- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-211, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW ONLINE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF A COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-1-211, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 63-1-211. (1) **Contents of license.** A commercial driver's
- 8 license shall be marked "commercial driver's license" or "CDL,"
- 9 and shall be, to the maximum extent practicable, tamper proof, and
- 10 shall include, but not be limited to, the following information:
- 11 (a) The name and residential address of the person.
- 12 (b) The person's color photograph or imaged likeness.
- 13 (c) A physical description of the person including sex,
- 14 height, and weight.
- 15 (d) Date of birth.
- 16 (e) Any number or identifier deemed appropriate by the
- 17 commissioner.
- 18 (f) The person's signature.

- 23 (i) The dates between which the license is valid.
- 24 (2) Classifications, endorsements and restrictions.
- 25 Driver's licenses may be issued with the following
- 26 classifications, endorsements, and restrictions:
- 27 (a) Classifications. Licensees may drive all vehicles
- 28 in the class for which the license is issued and all lesser
- 29 classes of vehicles, except those requiring special endorsements.
- 30 (i) Class A Any combination of vehicles with a
- 31 gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand one (26,001)
- 32 pounds or more, provided the gross vehicle weight rating of the
- 33 vehicle being towed is in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds.
- 34 (ii) Class B Any single vehicle with a gross
- 35 vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds
- 36 or more, and any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of
- 37 ten thousand (10,000) pounds.
- 38 (iii) Class C Any single vehicle with a gross
- 39 vehicle weight rating of less than twenty-six thousand one
- 40 (26,001) pounds:
- 1. Vehicles designed to transport sixteen

45	(iv) Class D - Class D licenses are not commercial
46	driver's licenses and shall be governed by the provisions of

48	(b) Licenses may be issued with appropriate
49	endorsements and restrictions noted thereon. The commissioner

51	restrictions may include, but are not limited to, those which:

- 68 who has attained the age of eighteen (18) years.
- 69 (3) Before issuing a commercial driver's license, the
- 70 commissioner shall request the applicant's complete operating
- 71 record from any state in which the applicant was previously
- 72 licensed to operate any type of motor vehicle in the past ten (10)
- 73 years, conduct a check of the applicant's operating record by
- 74 querying the national driver register, established under 49 USCS
- 75 Section 30302, and the Commercial Driver's License Information
- 76 System, established under 49 USCS Section 31309, to determine if:
- 77 (a) The applicant has already been issued a commercial
- 78 driver's license; and the applicant's commercial driver's license
- 79 has been suspended, revoked, or canceled;
- 80 (b) The applicant had been convicted of any offenses
- 81 contained in Section 205(a)(3) of the National Driver Register Act
- 82 of 1982 (23 USCS Section 401 note).
- 83 (4) Within ten (10) days after issuing a commercial driver's
- 84 license, the commissioner shall notify the Commercial Driver
- 85 License Information System of that fact, providing all information
- 86 required to ensure identification of the person.
- 87 (5) The commercial driver's license shall expire in the
- 88 manner set forth in Section 63-1-47.
- 89 (6) (a) When applying for renewal of a commercial driver's
- 90 license, the applicant shall complete the application form
- 91 required by Section 63-1-210, providing updated information and

92	required	certifications.	The	department	must	provide	for	online

- 93 submission of the application for renewal if paragraph (b) of this
- 94 subsection (6) does not apply.
- 95 (b) If the applicant wishes to retain a hazardous
- 96 materials endorsement, the written test for a hazardous materials
- 97 endorsement must be taken and passed. In addition, the applicant
- 98 must successfully complete the security threat assessment required
- 99 by 49 CFR, Part 1572. If notice is received from the United
- 100 States Transportation Security Administration that the applicant
- 101 poses a security risk, the commissioner shall refuse to issue, or
- 102 revoke within fifteen (15) days of receipt of the notice, a
- 103 hazardous materials endorsement. Online renewal does not apply to
- 104 this paragraph (b).
- 105 (7) The department shall provide a means for electronic
- 106 transmission of a medical card and may charge a vendor convenience
- 107 fee in an amount not to exceed Two Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2.50)
- 108 per transmission.
- 109 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 110 and after October 1, 2020.
