## SENATE BILL NO. 2854

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-35-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE REQUIREMENTS TO BE GRANTED A REAL ESTATE BROKERS
  LICENSE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-35-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 73-35-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
- 8 as the "Broker Responsibility Act."
- 9 (2) Licenses shall be granted only to persons who present,
- 10 and to corporations, partnerships, companies or associations whose
- 11 officers, associates or partners present satisfactory proof to the
- 12 commission that they are trustworthy and competent to transact the
- 13 business of a real estate broker or real estate salesperson in
- 14 such manner as to safeguard the interests of the public. Every
- 15 person who applies for a resident license as a real estate broker:
- 16 (a) shall be age twenty-one (21) years or over, and have his legal
- 17 domicile in the State of Mississippi at the time he applies; (b)
- 18 shall be subject to the jurisdiction of this state, subject to the

- 19 income tax laws and other excise laws thereof, subject to the road
- 20 and bridge privilege tax laws thereof; (c) shall not be an elector
- 21 in any other state; (d) shall have held a license as an active
- 22 real estate salesperson for \* \* \* thirty-six (36) months
- 23 immediately prior to making application for the broker's
- 24 examination hereafter specified; (e) shall have successfully
- 25 completed a minimum of one hundred twenty (120) hours of courses
- 26 in real estate as hereafter specified; (f) shall have successfully
- 27 completed the real estate broker's examination as hereafter
- 28 specified; and (g) shall have successfully been cleared for
- 29 licensure by the commission's background investigation as provided
- 30 in Section 73-35-10.
- 31 (3) An applicant who has not held an active real estate
- 32 salesperson's license for a period of at least \* \* \* thirty-six
- 33 (36) months immediately prior to submitting an application shall
- 34 have successfully completed a minimum of one hundred fifty (150)
- 35 classroom hours in real estate courses, which courses are
- 36 acceptable for credit toward a degree at a college or university
- 37 as approved by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.
- 38 (4) Every applicant for a resident license as a real estate
- 39 salesperson shall be age eighteen (18) years or over, shall be a
- 40 bona fide resident of the State of Mississippi prior to filing his
- 41 application, shall have successfully completed a minimum of sixty
- 42 (60) hours in courses in real estate as hereafter specified, and

- shall have successfully completed the real estate salesperson's examination as hereafter specified.
- 45 <u>(5)</u> The residency requirements set forth in this section 46 shall not apply to those licensees of other states who qualify and 47 obtain nonresident licenses in this state.
- 48 The commission is authorized to exempt from such prelicensing educational requirements, in whole or in part, a real 49 estate licensee of another state who desires to obtain a license 50 51 under this chapter, provided that the prelicensing educational requirements in the other state are determined by the commission 52 53 to be equivalent to prelicensing educational requirements in this 54 state and provided that such state extends this same privilege or 55 exemption to Mississippi real estate licensees. The issuance of a 56 license by reciprocity to a military-trained applicant or military spouse shall be subject to the provisions of Section 73-50-1. 57
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2020.
