COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2723

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 ALLOW THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO EXTEND 3 THE OPEN SEASON ON DEER, WHEN IT ENDS ON A FRIDAY, TO 30 MINUTES 4 AFTER SUNSET ON THE FOLLOWING SUNDAY; TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-31.2, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW THE COMMISSION TO EXTEND THE 5 6 OPEN SEASONS ON BOBWHITE QUAIL AND WILD TURKEY, WHEN THEY END ON 7 FRIDAY, TO 30 MINUTES AFTER SUNSET ON THE FOLLOWING SUNDAY; TO 8 AMEND SECTION 49-7-31.3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW THE 9 COMMISSION TO EXTEND THE OPEN SEASONS ON SOUIRREL AND RABBITS, WHEN THEY END ON FRIDAY, TO 30 MINUTES AFTER SUNSET ON THE 10 FOLLOWING SUNDAY; TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-31.4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 11 12 1972, TO ALLOW THE COMMISSION TO EXTEND THE OPEN SEASON ON 13 FUR-BEARING ANIMALS, INCLUDING ANY ADDITIONAL OPEN SEASON ON RACCOON, WHEN IT ENDS ON A FRIDAY, TO 30 MINUTES AFTER SUNSET ON 14 15 THE FOLLOWING SUNDAY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

17 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

18 amended as follows:

19 49-7-31. (1) The open season on deer shall be as follows:

20 (a) With bow and arrow: October 1 through the Friday
21 prior to Thanksgiving.

(b) With guns and with dogs: from the Saturday priorto Thanksgiving through December 1.

24 (c) With primitive weapons and without dogs: December25 2 through December 15.

(d) With guns and without dogs: December 16 through
December 23. However, the commission may allow hunting statewide
or in specific areas with any legal weapon which it may designate
without dogs after the end of the last season for hunting deer
with guns and with dogs, but the season with legal designated
weapons and without dogs shall not extend beyond January 31.

32 The commission shall establish an extended season (e) 33 with primitive weapons and bow and arrow without dogs from 34 February 1 through February 15 for the area south of U.S. Highway 35 84 and east of Mississippi Highway 35 only for legal bucks. Any 36 antlered deer taken in this area during any open season under this 37 section must be a legal buck as defined in this paragraph. For purposes of this paragraph, the term "legal buck" means a deer 38 39 with antlers of four (4) points or more with a minimum inside 40 spread of ten (10) inches or a minimum main beam length of thirteen (13) inches. The commission may regulate the taking of 41 42 deer with antlers of four (4) points or less under this paragraph 43 for the proper management of antlered deer. The commission may 44 delay the opening date and change the length of bow and arrow 45 season in * * * paragraph (a) in this area.

46 (f) With guns and with dogs: December 24 through a
47 date fixed by the commission that will provide a total of
48 thirty-nine (39) days of hunting deer with guns and with dogs when

49 added to the number of days provided for hunting deer with guns 50 and with dogs in paragraph (b).

51 (g) When the open season on deer ends on a Friday, the 52 commission shall have the authority to extend the season until

53 thirty (30) minutes after sunset on the following Sunday.

54 (2) The commission may set and regulate the deer seasons on 55 wildlife management areas which it administers.

(3) (a) The commission may allow the harvesting of antlerless deer in the districts or zones upon the recommendation of the executive director based upon good and substantial quantitative data and research evaluations that demonstrate that the harvesting is necessary to properly manage the herd.

(b) The commission, only upon the recommendation of the
executive director, may allow the harvesting of antlerless deer
during the deer season with guns and with dogs by a majority vote
of the commission.

(c) Nothing in this subsection prohibits the harvesting
of either-sex deer by landowners or leaseholders on private lands
under the deer management assistance program prescribed or
approved by the executive director.

69 (4) The commission may provide a special permit for the 70 harvesting of deer when they are depredating and destroying crops. 71 The department shall supervise the harvesting and provide for the 72 salvaging of the meat of the animals. The commission may 73 authorize the department to assist any farmer in this state, who

(5) (a) During any open season on deer with primitive
weapons after November 30, a person may use any legal weapon of
choice on private lands only, if the person is:

(i) The title owner of the land;
(ii) The lessee of the hunting rights on the land;
(iii) A member of a hunting club leasing the
hunting rights on the land; or

83 (iv) A guest of a person specified in subparagraph84 (i), (ii) or (iii).

(b) If the person is required to have a hunting
license, the person must have a primitive weapon license,
Sportsman's License or a Lifetime Sportsman's License.

88 SECTION 2. Section 49-7-31.2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 89 amended as follows:

90 49-7-31.2. The open season for game birds shall be as 91 follows:

92 (a) On bobwhite quail: The season shall open on
93 Thanksgiving Day and run through the first Saturday in March next
94 following. When the open season ends on a Friday, the commission
95 shall have the authority to extend the season until thirty (30)
96 minutes after sunset on the following Sunday.

97 (b) On pheasant: There shall be no open season on 98 pheasant.

99 (c) On wild turkey: The commission may fix the spring
100 season between March 1 and May 15. In addition, the commission
101 may fix special fall either-sex seasons. <u>When the open season</u>
102 ends on a Friday, the commission shall have the authority to
103 extend the season until thirty (30) minutes after sunset on the
104 following Sunday.

105 (d) On migratory birds: The open season for migratory
106 birds shall be the season prescribed by the Federal Migratory Bird
107 Treaty regulations.

108 SECTION 3. Section 49-7-31.3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 109 amended as follows:

110 49-7-31.3. The open season on game animals except deer shall
111 be as follows:

(a) On squirrel: The season shall open on October 1
and run through February 28 next following. In addition, the
commission is authorized to set a season that shall open not
earlier than May 15 and run not later than June 1 next following.
<u>When the open season ends on a Friday, the commission shall have</u>
<u>the authority to extend the season until thirty (30) minutes after</u>
sunset on the following Sunday.

(b) On rabbits: The season shall open on the Saturday nearest October 15 and run through February 28 next following, and when rabbits are depredating or destroying crops, the owner of the crops or his tenants may shoot the rabbits with guns. <u>When the</u> open season ends on a Friday, the commission shall have the

125 sunset on the following Sunday.

SECTION 4. Section 49-7-31.4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

128 49-7-31.4. (1) The commission may fix the open season on 129 fur-bearing animals between November 1 and March 1 next following 130 and fix the open season for hunting opossums, raccoons and bobcats 131 with dogs and guns by licensed hunters from October 1 to February 132 28 next following; but raccoons and bobcats may be run, hunted, 133 chased or pursued throughout the year with dogs by licensed 134 hunters.

135 (2) The commission may establish an additional open season 136 on raccoon from July 1 through October 1, and the bag limit on 137 raccoon during the additional open season shall be one (1) per 138 party, per night.

139 (3) When the open season on fur-bearing animals, including
140 any additional open season on raccoon, ends on a Friday, the
141 commission shall have the authority to extend the season until
142 thirty (30) minutes after sunset on the following Sunday.
143 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from

144 and after July 1, 2020.
