted. The joint
103	committee shall execute the agreement and forward it to the
104	officeholder for execution. The joint committee shall not deliver
105	or provide for delivery of the code to the officeholder until the
106	executed agreement is received by the committee. The joint
107	committee may include in the agreement such other provisions as it
108	may deem reasonable and necessary. In addition to damages or any
109	other remedy for not transferring a set of the code to his
110	successor, an officeholder who does not transfer his set of the
111	code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction,
112	pay a fine of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Upon request of
113	the joint committee, the Attorney General shall assist the joint
114	committee in taking such actions as necessary to require an
115	officeholder to transfer the set of code provided under this
116	section to his successor, or to the joint committee if there is no
117	successor, and to recover reimbursement or damages from any

- 119 volumes of the set of the code provided under this section, other
- 120 than normal wear and tear.
- 121 Replacement of missing, damaged or destroyed sets or volumes
- 122 of the code provided by this chapter may be obtained from the code
- 123 publisher through the joint committee at the established state
- 124 cost, the cost to be borne by the recipient.
- No more than one (1) set of the Mississippi Code of 1972
- 126 shall be furnished to any one (1) individual, regardless of the
- 127 office or offices he may hold.
- 128 (2) * * * The sets of actual bound volumes of the
- 129 Mississippi Code of 1972 * * * referenced in subsection (1) shall
- 130 be provided to each elected state official, elected state district
- 131 official and member of the Legislature * * * upon written request
- 132 by the official or member of the Legislature * * * to the Joint
- 133 Committee on Compilation, Revision and Publication of
- 134 Legislation * * *.
- 135 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 136 and after July 1, 2020.
