SENATE BILL NO. 2962 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE 2 STATE TREASURY TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI STATE 3 BOARD OF PUBLIC CONTRACTORS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 6 7 State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi State Board of Public Contractors, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of 8 9 said board, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.....\$ 4,061,101.00. 10 11 SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the following positions are authorized: 12 13 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 14 Permanent: Full Time..... 16 Part Time.... 15 0 16 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 0 17 Part Time.... 0

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18 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 19 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be 20 appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2022 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2021 funds appropriated for that purpose unless 21 22 programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2021 23 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by 24 the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 25 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 26 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 27 act. Absent a special situation or circumstance approved by the 28 State Personnel Board, or unless otherwise authorized by this act, 29 no state agency shall take any action to promote or otherwise 30 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, or realignment. If the State Personnel Board determines a special 31 situation or circumstance exists and approves an action, then the 32 33 agency and the State Personnel Board shall provide a monthly 34 report of each action approved by the State Personnel Board to the Chairmen of the Accountability, Efficiency and Transparency 35 36 Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and the 37 Chairmen of the Appropriations Committees of the Senate and House 38 of Representatives. It shall be the responsibility of the agency 39 head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2021 appropriations 40 for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of 41 escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at the time the 42

No. 2962 20/SS08/A834SG PAGE 2 43 agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State 44 Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost 45 or the Fiscal Year 2021 "Personal Services" appropriated level, 46 47 when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the 48 projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the 49 50 requirements of this provision are met.

51 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 52 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 53 54 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 55 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 56 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 57 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 58 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 59 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

Of the funds appropriated in this act, it is the 69 intention of the Legislature that the State Board of Contractors 70 may expend funds not to exceed Two Million Three Hundred Thousand 71 Dollars (\$2,300,000.00) for the purpose of defraying the cost of 72 (1) enforcement as set forth in Section 31-3-21, Mississippi Code 73 of 1972, (2) enlisting of any private collection firm(s) to locate 74 and collect any uncollected fines, and (3) administrative costs 75 associated with collections. Any funds spent for this purpose 76 shall be subject to a performance audit if requested by the 77 Appropriations Chairmen in either the House or Senate.

78 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that 79 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 80 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 81 82 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 83 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 84 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids. 85

86 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 87 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 88 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 89 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 90 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 91 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 92 actions contrary to this provision.

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93 **SECTION 6.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 94 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 95 96 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 97 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 98 SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from 99 100 and after July 1, 2020.
