SENATE BILL NO. 2655

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-3-54.4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ADD ADDITIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES THAT CONSTITUTE COERCION UNDER THE HUMAN TRAFFICKING LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 97-3-54.4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 97-3-54.4. For the purposes of the Mississippi Human
- 8 Trafficking Act the following words and phrases shall have the
- 9 meanings ascribed herein unless the context clearly requires
- 10 otherwise:
- 11 (a) "Act" or "this act" means the Mississippi Human
- 12 Trafficking Act.
- 13 (b) "Actor" means a person who violates any of the
- 14 provisions of Sections 97-3-54 through 97-3-54.4.
- 15 (c) "Blackmail" means obtaining property or things of
- 16 value of another by threatening to (i) inflict bodily injury on
- 17 anyone; or (ii) commit any other criminal offense.
- 18 (d) "Coerce" or "coercion" means:

19	(i) Causing or threatening to cause bodily harm to
20	any person, physically restraining, abducting or confining any
21	person, or threatening to physically restrain, abduct or confine
22	any person;
23	(ii) Exposing or threatening to expose any fact or
24	information or disseminating or threatening to disseminate any
25	fact or information that would tend to subject a person to
26	criminal or immigration proceedings, hatred, contempt or ridicule;
27	(iii) * * * The actual or threatened destruction,
28	concealment, removal, confiscation or possession of any actual or
29	purported passport or other immigration document, or any other
30	actual or purported government identification document of any
31	person;
32	(iv) Providing a controlled substance to, or
33	withholding or threatening to withhold a controlled substance
34	from, a person for the purpose of compelling the person to engage
35	in labor or sexual servitude against the person's will;
36	(v) Causing or threatening to cause financial harm
37	to any person or using financial control over any person;
38	(vi) Abusing or threatening to abuse a position of
39	power, the law, or legal process;
40	<pre>(vii) Using blackmail;</pre>
41	(viii) Using an individual's personal services as
42	payment or satisfaction of a real or purported debt when: 1. the
43	reasonable value of the services is not applied toward the

- 44 liquidation of the debt; 2. the length of the services is not
- 45 limited and the nature of the services is not defined; 3. the
- 46 principal amount of the debt does not reasonably reflect the value
- 47 of the items or services for which the debt is incurred; or 4. the
- 48 individual is prevented from acquiring accurate and timely
- 49 information about the disposition of the debt; * * *
- 50 (ix) Using any scheme, plan or pattern of conduct
- 51 intended to cause any person to believe that, if the person did
- 52 not perform the labor or services, that the person or another
- 53 person would suffer serious harm or physical restraint * * *, or
- 54 abduction;
- (x) Extortion as defined in Section 97-3-82(2);
- 56 (xi) The use of the physical or mental impairment
- 57 of a vulnerable person, as that term is defined in Section
- 58 43-47-5; or
- 59 (xii) Fraud or deception.
- (e) "Commercial sexual activity" means any sex act on
- 61 account of which anything of value is given to, promised to, or
- 62 received by any person.

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- (f) "Enterprise" means any individual, sole
- 64 proprietorship, partnership, corporation, union or other legal
- 65 entity, or any association or group of individuals associated in
- 66 fact regardless of whether a legal entity has been formed pursuant
- 67 to any state, federal or territorial law. It includes illicit as

- 68 well as licit enterprises and governmental as well as other
- 69 entities.
- 70 (g) "Financial harm" includes, but is not limited to,
- 71 extortion as defined by Section 97-3-82, Mississippi Code of 1972,
- 72 or violation of the usury law as defined by Chapter 17, Title
- 73 75, * * * Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 74 (h) "Forced labor or services" means labor or services
- 75 that are performed or provided by another person and are obtained
- 76 or maintained through coercion.
- 77 (i) "Labor" means work of economic or financial value.
- 78 (j) "Maintain" means, in relation to labor or services,
- 79 to secure continued performance thereof, regardless of any initial
- 80 agreement on the part of the trafficked person to perform such
- 81 labor or service.
- 82 (k) "Minor" means a person under the age of eighteen
- 83 (18) years.
- 84 (1) "Obtain" means, in relation to labor or services,
- 85 to secure performance thereof.
- 86 (m) "Pecuniary damages" means any of the following:
- 87 (i) The greater of the gross income or value to
- 88 the defendant of the victim's labor or services, including sexual
- 89 services, not reduced by the expense the defendant incurred as a
- 90 result of maintaining the victim, or the value of the victim's
- 91 labor or services calculated under the minimum wage and overtime

- 93 seq., whichever is higher;
- 94 (ii) If it is not possible or in the best interest
- 95 of the victim to compute a value under subparagraph (i) of this
- 96 paragraph (m), the equivalent of the value of the victim's labor
- 97 or services if the victim had provided labor or services that were
- 98 subject to the minimum wage and overtime provisions of the Fair
- 99 Labor Standards Act, 29 USCS 201 et seq.;
- 100 (iii) Costs and expenses incurred by the victim as
- 101 a result of the offense for:
- 102 1. Medical services;
- 103 2. Therapy or psychological counseling;
- 104 3. Temporary housing;
- 105 4. Transportation;
- 106 5. Childcare;
- 107 6. Physical and occupational therapy or
- 108 rehabilitation;
- 109 7. Funeral, interment, and burial services;
- 110 reasonable attorney's fees and other legal costs; and
- 111 8. Other expenses incurred by the victim.
- 112 (n) "Serious harm" means harm, whether physical or
- 113 nonphysical, including psychological, economic or reputational, to
- 114 an individual that would compel a reasonable person in similar
- 115 circumstances as the individual to perform or continue to perform
- 116 labor or services to avoid incurring the harm.

117	(o) "Services" means an ongoing relationship between a
118	person and the actor in which the person performs activities under
119	the supervision of or for the benefit of the actor or a third
120	party and includes, without limitation, commercial sexual
121	activity, sexually explicit performances, or the production of
122	sexually explicit materials.

- 123 (p) "Sexually explicit performance" means a live or 124 public act or show intended to arouse or satisfy the sexual 125 desires or appeal to the prurient interests of patrons.
- (q) "Trafficked person" means a person subjected to the practices prohibited by this act regardless of whether a perpetrator is identified, apprehended, prosecuted or convicted, and is a term used interchangeably with the terms "victim,"

 "victim of trafficking" and "trafficking victim."
- 131 (r) "Venture" means any group of two (2) or more
 132 individuals associated in fact, whether or not a legal entity.
- 133 (s) "Sexually oriented material" shall have the meaning 134 ascribed in Section 97-5-27, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 135 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2020.
