SENATE BILL NO. 2508

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-159-1, 37-159-5, 37-159-7, 2 37-159-9, 37-159-11, 37-159-13 AND 37-159-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 3 1972, TO DELETE THE INDIVIDUAL AUTOMATIC REPEALERS ON THE PROVISIONS THAT CONSTITUTE THE "MISSISSIPPI CRITICAL TEACHER 4 5 SHORTAGE ACT OF 1998"; TO CREATE NEW SECTION 37-159-19, 6 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF REPEAL ON SECTIONS 7 37-159-1 THROUGH 37-159-17; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 37-159-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows: 11 37-159-1. This act [Laws of 1998, Chapter 544] shall be known and may be cited as the "Mississippi Critical Teacher 12 Shortage Act of 1998." 13 14 * * * SECTION 2. Section 37-159-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 15 16 amended as follows: 17 37-159-5. The State Board of Education shall prescribe rules 18 and regulations which, subject to available appropriations, allow 19 for reimbursement to the state licensed teachers, from both in 20 state and out of state, who enter into a contract for employment

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21 in a school district situated within a geographical area of the 22 state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, for the expense of 23 24 moving when the employment necessitates the relocation of the 25 teacher to a different geographical area than that in which the 26 teacher resides before entering into such contract. In order to 27 be eligible for the reimbursement, the teacher must apply to the 28 local district and the district must obtain the prior approval 29 from the department for reimbursement before the relocation 30 occurs. If the reimbursement is approved, the department shall provide funds to the school district to reimburse the teacher an 31 32 amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the 33 documented actual expenses incurred in the course of relocating, including the expense of any professional moving company or 34 35 persons employed to assist with the move, rented moving vehicles 36 or equipment, mileage in the amount authorized for state employees 37 under Section 25-3-41 if the teacher used his personal vehicle or vehicles for the move, meals and such other expenses associated 38 39 with the relocation in accordance with the department's 40 established rules and regulations. No teacher may be reimbursed 41 for moving expenses under this section on more than one (1) 42 occasion.

43 Nothing in this section shall be construed to require the 44 actual residence to which the teacher relocates to be within the 45 boundaries of the school district which has executed a contract

No. 2508 ~ OFFICIAL ~ 20/SS36/R64 PAGE 2 (ens\tb) 46 for employment with the teacher or within the boundaries of the 47 area designated by the State Board of Education as the critical 48 teacher shortage area in order for the teacher to be eligible for 49 reimbursement for his moving expenses. However, teachers must 50 relocate within the boundaries of the State of Mississippi.

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52 SECTION 3. Section 37-159-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 53 amended as follows:

54 37-159-7. The school board of any school district situated 55 within a geographical area of the state where there exists a 56 critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of 57 Education, in its discretion, may reimburse persons who interview 58 for employment as a licensed teacher with the district for the 59 mileage and other actual expenses incurred in the course of travel 60 to and from the interview by such persons at the rate authorized 61 for county and municipal employees under Section 25-3-41. Any 62 reimbursement by a school board under this section shall be paid from nonminimum education program funds. 63

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65 SECTION 4. Section 37-159-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 66 amended as follows:

67 37-159-9. (1) There is established the University Assisted 68 Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program within the State 69 Department of Education. The purposes of the program shall be to 70 attract additional qualified teachers to those geographical areas

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of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers and to retain the qualified teachers already serving as licensed teachers in geographical critical teacher shortage areas by making available scholarships to persons working towards a Master of Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree at an institution of higher learning whose teacher education program is approved by the State Board of Education.

78 Any institution of higher learning in the State of (2)79 Mississippi which offers a Master of Education degree or an 80 Educational Specialist degree may apply to the department for 81 participation in the program. As part of the program, participating institutions shall collaborate with the Mississippi 82 Teacher Center to identify, recruit and place teacher education 83 graduates, from both within the state and out of state, in school 84 districts situated within those areas of the state where there 85 86 exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State 87 Board of Education.

The State Department of Education shall provide funds to 88 (3)89 participating institutions of higher learning for the purpose of 90 awarding scholarships to qualified persons pursuing a Master of 91 Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree at such 92 institutions while rendering service to the state as a licensed teacher in a school district in a geographical area of the state 93 94 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by the State Board of Education. The financial scholarship shall be 95

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96 applied to the total cost for tuition, books, materials and fees 97 at the institution in which the student is enrolled, not to exceed an amount equal to the highest total cost of tuition, books, 98 materials and fees assessed by a state institution of higher 99 100 learning during that school year. Teachers who relocate within 101 Mississippi from out of state in order to participate in the 102 program shall be classified as residents of the state for tuition 103 purposes.

104 Students awarded financial scholarships under the (4) 105 University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant 106 Program may receive such awards for a maximum of four (4) school 107 years; however, the maximum number of awards which may be made 108 shall not exceed the length of time required to complete the 109 number of academic hours necessary to obtain a Master of Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree. Financial 110 111 scholarships under the program shall not be based upon an 112 applicant's eligibility for financial aid.

113 (5) Persons relocating to a geographical area of the state 114 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by 115 the State Board of Education, to participate in the University 116 Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program shall be 117 eligible for reimbursement for their moving expenses to the 118 critical teacher shortage area from the State Board of Education. 119 The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and 120 regulations necessary for the administration of the relocation

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(6) Subject to the availability of funds, the State Board of Education may provide for professional development and support services as may be necessary for the retention of teachers participating in the program in those geographical areas of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers.

(7) Any person participating in the program who fails to complete a program of study that will enable that person to obtain a Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist degree shall become liable immediately to the State Board of Education for the sum of all awards made to that person under the program, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person abrogates his participation in the program.

135 As a condition for participation in the program, a (8) 136 teacher shall agree to employment as a licensed teacher in a 137 school district located in a geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the 138 139 State Board of Education, for a period of not less than three (3) 140 years, which shall include those years of service rendered while 141 obtaining the Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist 142 degree. However, for any person who obtained a baccalaureate degree in education with a financial scholarship under the 143 144 Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program and who entered the University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant 145

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146 Program before rendering service as a teacher, the period of 147 employment for the purposes of this subsection shall be two (2) years, in addition to the employment commitment required under the 148 Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program. Service rendered by a 149 150 participant as a licensed teacher in a school district in a 151 geographical critical teacher shortage area before that teacher 152 becomes a participant in the program may not be considered to 153 fulfill the employment commitment required under this subsection. 154 Any person failing to comply with this employment commitment in any required school year shall immediately be in breach of 155 156 contract and become liable immediately to the State Department of 157 Education for the sum of all scholarships awarded and relocation 158 expenses granted to that person, less one-third (1/3) of the 159 amount of that sum for each year that service was rendered, or for 160 those persons whose required period of employment is two (2) 161 years, less one-half (1/2) of the amount of that sum for each year 162 that service was rendered, plus interest accruing at the current 163 Stafford Loan rate at the time the breach occurs, except in the 164 case of a deferral for cause by the State Board of Education when 165 there is no employment position immediately available upon the 166 teacher's obtaining of the Master of Education degree or 167 Educational Specialist degree. After the period of such deferral, 168 the person shall begin or resume the required teaching duties or 169 shall become liable to the board under this subsection. If a 170 claim for repayment under this subsection is placed in the hands

(9) All funds received by the State Department of Education
from the repayment of scholarship awards and relocation expenses
by program participants shall be deposited in the Mississippi
Critical Teacher Shortage Fund.

(10) The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and
regulations necessary for the proper administration of the
University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant
Program.

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183 SECTION 5. Section 37-159-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 184 amended as follows:

37-159-11. (1) 185 There is established the Mississippi 186 Employer-Assisted Housing Teacher Program, which shall be a 187 special home loan program for eligible licensed teachers who 188 render service to the state in a geographical area of the state 189 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated 190 by the State Board of Education. The home loan program shall be 191 administered by the State Department of Education in conjunction 192 with the Federal National Mortgage Association (Fannie Mae). The 193 department may contract with one or more public or private 194 entities to provide assistance in implementing and administering the program. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and 195

198 Participation in the loan program shall be available to (2)any licensed teacher who renders service in a geographical area of 199 200 the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as 201 designated by the State Board of Education. Any person who 202 receives a loan under the program shall be required to purchase a 203 house and reside in a county in which the school district for 204 which the teacher is rendering service, or any portion of the 205 school district, is located. The maximum amount of a loan that 206 may be made under the program to any person shall be Six Thousand 207 Dollars (\$6,000.00).

208 Any loan made under the program to a person who actually (3) 209 renders service as a teacher in a geographical area of the state 210 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated 211 by the State Board of Education, shall be converted to an 212 interest-free grant on the basis of one (1) year's service for 213 one-third (1/3) of the amount of the loan. Any person who does 214 not render three (3) years' service as a teacher in a geographical 215 area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of 216 teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, shall be 217 liable to the State Department of Education for one-third (1/3) of 218 the amount of the loan for each year that he does not render such 219 service, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate 220 at the time the person discontinues his service. If a claim for

(4) All funds received by the State Department of Education
as repayment of loans by program participants shall be deposited
in the Mississippi Critical Teacher Shortage Fund.

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228 SECTION 6. Section 37-159-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 229 amended as follows:

230 37-159-13. (1) There is established a pilot program to 231 provide for the construction of rental housing units for teachers 232 in the West Tallahatchie School District, which pilot program 233 shall be administered by the State Department of Education. The 234 department may contract with one or more public or private 235 entities to provide assistance in implementing and administering 236 the program. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and 237 regulations regarding the implementation and administration of the 238 program.

(2) The West Tallahatchie School District shall receive
proposals from developers for the construction of the rental
housing units, and submit its recommendation to the State
Department of Education about which developer should construct the
units. The department shall make the final determination about
the developer that will construct the units.

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245 (3)After selection of the developer, the department shall 246 loan the developer not more than Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 247 (\$200,000.00) for construction of the units. The interest rate on the loan shall be equal to one percent (1%) below the discount 248 rate at the Federal Reserve Bank in the Federal Reserve district 249 250 in which the school district is located, and the loan shall be 251 repaid in not more than fifteen (15) years, as determined by the 252 department. All funds received by the department as repayment of 253 the principal and interest of the loan shall be deposited in the 254 Mississippi Critical Teacher Shortage Fund. If a claim against 255 the developer for repayment is placed in the hands of an attorney 256 for collection, the obligor shall be liable for an additional 257 amount equal to a reasonable attorney's fee.

(4) The developer shall operate the rental housing units.
For a period of ten (10) years or until such time as the loan to
the developer is repaid, whichever is longer, the priority for
residence in the units shall be given first to teachers employed
by the school district, then to other licensed school district
employees, and then to any other school district employees.

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265 SECTION 7. Section 37-159-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 266 amended as follows:

267 37-159-17. There is established in the State Treasury a
268 special fund to be designated the "Mississippi Critical Teacher
269 Shortage Fund," into which shall be deposited those funds

No. 2508 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 20/SS36/R64 PAGE 11 (ens\tb) appropriated by the Legislature, and any other funds that may be made available, for the purpose of implementing the programs established under Sections 37-159-5, 37-9-77, 37-3-91 and 37-159-9 through 37-159-13. Money in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the General Fund, and interest earned on any amounts deposited into the fund shall be credited to the special fund.

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278 **SECTION 8.** The following shall be codified as Section 279 37-159-19, Mississippi Code of 1972:

280 <u>37-159-19.</u> Sections 37-159-1 through 37-159-17 shall stand 281 repealed on July 1, 2026.

282 **SECTION 9.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 283 and after July 1, 2020.
